(Application to the Board of Trade by the Otley Gas Company under the Gas and Water Facilities Act, 1870, and the Gas and Water Facilities Act, 1870, Amendment Act, 1873, for a Provisional Order authorizing the Company to supply Gas in bulk, and to purchase Additional Lands for the purposes of their Undertaking, and for an extension of Borrowing Powers; and other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade by the Otley Gas Company (hereinafter called "the Company") for a Provisional Order pursuant to the Gas and Water Facilities Act, 1870, and the Gas and Water Facilities Act, 1870, Amendment Act, 1873, for the following, or some of the following, amongst other purposes, that is to say:—

Ordered that the parishes or townships of Ganton, Sherburn, Willerby, Staxton, and Binnington, within the Petty Sessional Division of Buckrose, in the East Riding of the county of York, be and they are hereby constituted a Highway District, to be called the Sherburn Highway District, and that one Waywarden be elected for each of the said parishes and places so comprised in the said Highway District, and that Friday, the 18th day of November, 1892, be and it is hereby appointed the day on which the first election of Waywardens is to take place in the said district, and further that the first meeting of the Highway Board for the said district formed by this Order be held on the 2nd day of December 1892, at the School House at Ganton aforesaid, at six o'clock in the evening.
