THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 4th September, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at San Sebastian, enclosing the following Royal Order, relating to quarantine:—

Colonial Ministry.—Royal Order.

Arrivals from the foreign ports, Hamburg, Havre, and Antwerp, being declared infected, with reference to the provisions of the existing law of health, as enacted in the Royal Orders issued by the Ministry of the Interior on the 23rd, 26th, and 27th instant, and published in the Gazettes of the 24th, 27th, and 28th instant, and taking into account that the mail steamers of the Transatlantic Company touch, according to their itineraries, at the abovenamed ports, which tends to endanger the public health on their arrival in the peninsula, when sailing to the Antilles or the Philippines, and which as a precautionary measure should be avoided henceforward:—

The King (whom God preserve), &c., has ordained that the necessity of touching at the abovenanced ports by the mail steamers of the said Company shall be suspended, extending this suspension to the port of Marseilles and to all ports from which arrivals may henceforth be declared by the Ministry of the Interior to be infected.

Pera, September 8, 1892. Board of Health here decided yesterday that arrivals from London, Liverpool, Shields, Grimsby, Glasgow, and Swansea will perform five days' quarantine at Dardanelles before being allowed to come to Constantinople. This regulation does not affect ships in transit to Russian ports. Arrivals from every part of the coast extending from Cronstadt to Cherbourg will perform ten days' quarantine at Clazomenes or Bevrouth; arrivals from Mediterranean ports of France, Italy, and Austria with passengers will perform five days' quarantine at any Turkish port where there is a sanitary doctor. Arrivals from Kurrachee and from every Persian port in the Persian Gulf will perform ten days'quarantine at Bussorah. Arrivals from every port in the Pashalic of Yemen will have to undergo ten days' quarantine as well as arrivals from every part of the coast line extending from Guardafui to Massowah.

In consequence of the outbreak of cholera at Antwerp, and its spreading further in Germany, the Marine Board, acting under orders received from the Minister of Commerce, orders that—

Arrivals from Belgian ports and from German ports in the North Sca shall be subjected to seven days' quarantine observations.

Wearing apparel shall be disinfected according to the regulations.

These measures will be adopted if the ship has had a healthy passage and arrives in normal sanitary conditions, in all other cases the measures to be taken shall be decided on by the Marine Board. The President, Becher.

The charges for disinfecting each vessel amount to 16s. 8d.

In all cases therefore where the voyage is of shorter duration than four days, ships will be detained in quarantine until the full expiration of the four days after departure from the infected port.
