THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Despatch, from Her Majesty's Representative at Malta, enclosing the following Notice respecting quarantine, viz. :-

Government Notice.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to direct that Government Notice No. 155 of the 10th of October, 1892, is to be modified, and that the following regulations are to be observed,

1. Exclusion from the Harbour (Sfratto) with provision for coaling under such restrictions as may in each case be directed by the Collector of Customs.

The following shall not be permitted to enter the harbour, but may be allowed to coal and take provisions in strict quarantine, with the least

delay, and subject to the orders of the Collector of Customs, and shall in all cases be ordered, after coaling, to quit with all despatch.

(a.) Vessels with pilgrims from the East.

(b.) Vessels having cases of cholera on board. (c.) Vessels which have had on board a case of diarrhœa, cholerine, or any disease with symptoms resembling cholera either among the passengers or the crew.

(d.) Vessels from North or South America when cases of yellow fever have occurred on board during the voyage.

(e.) Vessels arriving from Arabian ports in the Red Sea, which have not been admitted to free pratique at Suez and Port Said.

2. Quarantine for twenty-one days to be reckoned from the commencement of the voyage with provision for handling cargo in quarantine.

The following shall be subject to a period of twenty-one days' quarantine, but shall be permitted, under the directions of the Collector of Customs, to discharge goods (which are not suspected of communicating contagion) by means of the vessels crew on lighters or to employ for coaling local labourers under twenty-one days'

Vessels arriving from the Persian Gulf, the Red Sea, the Black Sea, French ports, Austro-Hungarian ports, Belgium, Holland, Germany, Denmark, the Baltic Sea, and the State of New

3. Quarantine ten days.

The following shall be subject to a period of

ten days' quarantine.

Vessels arriving direct from Adalia and Jaffa and from the coast of Turkey in Asia between those ports, provided that, if such vessels had been admitted to pratique at intermediate ports, they are to be admitted to free pratique in these islands.

4. Medical Inspection. All vessels arriving at Malta shall undergo strict medical inspection.

5. Passengers.

(a.) Passengers, arriving by any vessel subject to exclusion from the Harbours under paragraph I are not to be permitted to land.

(b.) Passengers will not be permitted to land at Malta unless they declare on oath before the Local Authorities that they have not resided or been in any port of Arabia, the Black Sea, France, Belgium, Holland, Germany, Denmark, AustriaHungary, the Baltic Sea, or the State of New York, for twelve days previous to their arrival.

(c.) Passengers arriving direct from England on vessels having a duly qualified Medical Officer on board are to be allowed to land without medical inspection or the declaration of not having been in an infected place, provided that the Medical Officer in charge on board shall declare on oath that during the voyage there has not been on board a case of dysentery, diarrhœa, cholerine, cholera, or any disease with symptoms resembling cholera either among the passengers or the crew.

(d.) The declaration above referred to shall be counter-signed by the master of the vessel.

6. Susceptible Goods.

(a.) The importation of the following articles is forbidden from any ports subjected to quarantine or on vessels calling at any such ports :- Rags; cotton seed, raw silk, hair, and feathers.

(b.) The importation of soiled wearing apparel

before disinfection is prohibited.

(c.) The importation of rags from Egypt is prohibited.

(d.) The importation of vines, vine shoots, vine leaves or roots from any port of the

Mediterranean is prohibited.

(e.) The importation of grapes, raisins, poles, or supports used in the cultivation of vines, vegetable earth, vegetable or mixed manure, is prohibited unless the importation is accompanied by a sworn declaration, made by the shipper before the British Consular Authority of the place of its origin to the effect that the shipment does not contain vine plants or cuttings, or that its contents come from nurseries, hothouses, fields, or gardens, which are at least 200 yards distant from the nearest vines or vineyards, and that moreover the phylloxera is not known to exist at the place or origin.

(f.) Provided, however, that the Collector of Customs may grant permission for the importation of plants and vegetable produce under proper restrictions when application has been made and the precautions necessary are established before

the shipment leaves the place of origin.

respecting quarantine, viz.:—
1. The entry into Servia of the following articles from Austro-Hungary or other infected countries is prohibited: - Cheese, butter, milk, curds, cream, fruit, salad, tomatoes, pimento, ghirkins, hogsflesh, ham, dried provisions, all kinds of bread and confectionery.

2. All colonial produce coming from contaminated districts or which has passed in transit through contaminated districts will be submitted to a quarantine of ten days.

3. The passage of fresh workmen at the Irongates through Servian territory is prohibited.

4. A cordon will be established along the Sare and the Danube to prevent the passage of barges from Austro-Hungary into Servia.

5. The local boat service between Chibatz and Metrovitze is permitted, but subject to the provisions of paragraph 5 of the Circular of the 22nd September relative to local service between Semlin, Belgrade, and Parresova.

6. Merchant ships, tugs, and rafts can enter Servia after medical inspection of crew. In stations where there is no doctor the crew must produce a certificate that they have undergone medical examination at the nearest station.

Arrivals from New York considered clean, provided they have left that port after 23rd ultimo.

These arrivals and those from any other place within 165 kilometres from New York will be admitted to free pratique whatever may be the date of their sailing, provided that they bring a clean bill of health viséd by the Spanish Consul, and in case of there being no Spanish Consul by the Consul of another nation, that they arrive in good state of health and without any confirmed or suspected case of illness on board, and that they are not comprised in Rules 9, 10, or 11 of the Royal Order of the 31st March, 1888, 29, 31, or 32 of that of 23rd September last, nor in any other disposition which according to the circumstances of the voyage may render the ships liable to quarantine.

Those dangerous goods mentioned in the Royal Order of the 29th October, 1886, published in the Gazette of the 31st, which may have been stored during the epidemic at New York, shall continue to be submitted to the disinfection prescribed by the aforementioned disposition if they have left

that port before the 9th November.

The same regulations apply to arrivals from Bremen, which have left that port since 23rd September, with the exception that the dangerous goods which may have been stored during the epidemic at Bremen will be admitted to free pratique provided they have left after 13th October.
