"That the glebe lands tithes, rent-charges and other profits now belonging to the said rectory of Whiston described in the first schedule hereto and the glebe lands, tithes rent-charges and other profits now belonging to the said rectory of Yardley Hastings and described in the second schedule hereto shall from and immediately after the proposed separation belong to and be paid to the perpetual curate or incumbent for the time being of the said intended separate benefice of Denton to and for his own separate use and benefit.

"The First SCHEDULE referred to.

"Annual value.

"About sixty-eight acres of glebe land now let at ... subject to land tax, of five pounds eleven shillings and four pence a year and to drainage charge in favour of the Lands Improvement Company of twenty-four pounds a year.

"The Second SCHEDULE referred to. "Farm of one hundred and thirteen acres two roods two perches let to Mr. Thomas Sargeant at the yearly rent of one hundred and forty pounds. Allotment ground of about twentysix acres let at the yearly rent of thirty-nine pounds sixteen shillings and two pence. Fees about two pounds. Value of shooting about three pounds six shillings and eight pence.

"That the two charchwardens shall be appointed in the usual way for the said perpetual

curacy or separate benefice of Denton.

"That the church or chapel now locally situated within the said hamlet or chapelry of Denton shall be the parish church of the said separate benefice for all ecclesiastical purposes and the inhabitants of the said hamlet or chapelry shall have the right to the use and occupation of the said parish church and shall be charged and chargeable with such rates charges and assessments as shall from time to time be made for or in respect thereof.

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Edward White Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council:

"That the Right Reverend Mandell Lord Bishop of Peterborough has represented unto us

(amongst other things):

"That there is in the county of Northampton and his diocese of Peterborough the parishes and benefices or rectories of Whiston and Yardley Hastings.

"That there is belonging to the said benefices or rectories of Whiston and Yardley Hastings an ancient hamlet or chapelry known as the hamlet or chapelry of Denton the limits and boundaries

whereof are well known and defined.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838, and of the Act two and three Victoria chapter forty-nine the said chapelry of Denton may be advantageously separated from the said parishes of Whiston and Yardley Hastings and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a vicarage and benefice by the name and style of the perpetual curacy of Denton of which the church or chapel belonging to the said chapelry shall be the parish church.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the said Pluralities Act 1838 the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes tithe rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patrons and incumbents of the benefices to be affected has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to

are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act, 1838 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.
