THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Notice, issued by Her Majesty's Representative at Malta, whereby the following are substituted for paragraphs 7 and 12 of the Government Notice, No. 137, published on the 31st ultimo:

Valletta, September 5, 1892.

No. 143.

7. Vessels arriving from the Black Sea, from French Ports in the Atlantic and in the British Channel, from ports in Belgium, Holland, Germany, Denmark, and the Baltic Sea shall be allowed to enter the harbour in quarantine for the purpose of coaling, taking provisions, and discharging cargo; provided the coals are brought alongside and put into the vessel by labourers, who shall be kept in quarantine for twenty-one days, and the trimming in bunkers is effected by the resources of the vessel. No susceptible goods, however, shall be landed, and live stock shall be disinfected in the usual way.

Such vessels shall quit the harbour as soon as they have coaled, taken provisions, or discharged

cargo.

The unshipping of cargo from such vessels shall be effected by the crew on lighters within a period to be fixed, in each case, by the Collector of Customs.

Passengers arriving by such vessels shall not be allowed to land.

Vessels which have been in any port of the Black Sea, or in any French port in the Atlantic or the British Channel, or in any port in Belgium, Holland, Germany, Denmark, or in the Baltic Sea, but which have afterwards been admitted to free pratique in other ports, shall not be admitted to free pratique in these islands before twenty-eight days have elapsed from their departure from a port in the Black Sea, or from any French port in the Atlantic or the British Channel, or from any port in Belgium, Holland, Germany, Denmark, or the Baltic Sea.

Vessels arriving from any port in the United Kingdom shall undergo strict medical inspection

before being admitted to pratique.

12. Soiled linen and wearing apparel shall not be allowed to be landed from any ship which may be under any suspicion of having had recently on board a case of contagious or infectious disease, or from any ship arriving through the Suez Canal, or from Syria, Karamania, or Spain, except after disinfection at the Lazaretto or at such other places as may be appointed by the port Authority.

Soiled linen shall not be allowed to be landed from ships arriving from any port in the Mediterranean or in the United Kingdom, except after

disinfection.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 11th September, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, reporting that the Sanitary Council of the Principality has decided that all merchandize coming from Ham-

burg and other German ports will be subjected to a quarantine of eleven days on entering Bulgaria.

The importation of all samples from contaminated countries is forbidden.

The following Circular has also been received:-September 12, 1892.

In its meeting of the 29th August, 11th September, the Superior Sanitary Council of the Principality has taken the following decisions—

1st. Travellers and merchandize arriving from contaminated countries can only enter Bulgaria by the towns of Lom, Roustchuck, Bourgas, and Tsaribrod.

2nd. The service of the Orient Express on

Bulgarian territory is suspended.

3rd. The entry of railway carriages belonging to foreign countries to any place in Bulgaria, or in transit to Constantinople, is forbidden. The merchandize contained in such railway carriages will be disinfected at Tsaribrod, and transferred to carriages belonging to the Bulgarian Railway.

4th. All merchandize imported into the country

will only be delivered after disinfection.

5th. Importation of Hamburg beers is forbid-

6th. Tank trucks, containing alcohol, and coming from Austria, may enter Bulgaria after disinfection at Tsaribrod.

7th. The importation of sausages, hams, bladders, and Mortadella sausages, caviar, cheeses, butter, and other milk foods from all countries is

8th. The measure forbidding the importation of Batoum petroleum is withdrawn. The cases will be exposed to the air for twelve days, and disinfected with lime water.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 9th September, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Riga, stating that vessels on which a cholera patient may be found must perform their quarantine at the Island of Känsö (Sweden). They will not be allowed to enter any port in the province of Livonia until they are provided with a certificate from the authorities at Känsö. No vessels from Hamburg or other strongly-infected port will be admitted to Livonian ports without such a certificate.

11. Passengers will not be permitted to land at Malta unless they declare on oath to the Port Authority that they have not resided or been in Arabia, on the coasts of the Black Sea, in France, Belgium, Holland, Germany, Denmark, or on the coasts of the Baltic Sea, for the twenty-eight days previous to their arrival.

13. The importation of susceptible goods, as hereunder specified, from France, Italy, Trieste, Fiume, and from any of the ports subjected to quarantine, is prohibited, viz. :-

Rags, cotton and cotton seed, raw silk, hair,

and feathers.

Other susceptible goods arriving from France, Italy, Trieste, Fiume, and from any of the ports subjected to quarantine are to be thoroughly disinfected.

Susceptible goods imported by vessels coming from, or touching at, ports subjected to quarantine, even when such vessels have been admitted to pratique at intermediate ports, shall be considered as having been imported from such ports subjected to quarantine for the purposes of the provisions of this Article, unless satisfactory proof be produced, showing that such goods have been imported from other ports which are not subjected to quarantine in these islands.

"Panama, September 17. In consequence of cases of cholera in New York, Colon closed to departures from United States after September 12. North American Mail Steamer sailing New York, September 10, arrived to-day, placed in quarantine nine days."

"Stockholm, September 17. Sweden has declared Great Britain and Ireland free from cholera. Ships coming thence can therefore again enter without delay.'

"Port au Prince, Hayti, September 17. Cholera quarantine proclaimed. Ships without cases of cholera put in quarantine with fixed maximum of five days. Ships with cases of cholera refused."

"Madrid, September 18. Royal Order to day subjects to three days' observation arrivals from all ports between Salerno and Naples and from Grangemouth in Scotland, which left those ports after the 10th instant."

"Constantinople, September 19. Board of Health Circular, dated yesterday, imposes ten days' quarantine to be performed at Clazomene or Beyrouth on arrivals from New York, to be applied to vessels leaving that place on or after the 15th instant."
