THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 3rd September, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Belgrade, stating that the Servian Government have prohibited the importation from Russia, or any other infected country, of the following articles:—

- (1.) Cloths and used bed-covers intended for commerce.
- (2.) Old clothes, rags, old papers.
- (3.) Leathers, and all articles manufactured of leather.
- (4.) Wools in general, hair, silks, hemp, cotton, and feathers.
- (5.) Entrails in general, and animal refuse.
- (6.) Caviar, salt, dried or prepared fish.
- (7.) Samples of above-named articles.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Circular relating to quarantine, issued by the United States Government. The following is an extract therefrom:—

Treasury Department,  
Office of the Secretary,  
Washington, D.C., August 19, 1892.

It having been shown that an epidemic of cholera prevails in Persia, India, and Russia, and that it has also reached Germany, Austria, and France, and in view of the danger which arises through the importation of rags from cholera infected districts, and of the difficulty, through their re-shipment at various ports, of accurately determining the localities in which rags are actually gathered.

Furthermore, because of the prevalence from time to time in various foreign countries of small-pox, scarlet fever, diphtheria, and other contagious diseases liable to be conveyed by rags, therefore it is hereby ordered that, on and after September 20, 1892, rags from any foreign port will be refused entry into the United States unless said rags are accompanied by a certificate from the consular officer at the port of shipment to the effect that they have been disinfected in accordance with the methods herein described.

It is also ordered that rags gathered in or shipped from any port or place where cholera is known to prevail in epidemic form be denied entry to the United States absolutely on and after the date of this Circular, except such as were then afloat, which must be disinfected on arrival.

Royal Order.

Having regard to the official news received at this Ministry, and in accordance with Articles 18, 30, 35, and 36 of the Sanitary Law, and Rule 12 of the Royal Order of 6th June, 1860:

His Majesty the King (whom God preserve) and in his name the Queen Regent has resolved that all arrivals from the ports of Algiers shall be admitted to free pratique provided they bring a clean bill of health vised by the Spanish Consul, and in case of there being no Spanish Consul, by the Consul of another nation, and that the ship arrives in good hygienic conditions and without any suspicious occurrence on board.

If the bill of health carries a note of suspicious cases of epidemic cholera, whichever be the form in which the fact is expressed, the ships shall be submitted to three days' observation; and if cases of epidemic cholera or only the word cholera are mentioned, they shall be sent to foul lazaretto.

His Majesty has likewise ordered that the same vigilance prescribed by Royal Order of 29th August ultimo, for the countries therein mentioned shall be observed with the passengers and crews from Algiers, and to prohibit the entry by our ports of rags, worn clothes, mattresses, bedding, green fruits, and vegetables grown on a level with the ground or a little above it, when arriving from the ports of Algiers; and that all clothes and belongings of crews and passengers, unwashed wool, fresh hides and skins for wrapping, furs, feathers, and animals' hairs, which are not prepared by industrial process, proceeding from the said ports, are to be subject, when disembarked at each place, to ventilation or disinfection on their arrival.

By Royal Order I communicate this to you for your knowledge, and that of the Maritime Sanitary Boards, recommending the greatest rigour in the examination of the said goods and merchandise.

The Orders published in the Gazette of 26th and 30th August, relative to inspection of travellers and disinfection of merchandise, to be applied also to Great Britain, Gibraltar, and British possessions in the Mediterranean.”

“September 15. Board of Health Circular, dated yesterday, reduces the quarantine on arrivals from the British ports mentioned in my previous telegram from ten to five days.”

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1892, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

*Revocation.*

1. Article 3 of the Animals (Amendment) Order of 1892, No. 7, is hereby, from and after the commencement of this Order, revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Article hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

*Amendment of Article 151 of the Animals  
Order of 1886.*

2. The following provisions of this Article shall be read in the place of Article 151 of the Animals Order of 1886, and shall be deemed to be Article 151 of that Order (namely):

*Conditions of Landing.*

151.—(1.) The landing of foreign animals at a Landing-Place for foreign animals under the provisions of this Chapter is subject to the following conditions:

*First.* That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-eight days before taking them on board, had on board any animal exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in any country other than Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or Iceland, or New Zealand, or the Channel Islands, or the United States of America, or the Isle of Man.

*Second.* That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-one days before taking them on board or at any time since taking on board the animals imported, entered any port or place in any country other than Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or Iceland, or New Zealand, or the Channel Islands, or the United States of America, or the Isle of Man.

*Third.* That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any animal exported or carried coastwise from any port or place in any country other than Her Majesty's Possessions in North America, or Iceland, or New Zealand, or the Channel Islands, or the United States of America, or the Isle of Man.

(2.) And the animals imported shall not be landed at a Landing-Place for foreign animals unless and until—

(a.) The owner or charterer of the vessel in which they are imported, or his agent in

England or Wales or Scotland, has entered into a bond to Her Majesty the Queen, in a sum not exceeding one thousand pounds, with or without a surety or sureties, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs, conditioned for the observance of the foregoing conditions; and

(b.) The master of the vessel has on each occasion of importation of foreign animals therein satisfied the Commissioners of Customs, or their proper officer, by declaration made and signed or otherwise, that all the animals then imported therein are properly imported according to the provisions of this Article.

*Interpretation.*

3. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in the Animals Order of 1886.

*Short Title.*

4. This Order may be cited as THE ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1892, No. 8.

*Commencement.*

5. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the nineteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.
