# FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1878. 41 Vic., c. 16, Sections 26, 95, 96.

ORDER of Secretary of State postponing operation of Order of 20th February, 1892, with respect to Standard of Proficiency and Standard of Previous Due Attendance at School (England and Wales).

WHEREAS on the 20th of February, 1892, an Order was made by me, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, with the consent of the Lords of the Committee of the Privy Council on Education, fixing the Standards of proficiency and of due attendance under Section 26 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, so far as the same related to England and Wales; and the said Order was to come into force on the expiration of six months after the publication thereof in the London Gazette, which took place on the 4th March, 1892.

Now I, the said Right Honourable Henry Matthews, do hereby, in pursuance of the said enactment, order that the coming into operation of my said Order of the 20th of February, 1892, be postponed until the 1st day of September, 1893.

ORDER as to the Fees and Percentages, under section 148 of the Lunacy Act, 1890, which are required to be taken for Lunacy proceedings in the High Court of Justice and Court of Appeal by means of Stamps.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Public Offices Fees Act, 1879, it is provided that the Treasury may from time to time make, and when made revoke, alter, and add to regulations for all or any of the following purposes respecting fees in any public office; that is to say:—

1. Regulating the manner in which the fees taken in money are to be taken, accounted for,

and paid over.

2. Determining the use of impressed or adhesive stamps, and the mode of cancellation of adhesive stamps.

3. Regulating the use of stamps and prescribing the application thereof to documents from time to time in use and requiring documents to be used for the purpose of such stamps.

Provided that any such regulations which may relate to the office of any court of law shall be made with the consent of the Lord Chancellor.

Now we, the undersigned, being two of the Lords of Her Majesty's Treasury, do, with the concurrence of the Lord Chancellor, hereby give notice, and order and direct,—

That from and after the date of this Order, in lieu of any regulations on the subject heretofore in force, the whole of the fees and percentages imposed by the Rules made under section 148 of the Lunacy Act, 1890, shall be taken in stamps, and that the stamps employed for the purpose shall, in all cases, except for the fees payable for copies of documents, be impressed. The stamps for denoting the fees payable for copies of documents shall be either impressed or adhesive.

The impressed stamps herein referred to shall be of such a character as the Commissioners of Inland Revenue may, from time to time, adopt for the purpose, whilst the adhesive stamps shall be of the description used for Judicature Fees generally, such adhesive stamps to be cancelled by the various court or other officers either by perforation or in such manner as the said Commissioners may from time to time direct.

The official forms with impressed or adhesive stamps, as the case may be, required in any proceedings under the said Act, shall be sold at the Inland Revenue Office, Royal Courts of Justice.

And we do further direct that this Order shall be binding on all Courts, officers, and persons whom it may in any way affect.
