Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1878 to 1891.

WHEREAS by section 8 (1) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1891, it is enacted that—

“Where the Secretary of State certifies that in his opinion any machinery or process or particular description of manual labour used in a factory or workshop (other than a domestic workshop) is dangerous or injurious to health, or dangerous to life or limb either generally or in the case of women, children, or any other class of persons, or that the provision for the admission of fresh air is not sufficient, or that the quantity of dust generated or inhaled in any factory or workshop is dangerous or injurious to health, the Chief Inspector may serve on the occupier of the factory or workshop a notice in writing, either proposing such special rules or requiring the adoption of such special measures as appear to the Chief Inspector to be reasonably practicable, and to meet the necessities of the case.”

Now I, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby certify that in my opinion such

processes carried on in factories and workshops, or parts thereof, as are named in the Schedule hereunder, are injurious to health.

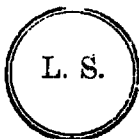

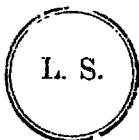

No. 221.—NORTH AMERICA AND WEST INDIES STATION.

UNITED STATES—FLORIDA.—FLORIDA REEFS. *Key West Harbour—Alterations in Buoyage, &c.*

THE United States Government has given notice, dated 7th May, 1892, of the following alterations in buoyage, &c., in Key West Harbour:—

1. The 21-foot shoallying westward of Fort Taylor has been marked by a red buoy, No. 8, moored in 21 feet water, with Key West Lighthouse bearing E. $\frac{3}{4}$ N., and south-west bastion of Fort Taylor, S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., distant $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables.

2. Black buoy, No. 11, has been moved to the southward, and now lies in 21 feet water, with Key West Lighthouse bearing E. by N. $\frac{1}{3}$ N. and south-west bastion of Fort Taylor E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. distant $4\frac{1}{4}$ cables.

3. Black buoy, No. 17, lies about one cable S. by E. from its hitherto charted position, and from it, in the direction of Tift's Observatory, a shoal, with 16 feet water on it, extends nearly one-third the distance from the buoy to the wharf.

NOTE.—The pilots state that in the Triangles in Main Ship Channel there are several 19-foot patches lying in the fairway between West Triangle Buoy, No. 3, and the black and red striped buoy.

The depths given are at low water.

BAY OF BENGAL—CHITTAGONG COAST.

Kutabdia Island Light—Further Delay in Alteration in Character.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 116 of 1892, that on 15th June, 1892, it was

intended to make the following alteration in the character of Kutabdia Island Light:—

The Government of India has given further notice, that from unexpected delays, the alteration is now postponed to 1st January, 1893:—

Kutabdia Island Light will be a flashing white light, with an eclipse of one minute between the flashes; it will be elevated 121 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 17 miles.

The illuminating apparatus will be dioptric of the first order.

Until the exhibition of the permanent light, the existing light (fixed white) will be shown from the lighthouse 30 feet lower than formerly; and a blue light will be burnt every quarter of an hour between 7h. P.M. and 5h. A.M.

On the exhibition of the new light, the blue light will be discontinued.

Approximate position, latitude $21^{\circ} 52\frac{1}{2}'$ N., longitude $91^{\circ} 50'$ E.

(1.) *Intended Light-vessel with Fog Signal on Årans Grund.*

Also, that in the month of August, 1892, a Light-vessel (named "Nahkiainen") will be placed on the southern or south-western side of Ulko-Nahkiainen Shoal, east shore of the Gulf of Bothnia:—

From Nahkiainen Light-vessel two fixed white lights (one at each masthead) of the sixth order will be exhibited.

The Light-vessel, built of iron, will have two masts, and will carry a frame globe at each masthead.

Approximate position, lat. $64^{\circ} 35'$ N., long. $23^{\circ} 51'$ E.

Also, that a steam fog siren will be established on board Nahkiainen Light-vessel.
