4. Vessels arriving direct from Adalia and Jaffa and from the coast of Turkey in Asia between those ports are to undergo 10 days' quarantine. Vessels arriving from the above places but which have been admitted to pratique at intermediate ports, are to be admitted to pratique in these Islands.

Vessels arriving from the Russian coast in the Black Sea, from Sukumkaleh to Batoum inclusively, are to undergo 7 days' quarantine.

Vessels arriving from other parts of the Black Sea coast, including the coast of the Sea of Azov, are to undergo 24 hours' observation in the Great Harbour.

9. The importation of susceptible goods as

hereunder specified from any of the ports subjected to quarantine is prohibited, viz.:—

Rags, cotton and cotton seed, raw silk, hair, and feathers.

Other susceptible goods arriving from any of the ports subjected to quarantine are to be thoroughly disinfected.

I. That it is practically impossible to complete the work of revision by the 1st of August, 1892, notwithstanding the great efforts which the said Companies have made; and

II. That confusion, disturbance of traffic, and inconvenience would result to the public from an attempt to bring into operation the aforesaid Acts earlier than the Railway Rates and Charges Acts of 1892;

And whereas the Board of Trade have carefully considered the various objections which have been made to the proposed postponement, but are of opinion that such postponement should be allowed:
