PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

INCOME TAX.

WHEREAS by the Taxes Management Act, 1880 (43 and 44 Vict., ch. 19), power is given for increasing in certain cases the number of persons appointed, under the provisions made by the Income Tax Act of 1842, Commissioners for the general purposes of the Income Tax, and persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners in each district or division in Great Britain; and it appearing to the Board of Inland Revenue that the number of persons so appointed for the division of Worcester, in the county of Worcester, is insufficient for the proper discharge of the business therein arising under the Tax Acts, the said Board hereby authorize the increase in the number of the Commissioners for the said division to any number not exceeding fourteen, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners to any number not exceeding fourteen; and we, the undersigned, two members of the said Board, do hereby convene a meeting of the persons appointed for putting in execution within the said county an Act passed in the 38th year of the reign of King George the Third, intituled "An Act for granting an aid to His Majesty by a Land Tax to be raised in Great Britain for the service of the year 1798," being respectively qualified to act as Commissioners in the execution of the last-mentioned Act, to be holden at the Guildhall, in Worcester, on Saturday, the 21st day of May, 1892, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of choosing and appointing, according to the regulations of the said Income Tax Act of 1842, such number of fit and proper persons to be Commissioners for general purposes for the said division of Worcester, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners, as may be sufficient to increase the number of such Commissioners to any number not exceeding fourteen, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners to any number not exceeding fourteen.

Exmouth and District Water.

(Petition for Additional Provision for Authorizing the Exmouth and District Waterworks Company to Construct Compensation Reservoir; Purchase of Lands and Easements Compulsorily and by Agreement; Diversion of Water; and for other Purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Exmouth and District Waterworks Company (hereinafter called "the Company") intend to apply to Parliament by petition for additional provision for leave to introduce into the Bill, now before Parliament under the above name or short title, all necessary provisions for enabling them to make and maintain in the county of Devon, the following work, viz.:

A reservoir for the storage of water and for compensating the owners, lessees, and occupiers of mills and riparian proprietors, on the Budleigh Brook, to be situated on the said Brook, partly in the parish of Bicton and partly in the parish of East Budleigh, to be formed by an earthen embankment fourteen chains or thereabouts in length, in and across the said Brook at a point on the said Brook, distant eighteen chains or thereabouts from the tenth milestone on the road from Exeter to Sidmouth, measured in a south-easterly direction in a straight line from the said milestone. The said reservoir will extend from the said embankment in a north-westerly direction upwards and along the course of the said Budleigh Brook, to a point on the said Brook, three chains or thereabouts measured in a south-westerly direction in a straight line from the said milestone.

To enable the Company to purchase and take by compulsion or by agreement, and to take on lease and hold lands, buildings, streams, waters, and other property, and any rights or easements therein, thereunder, or thereover for the purposes of the proposed reservoir, and to vary or extinguish all or any rights or easements in, over, or affecting any such lands, buildings, streams, waters, and property.

To authorize the Company to collect, impound, take, divert, appropriate, and use for the purposes of the said reservoir all such springs, streams, and waters as will or may be intercepted by the same, and especially the waters of the Budleigh Brook.

To make provisions for the discharge and regulation of compensation water to millowners and others interested in the waters of the Budleigh Brook affected by the provisions of the Bill now before Parliament.

To enable the Company to apply their existing funds and any moneys which they have still power to raise to the purposes of the before-mentioned reservoir.

To vary, repeal, or extinguish all existing rights or privileges in any manner connected with the lands proposed to be purchased or taken, or which would in any manner impede or interfere with the purposes of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.

It is intended to extend to the said reservoir such of the powers and provisions contained in the pending Bill with respect to the works therein defined as may be applicable to such reservoir.

Duplicate plans and sections showing the line and levels of the proposed reservoir, together with a book of reference to such plans, containing the names of the owners or reputed owners, lessees or reputed lessees, and occupiers of the lands to be taken for the purposes thereof, and also a copy of this notice as published in the London Gazette, will, on or before the 30th day of April instant, be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Devon, at his office at the Castle of Exeter, in the said county, and on or before the same day a copy of so much of such plans, sections, and book of reference respectively as relates to each of the aforesaid parishes, and a copy of this notice, will be deposited with the parish clerk of each such parish at their respective residences.
