MEDITERRANEAN.—ADRIATIC—EASTERN SHORE.

Cattaro Approach—Beacon erected in Kombur Channel, Intended Withdrawal of Floating Beacon, and Intended Light.

THE Austrian Government has given notice, dated 30th July, 1892, that a beacon has been erected on the northern side of Kombur Channel, approach to Cattaro:—

Kombur Channel Beacon, constructed of masonry, is a truncated pyramid in shape, with a stairway on the western side, and 10 feet in height above the water. It stands in a depth of 7 feet water, with Bianca Point bearing about W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. distant 3 cables.

Approximate position, lat. 42° 26' N., long. 18° 36' 30" E.

Also, that the floating beacon at present moored half a cable south-westward of the above position will be withdrawn, and it is intended to exhibit a light from the beacon recently erected.
