of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Tuesday, the 19th instant.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Consolidated Order: Allowance of Tobacco and Snuff to certain Paupers in the Workhouse:—

Bourn Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Bourn Union, in the County of the Parts of Kesteven:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Bourn Union (amongst others), the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Rules and Regulations with regard to the government of the Workhouse of the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order that, from and after the date hereof, the following regulations shall be in force in the said Bourn Union, namely,—

ARTICLE I.—Tobacco or snuff may be allowed to such of the inmates of the Workhouse of the Union who are not able-bodied, or are employed upon work of a specially disagreeable character, as the Guardians may consider should be supplied with the same, the quantity to be allowed in each case, or in any class of cases, to be such as the Guardians may by resolution prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—So much of Article 121 of the said General Order as provides that no pauper shall smoke in any room in the Workhouse except by the special direction of the Medical Officer shall be rescinded, so far as regards the said Union; but the Guardians may from time to time, by resolution, determine in what rooms and at what times smoking shall be allowed, and no pauper shall smoke in the Workhouse in any other room or at any other time than is so allowed.

THE ORKNEY PLEURO-PNEUMONIA MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1892.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Revocation.

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby, from and after the commence-

ment of this Order, revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not affect the past operation of the Order hereby revoked, or invalidate or make unlawful anything done thereunder, or affect any licence or authority granted, or any right, title, obligation, or liability accrued thereunder, before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

Restriction on Movement.

2. No cattle shall be moved into the county of Orkney from the District of any other Local Authority in England or Wales or Scotland except as provided by this Order :

Cattle may be moved into the county of Orkney from the District of any other Local Authority in Scotland with a licence of the Local Authority of the county of Orkney granted on—

(i.) a Certificate of a Veterinary Inspector certifying that each of the cattle described in the Certificate is in his opinion free from pleuro-pneumonia, and

(ii.) a Declaration of the owner of the cattle, or his agent authorized in writing for that purpose, declaring that to the best of his knowledge and belief—

(a.) each head of cattle to be moved is not affected with pleuro-pneumonia and has not been exposed to the infection of pleuro-pneumonia, and

(b.) each head of cattle has been in his possession for a period of at least three months immediately before the making of the Declaration, and has not during that period been in contact with any cattle which have been brought from Ireland, or during that period been within a distance of one mile of a pleuro-pneumonia infected place, or during that period been exposed in or at any market, fair, exhibition, or public sale, and

(c.) there is not at the time of the making of the Declaration a pleuro-pneumonia infected place within one mile of the farm or premises from which the animal is to be moved, and

(d.) the animal while being moved to the port of shipment will not pass, otherwise than by

railway, within one mile of a pleuro-pneumonia infected place.

Disposal of Certificates, Declarations, and Licences.

3. The Certificates, Declarations, and Licences required under this Order shall be delivered to the police immediately on the landing of the cattle in the county of Orkney.

Offences.

4. If a head of cattle is moved into the county of Orkney in contravention of the provisions of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as THE ORKNEY PLEURO-PNEUMONIA MOVEMENT ORDER OF 1892.

Commencement.

6. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the eighteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

Interpretation.

7. In this Order—

The Act of 1878 means the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878 :

Cattle means bulls, cows, oxen, heifers, and calves :

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Animals Order of 1886.
