THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 16th September, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Vienna, stating that seven days' quarantine is imposed on vessels coming from Dutch ports. Personal effects will be disinfected.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 17th September, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Copenhagen, enclosing Circulars relating to quarantine.

The following is a translation of the material points thereof:—

The quarantine is reduced from ten to five days in the case of vessels which arrive without having, or having had during their voyage, cases of death or disease of a choleraic nature on board, and which have not on board goods, the importation of which into Denmark has been prohibited.

This reduction is not applicable to arrivals from St. Petersburg, Cronstadt, ports of the Elbe, Antwerp, and Havre.

The regulations in force prohibiting the importation of hair, horse-hair, and skins are removed, except in the case of used horse-hair.

Quarantine has been declared against vessels coming from or having communicated with Dutch ports, and the importation of wearing apparel, linen, bedding, &c. (not being part of passengers' luggage), and of rags, drills, wool-flock, used wadding, hairs, skins, fruits, vegetables, and flowers therefrom is also prohibited.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 15th September, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Stockholm, enclosing the following Royal Decree:—

(Translation.)

Royal Decree on the Import of Railway Waggons into Sweden.

We, Oscar, &c., make known that We, after hearing Our Board of Health, are pleased to decree as follows:

The import of railway rolling-stock by sea from places declared by the Board of Health as infected with cholera, and also from Denmark, shall continue to be forbidden; but nevertheless, so long

as no other part of Denmark, except Jutland, be declared infected, empty Swedish trucks may be introduced by steam ferry from Elsinore to Helsingborg, if the following conditions and regulations be observed.

1. Neither passengers, post, or other objects may be conveyed on the steam ferry which carries the trucks to Helsingborg, and is exempted from undergoing the observation described in the Decree of August 5 last, respecting the prevention of the introduction of cholera into the Kingdom.

2. The regulations in the Decree of September 3, which allowed exceptions (from the rules issued on August 5, for preventing the introduction of cholera through Denmark) as regards the traffic from Copenhagen and Elsinore to Malmö and Helsingborg respectively, shall prevail, so far as applicable, but before the steam ferry be allowed to have free communication with Sweden, an official certificate must be delivered to the appointed medical officer, to the effect that the trucks have not been in contact with a place declared to be infected with cholera, and that the trucks have not been moved from off the steam ferry without the permission of the doctor.

3. The trucks, as soon as they run on to land, shall be taken to a special place approved by the doctor and near the harbour, and there be immediately and carefully cleansed and disinfected in accordance with the doctor's instructions and under his supervision. The doctor shall then issue his certificate that the above cleansing and disinfection has been carried out, and upon receipt of this certificate the railway authorities may take possession of the trucks.

Let all concerned obediently submit to the above.
