Circulaire aux offices Sanitaires.

Par décision du Conseil Supérieur de Santé, l'importation, dans l'Empire Ottoman, des peaux et autres débris d'animaux, est soumise aux dispositions suivantes.

1°. Les peaux tannées ou manufacturées sont admises en libre pratique, quelle que soit leur provenance et sans aucune formalité.

2°. Les peaux et autres débris d'animaux, non manufacturés, doivent toujours être accompagnés d'un certificat officiel signalant le lieu de leur origine, faute de quoi ils seront repoussés de tous

les ports ottomans. 3°. Les peaux sèches ou salées et autres débris d'animaux, provenant de pays indemnes d'épizootic, seront admis en libre pratique. Ceux, par contre, arrivant de pays où il existe des épizooties, seront soumis a la désinfection réglementaire dans un lazaret.

4°. Les peaux et autres débris d'animaux, provenant de pays où regne le choléra, la peste ou la fièvre jaune, seront repoussés de tous les ports de l'Empire.

5°. Seront également repoussés, quelle que soit leur provenance, les peaux et autres débris d'animaux en état de fermentation putride, constate par procès-verbal.

'THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1892, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :
