THE Queen has been pleased to grant unto Apsley Cherry, of Denford House, in the parish of Kintbury, in the county of Berks, Esquire, a Major-General in Her Majesty's Army, second but only surviving son of George Henry Cherry, late of Denford House aforesaid, Esquire, some-time Representative in Parliament for Dunwich, and High Sheriff (1829) for the county of Berks, by Charlotte, his wife, second daughter of Charles Drake Garrard, and sister of Charles Benet Drake Garrard, both late of Lamer Park, in the county of Hertford, Esquires, all deceased, Her Royal licence and authority that he and his issue may, in compliance with a proviso contained in the last will and testament of his maternal uncle, the said Charles Benet Drake Garrard, take and use the surname of Garrard in addition to and after that of Cherry, and that he and they may bear the arms of Garrard quarterly with those of his and their own family arms; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

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THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, from Her Majesty's Representative at Nice, reporting that vessels from Portel,

Treport, Trouville, Deauville, and Cherbourg are to undergo a medical visit, and all dirty linen to be disinfected, and that to such ships are to be applied the dispositions of the first Article of the Decree of the 13th September, 1892, which is:—That the Regulations of the Decree of 29th August, 1892, excepting Articles 7 and 8, are extended to all vessels entering a port in France or Algeria, coming from any port of France or Algeria, or from any foreign port which has been declared suspected or contaminated by cholera by a decision of the Minister of the Interior. Article 7 of the Decree of 29th August, 1892, forbids the importation into France of rags and bedding from Prussia, Germany, Holland, or Belgium. Article 8 forbids the importation of fruit and vegetables growing near the soil and coming from the aforesaid countries.

The King, whom God preserve, and in his name the Queen Regent, has resolved that all arrivals to any of the ports of that province from Dieppe, France; Amsterdam, Holland; and Odessa, Russia; whatever may be the bill of health they bring, provided they have left the above ports the 10th, 13th, 17th, and 18th instant, respectively, shall be sent to foul lazaretto; and that those ports under 165 kilometres distance from those mentioned shall be considered notoriously dangerous after the 20th, 23rd, 27th, and 28th.

Having regard to the official news received at this Ministry, and in accordance with Articles 30, 35, and 36 of the Sanitary Law, and Rules 1, 2, 4, 6, 7, and 8 of the Royal Order of 23rd instant,

His Majesty the King, whom God preserve, and in his name the Queen Regent, has resolved that all arrivals to any of the ports of that province after the date of this Royal Order from Jaganrog, Russia, whatever may be the bill of health they bring, shall be sent to foul lazaretto; and that those ports at a distance under 165 kilometres from Jaganrog shall be considered notoriously dangerous after the 20th instant.

The Directors of Maritime Health shall take care to apply strictly Rules 12, 13, and 14 of the mentioned Royal Order as far as regards the sanitary régime of the ships according to the wording of the bills of health. This declaration annuls Rule 15 of the said Royal Order for this kind of arrivals comprised in order of the Sanitary Central Board of 20th July last, by which all arrivals from the Sea of Azoff were declared foul.

Naples, Italy; and those of Oran, Algiers; provided those coming from the two first-named places have left after the 20th and 29th instant, respectively, and those of the other ports without date of leaving.

Therefore, ships arriving from the above-mentioned places shall be admitted to free pratique, provided that they bring a clean bill of health vised by the Spanish Consul; that they arrive in good state of health, and without any confirmed or suspected case of illness on board; and that they are not comprised in Rules 9, 10, or 11 of the Royal Order of 31st March, 1888, 29, 31, or 32 of that of 23rd instant, nor in any other disposition which, according to the circumstances of the voyage, may render the ship liable to quarantine.

Those dangerous goods mentioned in the Royal Order of 29th October, 1886, published in the Gazette of the 31st, which may have been stored during the epidemic at Aarhus or Island of Capri, shall continue to be considered so until the 10th October next, and they shall be submitted on their arrival to the disinfection prescribed by the aforementioned disposition.

(Translation.) Gaceta de Madrid, October 3, 1892. Royal Order.

