Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly voritten on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section twenty-six of "The Pluralities Act, 1838," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, "chapelries, and other places or districts may be " separated from the parishes or mother churches "to which they belong, with great advantage, "and places altogether extra-parochial may " in some instances with advantage be annexed "to parishes or districts to which "are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with " respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the "Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop "of any diocese shall represent to the said Arch-" bishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, " place or district within the diocese of such "Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, "as the case may be, may be advantageously " separated from any parish or mother church " and either be constituted a separate benefice by "itself or be united to any other parish to which " it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any " other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, " or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to " form a separate parish or benefice, or that any "extra-parochial place may with advantage be " annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, " or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesi-"astical purposes; and the said Archbishop or "Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the "scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) de-" scribing the mode in which it appears to "him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such "alteration in respect to ecclesiastical juris-"diction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, " and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, "may be made with justice to all parties in-"terested; and if the patron or patrons of the "benefice or benefices to be affected by such " alteration shall consent in writing under his or "their hands to such scheme, or to such modifi-" cation thereof as the said Archbishop may ap-" prove, and the said Archbishop shall, on full "consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with "any such scheme, or modification thereof, " and shall certify the same and such consent as "aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in "Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in "Council to make an Order for carrying such " scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may " be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend John Wogan,

Lord Bishop of Saint Albans, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, represented in a writing dated the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward White, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"To the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Father in God Edward White by Divine Providence Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan.

"I John Wogan by Divine Permission Bishop of Saint Albans do in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty cap. one hundred and six hereby represent to Your Grace that there is in the county of Essex and my diocese of Saint Albans the vicarage of Broomfield the parish whereof contains according to the Census of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one a population of eight hundred and ninety-eight.

"In the same county and diocese is the rectory of Chelmsford the principal part of the ecclesiastical parish whereof lies adjoining to the parish of Broomfield aforesaid the said parish contains according to the Census of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one a population of five

thousand five hundred and seventy-five.

"That a portion of the ecclesiastical parish of Chelmsford containing an area of one hundred and thirteen and a half acres or thereabouts lies detached from the parish of Chelmsford being surrounded on all sides by the parish of Broomfield and within the distance of three quarters of a mile from the church of that parish but at a distance of about one and three quarter miles from the parish church of Chelmsford.

"The said detached portion has already been amalgamated for civil purposes with the said

parish of Broomfield.

"That it appears to me that the said portion of the ecclesiastical parish of Chelmsford hereinbefore described may under the provisions of the said Act of the first and second Vic., cap. one hundred and six and of the Act of the second and third years of the same reign cap. forty-nine be advantageously separated from the said ecclesiastical parish of Chelmsford and united for ecclesiastical purposes to the said parish of Broomfield.

"That I the Bishop aforesaid am in right of my See of Saint Albans the patron of the vicarage of Broomfield and also of the rectory of Chelms-

ford aforesaid.

"That the Reverend William Trimmer is the present incumbent of the benefice of Broomfield and the Venerable Henry Frank Johnson is the present incumbent of the benefice of Chelmsford.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the first-mentioned Act of Parliament I the said Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the district of the parish of Chelmsford so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the parish of Broomfield and the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration hereinbefore proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction dues and payments may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the consents in writing of the said patron and incumbents respectively and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied therewith I request that Your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consents aforesaid by your report to Her Majesty in Council.

"Given under my hand this first day of November one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two. "J. W. Alban.

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop, and the consents referred to in the said representation, are as follows:—
"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate a district from the

ecclesiastical parish of Chelmsford and unite such district for ecclesiastical purposes to the parish of Broomfield.

"It is further proposed that such district shall consist of all that detached portion of the ecclesiastical parish of Chelmsford which is surrounded

on all sides by the parish of Broomfield.

"That such district shall accordingly consist of the lands coloured round with pink on the ordnance map of the parish of Broomfield and marked thereon 'Formerly Chelmsford Det. No. 1 amalgamated with Broomfield Ph. 1889' and numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24 and coloured round with pink on the plan hereto annexed which is an extract from the said ordnance map.

