GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Amending Regulations with respect to Remuneration of Vaccination Officer:—

Clun Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Clun
Union in the counties of Salon and Mont-

Union, in the counties of Salop and Montgomery:—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government

Board, by a General Order dated the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, made rules and regulations relating to the appointment of Vaccination Officers by Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the said Clun Union; and by Article 9 of that Order it was provided as follows: -

"The Guardians shall pay to any Vaccination "Officer such salary or remuneration, and " such only, as the Local Government Board " may direct or approve, whether for ordinary "duties or for occasional services; and such " salary or remuneration may be increased " or reduced as that Board may from time to " time direct or approve."

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Order as hereinafter mentioned, so far as regards the said Clun Union:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order that, with respect to the said Clun Union the above-cited Article shall be amended by the addition of the following proviso:-

Provided that the Guardians, with the approval of the Local Government Board, may pay to any Vaccination Officer a reasonable compensation on account of extraordinary services, or other unforeseen circumstances connected with his duties or the necessities of the said Union.

THE Board of Agriculture, acting under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1892, hereby authorize the Local Authority for the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, to put in operation Article 1 of the Swine-Fever Order of 1890, dated the fourteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, providing for the slaughter by Local Authorities of swine suspected of swine-fever, and the payment of compensation for the same.

This Authority shall cease to operate from and immediately after the seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, unless previously revoked by the Board of Agriculture.
