PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawin; Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Notice (No. 62), dated 11th April, 1892, issued by Her Majesty's Representative at Malta, whereby the following paragraph is substituted for paragraph 1 of the Notice issued on the 11th February, 1892 (No. 28), being itself a modificution of the Notice issued on the 14th October,

1891 (No. 178):—

1. Vessels with pilgrims from the East, or having had cases of cholera on board, as well as all vessels having, or having had, on board cases of diarrhoea, which in the opinion of the quarantine medical officer may be presumed to indicate cholera, shall not be permitted to enter this har-

bour.

Vessels coming from Rio Janeiro or other ports, when cases of yellow fever have taken place on board, shall not be permitted to enter this harbour, except, if necessary, to coal in strict quarantine, and on condition that they leave afterwards with the least possible delay.

Vessels coming from ports known to be infected with yellow fever are to be subjected to fourteen days' quarantine, and to be disinfected, unless they have been disinfected at an intermediate

port.

THE PROHIBITION OF MOVEMENT FROM EDINBURGH AND LEITH ORDER OF 1892.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Revocation.

1. The Prohibition of Movement from Edinburgh Order of 1892 dated the twentieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninetytwo, is hereby, from and after the commencement of this Order, revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

Prohibition of Movement out of Edinburgh and Leith.

2. Notwithstanding anything in any Order of the Board of Agriculture no cattle, sheep, or swine shall, from and after the commencement of this Order, be moved either by land or by water out of the district described in the Schedule to this Order.

Offences.

3. If a head of cattle or a sheep or a pig is moved out of the district described in the Schedule to this Order in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignce or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as The Prohibition of Movement from Edinburgh and Leith Order of 1892.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after this twenty-fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninetytwo.

Poor Head—Alteration in Fog Signal. THE Commissioners of Irish Lights have given notice, dated 28th March, 1892, that the fog signal at Poor Head, eastern side of approach to Cork Harbour, has been altered from a blast of five seconds duration every two minutes, to a blast of four seconds duration every minute.

ADRIATIC-WESTERN SHORE.-PO RIVER Entranceș.

Goro Point Light-Alteration in Character. THE Italian Government has given notice, that on 1st May, 1892, the following alteration will be made in the character of Goro Point Light, west side of entrance to Po di Goro.

Goro Point Light will show a fixed white light with white flashes every fifteen seconds through an arc of 240°, or from the bearing of S. 45½° E., through north, to S. 74½° W.; fixed red with red flashes every fifteen seconds from S. $74\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., through south, to S. $45\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., with the exception of an arc of 15°, comprised between S. 3° W. and S. 18° W., through which the light will be obscured. It will be elevated 66 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 14 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric of the fourth order.

Approximate position, lat. 44° 48′ N., long. 12° 23′ E.

> No. 154.—BALTIC STATION. BALTIC ENTRANCE-THE KATTEGAT. Triple Flashing Light on Lyse Ground.

THE Danish Government has given notice, dated 30th March, 1892, that the new light on Lyse Ground will shortly be shown experimentally, and that on the conclusion of the trial, it will be exhibited permanently :-

Lyse Ground Light will be a triple flashing white light every fifteen seconds, elevated 45 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of nine miles.

The light, which is not constantly attended to, will be shown from a lantern, painted red with white cupola, placed on a red iron post, standing on a cylindrical granite foundation.

Approximate position, lat. 56° 18′ N., long. 11° 48′ E.

Note.—Should the apparatus, which produces the flashes, be out of order, the light will show fixed white.

BAY OF FUNDY-EAST SHORE.-YARMOUTH APPROACH.

Cape Fourche Light-Intended Alteration in Character.

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, dated 8th March, 1892, that it is intended to make the following alteration in the character of Cape Fourchu Light, approach to Yarmouth :-

Cape Fourchu Light will be a revolving white light, showing three bright rays, with intervals of twenty seconds between their points of greatest brilliancy, followed by an interval of forty seconds (during the greater part of which the light will be eclipsed), the complete revolution thus occupying eighty seconds.

Approximate position, lat. 43° 47′ 30" N., long. 66° 9' 20" W.

Note.—It is intended that this alteration should be effected early in June next. From the commencement of the work, the present light will be discontinued, and during its progress a fixed white light will provisionally be shown from an anchor light lantern hoisted in the most conspicuous position on the top of the lighthouse.

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, that on 5th March, 1892, lights were exhibited from the two undermentioned buoys at the entrance to Nanaimo Harbour :-

1. A fixed red light, elevated about eight feet above the sea, is shown from the beacon buoy (red No. 2) moored southward of Gallows Point. This light will be maintained until further notice, and is visible in clear weather from a distance of two miles.

Seychelles Bank-Shallow Water on Western Edge.

A RECENT examination of the western edge of the Seychelles Bank conducted by Lieutenant and Commander Smyth, Her Majesty's surveyingvessel "Stork," shows that a nearly continuous rim, of more or less shallow water, extends from Bird Island to beyond the Western Point of the bank.

. As it is evident that dangerously shoal spots may exist in many parts of this rim, besides those already known, ships should avoid crossing it north of the fifth parallel of south latitude. Southward of this parallel there is, according to the scanty information existing, apparently break in the rim.

Uniform System of Buoyage.

THE Netherlands Government has given notice, dated 1st April, 1892, that the following Uniform System of Buoyage has been accepted, and will be carried out, on the coast of the Netherlands :-

- 1. The term starboard hand means that side which would be on the right hand going with the main stream of flood, or in entering a harbour, river, or estuary, from seaward; the term port hand means the left hand side, under the same circumstances.
- 2. Conical buoys are starboard hand buoys as thus defined, and are painted red.

3. Can or truncated buoys are port hand buoys as thus defined, and are painted black.

4. Spherical buoys, mark the ends of middle grounds, and are painted black and red in horizontal stripes. These buoys are always surmounted by top marks, other bueys only in special cases.

5. Buoys lying outside, and marking the approach to, seaward channels are of a special shape, and are painted red and black in vertical stripes.

6. The buoys marking the outer shoals in the North Sca remain as at present.

7. In the inner channels, where necessary, certain buoys will be replaced by spar buoys.

8. Wrecks are marked by conical or truncated buoys, painted green, according as the wreck lies on the starboard or port side of the fairway. Should the wreck be in mid-channel, it will be marked by a truncated buoy on one side, and a conical buoy on the other side, which buoys are to be treated as port or starboard hand buoys according to shape.

9. The top marks are as follows :-

A diamond marks the outer or seaward side of

A cone marks the inner side of a bank.

A ball marks the starboard side of the fairway. A truncated cone marks the port side of the fairway.

A cross indicates that the buoy may be passed on either side.

The ball and truncated cone are also used as top marks for beacons.

The top marks are of the same colour as the

buoys or beacons on which they are placed.

10. The buoys of sea channels will be numbered consecutively (beginning from seaward), and marked by the first letter of the name of the channel. The numbers and letters will be white.

11. The buoyage of the River Ems will remain

This Uniform System of Buoyage will gradually be adopted, as regards the shape of the buoys and top marks, whilst the alteration in colour will only be made when all else has been changed in accordance with the new system. For this reason, it is necessary during the period of transition, that attention should be exclusively given to the colour (as has hitherto been the case), and not to the shape of the buoys; the existing colours, black and white, remaining temporarily unaltered.

Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 3 and 5, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers, when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room and to whose admission no valid objection can be made. Provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steeper than 1 in 25.

5. Except at a passing place or terminus, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, nor within ten yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed, so as not to obstruct the
