THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Orders described in the Schedule to this Order to the extent described in that Schedule are hereby, from and after the commencement of this Order, revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not revive any Order or part of any Order revoked by or otherwise affect the past operation of any of the Orders or parts of Orders hereby revoked, or invalidate or make unlawful anything done under any Order or part of any Order hereby revoked, or affect any licence or authority granted, or any right, title, obligation, or liability accrued thereunder before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, any Order or part of any Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after this thirteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.