"That the incumbent of the benefice of Broomfield shall have the sole and exclusive cure of

souls within the said district.

"That the parishioners of such district shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the parish church of Chelmsford but shall be liable to the repairs of the parish church of Broomfield.

"That the fees for marriages churchings and burials and other ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments arising from the said district shall henceforth belong to the incumbent of the benefice of Broomfield aforesaid.

" CONSENTS.

"We John Wogan by Divine permission Lord Bishop of Saint Albans being the patron or person entitled in right of the see of Saint Albans to present to the benefices of Broomfield and Chelmsford in the county of Essex and diocese of Saint Albans in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend William Trimmer Clerk incumbent of the said benefice of Broomfield and the Venerable Henry Frank Johnson Clerk incumbent of the said benefice of Chelmsford do hereby respectively signify to Your Grace our several consents to the scheme above proposed for separating a district from the parish of Chelmsford and annexing the same to the parish of Broomfield.

"In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands this first day of September one thousand

eight hundred and ninety-two.

And whereas the said scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop

for his consideration:

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said scheme, hath certified the same and the consents aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council, by his report dated the twenty-third day of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, which said report is in the words and figures following:—

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty

in Council.

"We the undersigned Edward White Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend John Wogan Lord Bishop of Saint Albans has represented unto Us

(amongst other things)

"That there is in the county of Essex and his diocese of Saint Albans the parish and benefice or vicarage of Broomfield.

"That there is also in the said county and diocese the parish and benefice or rectory of

Chelmsford.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that part of the said parish of Chelmsford which lies detached and which is contiguous to and surrounded on all sides by the said parish of Broomfield may be advantageously separated from the said parish and mother church of Chelmsford and annexed to the said parish of Broomfield

for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in 'The Pluralities Act 1838' the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes tithe rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme with plan annexed together with the consents thereto in writing of the said Lord Bishop as patron and of the incumbents of the benefices to be affected have been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to Us for Our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord. Bishop and the consents before referred to

are hereunto annexed.

"And We the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said 'Pluralities Act 1838' certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

And whereas the Right Reverend John James Stewart, Lord Bishop of Worcester, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, represented in a writing dated the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward White, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"To the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward White Lord Archbishop of Canterbury.

"I, John James Stewart, Bishop of Worcester beg leave to represent to Your Grace that there is in the county of Warwick and diocese of Worcester the curacy of Wroxall the parish whereof comprises among other places a portion of land lying to the southward of and separated from the main part of the said parish bounded on the north-west and west by the parish of Rowington and on the east and south by the hamlet of Shrewley, which said portion of land contains about one hundred and fifty-five acres with a population of about five persons.

"That the said parish of Wroxall also comprises another portion of land known by the name of Shortwood containing forty-five acres or thereabouts lying at a considerable distance from the other parts of the said parish and wholly surrounded by the hamlet or township of Beausale in the parish of Hatton in the same county and

diocese.

"That the population of the parishes of Wroxall and Rowington and the hamlet of Beausale are respectively as follows viz. Wroxall, one hundred and sixty-seven, Rowington, eight hundred and fourteen and Beausale, two hundred and fifteen.

"That the said portion of land adjoining the parish of Rowington contains a population of five persons and has been constituted a part of that parish for civil purposes and that the said portion of land called Shortwood which does not contain any dwelling-houses has been constituted a part of the hamlet of Beausale for the like purposes.

"That the vicar of the parish of Rowington is

willing to undertake the spiritual cure of the inhabitants of the above-mentioned portion of land adjoining his parish.

"That the said portions of land belonging to the parish of Wroxall are not subject to tithes or other ecclesiastical dues or payments nor does it appear that the inhabitants thereof have any legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pew or sitting in the parish church of Wroxall.

"That it appears to me that the said portions of land may under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament one and two Victoria chapter one hundred and six and two and three Victoria chapter forty-nine be advantageously separated from the parish of Wroxall and be annexed to the said parish of Rowington and hamlet of Beausale respectively for ecclesiastical purposes so that the boundary of the parish of Wroxall would then be the same both for ecclesiastical

and civil purposes.