Having regard to the official news received at this Ministry, and in accordance with Article 40 of the Sanitary Law, and Rules 1, 9, 10, 11, and 13 of the Royal Order of 23rd September last,

The King (whom God preserve) has resolved to declare clean all arrivals from London, Danzig, and Kiel (Germany), provided they have left those ports after the 20th and 25th ultimo, and 2nd instant respectively; also those from Swansea, Falmouth, Grimsby (England), and Grangemouth (Scotland), whatever may be the date of their sailing. The arrivals from the above three ports were declared foul by Royal Orders of the 8th, 5th, and 7th of September; and those from the other ports submitted to observation by Royal Orders of the 3rd, 7th, and 8th of the same

Therefore, ships arriving from the above-mentioned places shall be admitted to free pratique, provided that they bring a clean bill of health vised by the Spanish Consul, and without any confirmed or suspected case of illness on board; and that they are not comprised in Rules 9, 10, or 11 of the Royal Order of 31st March, 1888.; 29, 31, or 32 of that of 23rd instant, nor in any other disposition which, according to the circumstances of the voyage, may render the ship liable to quarantine.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonics, a copy of a Notice, issued by Her Majesty's Representative at Malta, whereby the following paragraph is substituted for paragraph 11 of the Government Notice 151 of 27th September:—

11. Passengers will not be permitted to land at Malta unless they declare on oath to the Port Authority that they have not resided or been in Arabia, on the coasts of the Black Sea, in France, Belgium, Holland, Germany, Denmark, or on the coasts of the Baltic Sea or at New York for the twelve days previous to their arrival.

Passengers arriving direct from England on vessels having a duly qualified medical officer on board are to be allowed to land without medical inspection or the declaration of not having been in an infected place, provided that the medical officer in charge on board shall declare on oath that during the voyage there has not been on board a case of dysentery, diarrhea, cholerine, cholera, or any disease with symptoms resembling cholera either among the passengers or the crew.

The declaration above referred to shall be countersigned by the master of the vessel.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Telegram, from Her Majesty's Representative at Tangier, viz.:—"The only measures adopted respecting arrivals from the United Kingdom are as follows: -- Vessels not admitted pratique at any port without inspection and disinfection at Tangier. If they come direct passengers themselves and luggage are disinfected; if the vessel got pratique at an intermediate healthy port only luggage is disinfected. Cargoes to be accompanied with certificate of origin. Goods from infected districts refected unless declared non-susceptible by decision of Board of Health; goods of other origin, including British, are freely admitted, except susceptible merchandize, including cotton, wool, silk, hair, leather, which must be disinfected. Rags, soiled linen, fruits and vegetables growing near the ground absolutely excluded; same treatment for parcels by post. Bremen, Rotterdam, Dunkirk, Rome, and Keil are on the official list of infected ports. Expression healthy ports excluded all British, French, German, Belgian, and Dutch ports,"

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following Telegram from Her Majesty's Representative at Panama:—"Colon opened to British ships subject to the following conditions: certificate from Post Office that the mails from infected ports have been fumigated; passengers from the Continent must have a certificate from a Columbian Consul proving residence in the United Kingdom before embarcation; cargo not to be embarked from declared infected ports; on arrival in port ships must submit to observation and fumigation if necessary. If cholera appears on board before pratique granted, ship will be excluded. Columbian Atlantic ports opened same condition."

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, from Her Majesty's Representative at Königsberg, containing the following information respecting quarantine, viz.

Owing to steps taken by the interested parties a modification of the quarantine regulations at Pillan has been granted, and the following new order with reference to cholera has been issued yesterday.

All ships arriving at Pillan from infected places and being furnished with the necessary certificates of the Sanitary Authorities of the infected port of sailing, can pass Pillan after having been examined by the Sanitary Commission; the delay caused by this examination will be of only about twelve hours. At the destination say Königsberg, Elbing, or Pillan, the crew will be under medical observation during six days, reckoned from the day of the steamers leaving the infected place.

Ships which have no certificates of the Sanitary Authorities with regard to disinfection before leaving the infected place, will be properly disinfected at Pillan, the crew examined, their effects disinfected, and the bilge water or tank water cleansed by caustic lime, and pumped out at sea, this means a delay of about twenty-four hours.

Rags, bedding, filthy clothing, fruit, vegetables, butter, cheese, etc., are not allowed to be imported and, if found on board, will be destroyed.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following information respecting quarantine from .Her Majesty's Representative at Smyrna, viz.:-

Vessels arriving from ports subject to five or to ten days' quarantine and those whose term of fifteen or twenty-four days is not completed must, when they arrive in a Turkish port, wait in quarantine for the expiration of the said term of fifteen or

twenty-four days.

For instance, a vessel subject to five days' quarantine, arriving after a twelve days' passage, will perform three days' quarantine in order to complete the term of fifteen days. In the same manner a vessel subject to ten days' quarantine, and arriving after a passage of sixteen days, will perform eight days in order to complete the twenty-four days.

1. A quarantine of five days, to be performed in a port where there is a medical officer, is imposed on vessels arriving from the Mediterranean ports of Egypt and having passengers on board, while those without passengers are submitted to a

rigorous medical inspection. 2. Vessels arriving from the British ports of London, Liverpool, Glasgow, Swansea, Grimsby, and Shields without passengers will be submitted

to a rigorous medical inspection only.
