THE Queen has been graciously pleased to signify Her intention to confer the decoration of the 1. Victoria Cross upon the undermentioned Soldier of Her Majesty's Army, whose claim has been submitted for Her Majesty's approval, for the conspicuous bravery displayed by him during the attack on the stockaded town of Toniataba, Gambia River, on the 18th March, 1892, as recorded against his name :-
