Circular of the Royal Hungarian Maritime Government directed to all the Royal Harbour offices, their branch offices, and to the Royal Lazareth of Martinschizza.

By Despatch, dated 8th October, of His Excellency the Royal Hungarian Minister of Commerce, I am directed to issue the following instructions:-

In consequence of cholera having been officially ascertained to exist in Hodeida, Beit-el-Faki, Zeidir, and Marawe, all vessels arriving from the Arabian coast, from ports between Cufudah and Bal-el-Mandeb, will be subjected to medical observation for seven days.

The effects of the persons on board will be disinfected uniform to the respective regulations.

This proceeding will take place in case of vessels arriving in perfect normal sanitary conditions; the proceeding in every other case willbe ordered specially by the Maritime Government

Circular of the Royal Hungarian Maritime Government directed to all the Royal Harbour offices, their branch offices, and to the lazareth in Martinschizza.

By Despatch, dated the 8th October, of His Excellency the Royal Hungarian Minister of Commerce, in concert with the President of the Ministers, charged with the direction of the Ministry for Home Affairs, with the Minister of the Finances and of the Agriculture, and also with the Imperial Royal Austrian Government, the Royal Hungarian Maritime Government, has ordered as following :-

The importation and the transit of the below mentioned coming from Holland, Belgium, France, and Roumania, and enumerated in the Austro - Hungarian Custom - house Tariff as follows, is hereby prohibited, viz. :-

Ou 1 No. 29. Fresh grapes for eating, and pineapples.

No. 31. Fresh vegetables.

No. 32. Vegetables and fresh fruits, not specially mentioned, if not immediately used for manufacturing purposes, as turnips for sugar, and potatoes for spirit manufacture.

Full evekles and crustaceous animals of the sea, viz.: oysters, lobsters, crabs, mock turtles not prepared.

No. 57. Milk.

No. 60. Hair of all kinds, hogs' bristles, unless they are not destined for fabrics.

No. 61. Crude hides, fresh, dried, or salted, with when they are perfectly dry and for manufacturing purposes.

No. 62. Crude bed feathers.

No. 63. Fresh intestines and cauls.

No. 65. Fresh and salted butter.

No. 66. Crude grease of pigs and geese, lard.

No. 69. Crude tallow.

No. 83. Meat fresh and prepared,

No. 84. Sausages. No. 85. Cheese.

No. 86. Herrings, salted or smoked.

No. 87. Fishes not being specially mentioned as salted, dried, or smoked.

No. 88. Prepared fish in oil or vinegar, in boxes, with exceptions when the abovementioned .86, 87, 88 arrive in tight

barrels, and having been disinfected outside with lime before the embarquement or discharge.

Ou 1 No. 89. Caviar and all compositions of caviar.

No. 99. Horns, legs, claws, bones, as far as they derive of killed beasts.

No. 123. Cotton waste, twist. No. 152. Crude wool, except when it is properly dry and for manufacturing purposes.

No. 353. Composts of animals, bones and blood.

No. 355. Garbage.

No. 356. Rags and other articles used for the manufacturing of papers, as rags of linen, old clothes, waves of caout-chouc Indiarubber, skins and peltry, also white linen and used linen, if not as luggage, which will be subjected to the respective quarantine regulations.

Empty bags and packages and wrapper, as far as they are not subjected to the same procedure as rags, will subjected disinfected at the expenses of the concerning parties and declared as being

disinfected.

These regulations will come in power as soon as the Harbour and Custom House Authorities are being informed. Should a vessel arrive in one of the Royal Hungarian Kraatian ports, having the mentioned goods on hoard, they must at once be brought into the Lazareth of Martinschizza, where they will remain for a fixed term, and if not removed in the stipulated time by the parties the goods will be destroyed.

WHEREAS on the 18th day of November, 1887, Regulations were issued by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, under the powers conferred on him by the Metropolitan Police Acts, as follows :-

"No Meeting shall be allowed to assemble, nor shall any person be allowed to deliver a public speech in Trafalgar Square, or in the streets or thoroughfares adjoining or leading thereto. No organised procession shall be allowed to pass along the streets or thoroughfares adjoining or leading to Trafalgar Square,'

which Regulations were to continue in force until

further notice.

Now I, Edward Ridley Colborne Bradford, the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, hereby revoke the foregoing Regulations as from the 31st

day of October, 1892.

TRAFALGAR SQUARE.
WHEREAS by "The Trafalgar Square Act, 1844," and by "The Crown Lands Act, 1851, the care, control, management, and regulation of Trafalgar Square is vested in the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Works and Public Buildings

And whereas it is expedient that Public Meetings should be permitted to be held in Trafalgar Square, subject to such regulations as may be necessary with a view to the public convenience and safety and to the due observance of order;

Now I, on behalf of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Works and Public Buildings, in exercise of the powers vested in them as aforesaid, do hereby make the following regulations with regard to the holding of meetings in Trafalgar Square :-

1. No public meeting shall be held except between two P.M. and sunset on Saturday, or between sunrise and sunset on Bank Holidays or Sunday.

2. No public meeting shall be held unless written notice shall have been sent four clear

3. Speeches shall not be delivered except from places authorized by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Works and Public Buildings.

4. Not more than one meeting will be allowed at the same time; and if notices of two or more meetings are given for the same day, preference shall be given to that meeting of which notice shall have been first received.

These regulations shall come into force on the 31st day of October, 1892.