"That pursuant to the directions of the twenty-sixth section of the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament I have drawn up in writing a scheme appended to this representation describing the manner in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration may be made with justice to all parties interested, and I submit the same to Your Grace together with the consents in writing of the patrons and incumbents of the benefices of the said parishes to the intent that Your Grace may if you shall be satisfied with the said scheme, certify the same and such consents to Her Majesty in Council.

"Given under my hand this twenty-ninth day of January one thousand eight

hundred and ninety-two.

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop, and the consents referred to in the said representation, are as follows:—
"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate the portion of land hereafter described containing one hundred and fifty-five acres or thereabouts being part of the parish of Wroxall in the county of Warwick and diocese of Worcester from the said parish and to annex it to the parish of Rowington in the same county and diocese for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the vicar of Rowington shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the

said portion.

"That all ecclesiastical offices shall be performed for the inhabitants of the said portion of land in the church of the said parish of Rowington and that the fees for all such offices shall belong to the vicar of Rowington.

"The district or portion of land thus proposed to be transferred from the parish of Wroxall to

the parish of Rowington is as follows:

"All that part of the parish of Wroxall delineated and described on the accompanying plan and thereon coloured pink bounded on the north-west and west by the parish of Rowington and on the east and south by the hamlet of Shrewley.

"It is also proposed to separate the portion of land hereafter described containing forty-five acres or thereabouts being part of the parish of Wroxall aforesaid from the said parish and to annex it to the hamlet of Beausale in the parish of Hatton in the same county and diocese for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That the vicar of Hatton shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the said last-

mentioned portion.

"That all ecclesiastical offices shall be performed for the inhabitants (if any) of the said lastmentioned portion of land in the church of the said parish of Hatton and that the fees for all such offices shall belong to the vicar of Hatton.

"The district or portion of land thus proposed to be transferred from the parish of Wroxall to

the hamlet of Beausale is as follows:

"All that part of the parish of Wroxall delineated and described in the accompanying plan and thereon coloured green bounded on all sides by the hamlet of Beausale and being also delineated in the tithe map of the said hamlet and described thereon as Shortwood in the parish of " J. J. S. Worcester."

" CONSENTS.

" To the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward White Lord Archbishop of Canterbury.

" We James Broughton Dugdale the patron or person entitled to present to the curacy of Wrozall in case the same were now vacant John James Stewart, Bishop of Worcester, the patron or person entitled to present to the vicarage of Rowington in case the same were now vacant, Galton, the Venerable Archdeacon Darwin William Bree, John Thomas Arkwright, George Hesketh Biggs, Henry John Torre, Edwin Alfred Kempson, and Charles Albert Bragge on behalf of the trustees the patrons or persons in whom is vested the legal right to present to the perpetual curacy or vicarage of Hatton in case the same were now vacant such Clerk as should be nominated for that purpose by Edward Southwell Trafford and we, Henry George Willacy, Clerk, at present performing during the pleasure of the owner the duties of the cure of Wroxall, Peter Bellinger Brodie, Clerk, vicar of Rowington, and Henry Courtney Courtney, Clerk, vicar of Hatton, do hereby signify our consents to the scheme above proposed.

HEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial " of the dead in England beyond the limits of the "Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning " the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burialground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parish without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein with certain modifications.

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the twenty-sixth day of November last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the thirteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial ground shall be opened in the undermentioned parish without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials in the said parish shall be discon-

tinued, as follows, viz.:—

BERKHAMPSTED, SAINT MARY.—Forthwith and entirely in Northchurch Baptist Chapel, in the parish of Berkhampsted, Saint Mary, in the county of Herts, and also in the chapelyard within ten yards of any dwelling; and that in the rest of the chapelyard the following Regulations should be obeyed:—

1. No body shall be buried in any vault or walled grave unless the coffin be separately entombed in an airtight manner—that is, by properly cemented stone or brickwork which

shall never be disturbed.

2. No earthen grave shall be dug within

one foot of any other grave.

3. No coffin shall be buried in any unwalled grave within four feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years when it shall not be less than three feet below that level.
