THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Despatch, from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia :-

Sofia, December 11, 1892.

All previously announced quarantine measures have been withdrawn, and the following are now in force :-

1. Travellers arriving by Orient Express undergo a medical examination at Tsaribrod, and, accompanied by a Doctor, may proceed to Moustapha Pasha, without getting out at any station in Bulgaria.

Note.—Travellers by the Orient Express bound fot Bulgaria must get out at Tsaribrod and undergo a medical observation of twenty-four hours.

2. Travellers arriving from Roumania undergo a medical examination without any quarantine.

3. Travellers arriving from Servia and Austria-Hungary by the Danube or by Tsaribrod undergo a medical observation of twenty-four hours.

4. Travellers arriving from Russian Ports of the Black Sea or from the Danube, undergo a quarantine of five days.

5. Travellers arriving from the Asiatic shore of Turkey, as far as and including Ordou, are subjected to eleven days' quarantine.

6. The baggage and clothes of travellers who are subjected either to quarantine or to a medical examination, are carefully disinfected.

7. Travellers and goods may only enter Bul-garia by Tsaribrod, Lom, Svischtow, Roustchuck, Varna, and Bourgas. Goods only may enter Bulgaria by all the other ports of the Danube. All the frontier of European Turkey remains open for goods and passengers.

8. Goods and parcels coming by post from Russia, Buda-Pesth, and contaminated places in Turkey in Asia will be delivered after a quarantine of twenty-four hours and disinfection.

9. Goods and parcels arriving by post from all places, with the exception of those mentioned in paragraph 8, are delivered without quarantine or disinfection.

10. The following articles coming from Austria-Hungary, Russia, and Turkey in Asia, are prohibited :

(a.) Used under-linen and bed-linen as articles of commerce.

(b.) Worn clothes, rags, and remains of all kinds of woven stuffs, patterns of old cloth, used sacks and old bits of paper.

(c.) Raw skins, furs, articles made up with fur (used or not used such as those worn by travellers)

(d.) Milk foods, such as milk, butter, cheese, fat, and cream (Kaimak).

(e.) All kinds of fruits, fresh or dried, with the exception of lemons, oranges, limes, and pomegranates.

(f.) Fish, fresh, salt, or smoked, with the exception of those preserved in hermetically closed boxes.

(g.) Meats, fresh, salted, or smoked, sausages, hams, or Bologna sausages.

(h.) Oil in skins.

(i.) Hair of cattle or horse (with the exception of stuffs made of dyed horsehair for sieves, &c., hair of pig or of camel in its raw state, down, and all kinds of feathers undyed.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 19th November, 1892, from Her Majesty's Representative at Panama, enclosing the following translation of a Decree relating to quarantine :-

Decree No. 97 of 1892 (de 15 de Novembre) upon the admission of ships in the Atlantic ports of this Department.

The Governor of the Department, having in view the Telegram of the Government received to-day, which says as follows :--- " Panama, 15---Bogota 14-11-92, Governor Panama. Decree opening ports .- Ships which sail ten days after cholera disappeared, and twenty days' voyage from respective port and visit authorized Governors. Adopt greatest precautions arrivals where epidemic was greatest .--- Vice President."

Decrees:

ART. I. The ships or steamers proceeding from French, Belgian, or German ports, which have sailed ten days after the cessation of cholera in their respective port of departure, and which employ not less than twenty days in the voyage, will be admitted in Colon and other Atlantic ports of this Department after visit by the health officer, it being well understood that, on their arrival, the cost of the disinfection which the health officer may consider necessary to observe towards those ports where the epidemic developed with force shall be borne by the said ships.

ART. 2. All dispositions contrary to this Decree which are found in those indicated by the numbers 87 and 96 of 1892 are hereby abolished.

No. 1882.

Any vessel arriving at any port in Cyprus,

except Larnaca, from Patras with passengers for Cyprus is to be medically inspected before being admitted to pratique, and in the event of there being any case, or suspected case, of small-pox on board, pratique will be refused, and the vessel is to be ordered to proceed to Larnaca, a note to that effect being 'made on the bill of health, and the Chief Medical Officer is to be at once informed by telegram.

All arrivals at Larnaca from Patras are to be carefully inspected before being admitted to pratique, and for further security all persons wishing to land are to be carefully visited on the end of the pier, in accordance with instructions issued by the Chief Medical Officer.

In the event of any person being found to be affected with small-pox, the said person, with his relations, friends, and servants accompanying him, if any, will be isolated in quarantine.

(PORT OF NEWHAVEN.-QUARANTINE STATION.) By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Con-tagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1892, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Newhaven as a foreign animals quarantine station (in this Order called the Quarantine Station):


All that shed known as the A shed, being the property of the London, Brighton, and South Coast Railway Company, at Newhaven, in the Eastern Division of the county of Sussex, and situate on the Railway Quay on the east side of the river Ouse, and including all that space lying between the said A Shed and river Ouse.

And do hereby prescribe as follows :

1. When landed the animals shall forthwith be placed in the said A Shed and shall be there kept until moved thereout in accordance with the regulations contained in Article 144 of the Animals Order of 1886.

2. When and so soon as an Inspector of the Board of Agriculture shall have certified in writing that all parts of the Quarantine Station with which the animals or their droppings have come in contact in their passage to the said A Shed have been cleansed and disinfected to his satisfaction, all parts of the space above defined, other than the said A Shed, shall cease to be included in the Quarantine Station, and thereupon, for the purposes of this Order, the said A Shed shall alone be deemed to be the Quarantine Station hereby defined,

In witness whereof the Board of Agriculture have hereunto set their Official Seal this seventeenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.
