### PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than ewo days previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

### By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

### PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those. Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Maje-ty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daugh ers-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who,

from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two. days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to. Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered at to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in. order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

# By the QUEEN. A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA R.

HEREAS by an Act passed in the thirtythird year of Our Reign, intituled "An Act to consolidate and amend the law relating to the Coinage and Her Majesty's Mint," it is amongst other things enacted:

That We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, shall from time to time by Proclamation

determine the design for any coin :

We have, therefore, thought fit to order that certain of the coins made at Our Mint, mentioned in the First Schedule to the aforesaid Act, of the weight and fineness specified in that Schedule,

shall bear designs as follows :--

That every Five Pound Piece should have for the obverse impression Our effigy, with the inscription "Victoria Dei Gra. Britt. Regina Fid. Def. Ind. Imp.", and for the reverse the image of Saint George armed, sitting on horse-back, attacking the Dragon with a sword, and a broken spear upon the ground, and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Two Pound Piece should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five Pound Piece, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Sovereign should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five Pound Piece, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Half Sovereign should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five Pound Piece, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Crown should have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five Pound Piece, and on the edge of the Piece in raised letters "Decus et Tutamen Anno Regni," the Year of the Reign being in Roman Numeral Letters; and that every Half-crown should have for the obverse impression the aforesaid Effigy, with the inscription "Victoria Dei Gra. Britt. Reg.", and for the reverse the Ensigns Armorial of the United Kingdom contained in a Shield surmounted by the Royal Crown and surrounded by the Collar of the Garter, with the inscription "Fid. Def. Ind. Imp." together with the words "Half-crown," and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Florin should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five Pound Piece, and for the reverse two Royal Sceptres in saltire behind three Shields, the Shield on the dexter, in bend, bearing the Arms of England, that on the sinister, in bend sinister, Scotland, and that in base Ireland; between them the three Emblems, the Rose, the Thistle, and the Shamrock, each shield surmounted by the Royal Crown, the Garter, bearing the motto "Honi soit qui mal y pense," underlying the whole, and the words "One Florin. Two shillings," and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Shilling should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five Pound Piece, and for the reverse three Shields, that on the dexter bearing the Arms of England, that on the sinister Scotland, and that in base Ireland,

each surmounted by the Royal Crown; between them the three Emblems, the Rose, the Thistle, and the Shamrock, the Garter, bearing the motto "Honi soit qui mal y pense," underlying the whole, and the words "One Shilling," and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge; and that every Sixpence should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five Pound Piece, and for the reverse the words "Six Pence" placed in the centre of the piece, having an Olive Branch on one side and an Oak Branch on the other, surmounted by the Royal Crown, and the date of the year between and below the branches, with a graining upon the edge; and that certain other pieces of silver money, called "The Queen's Maundy Monies," of Fourpence, Threepence, Twopence and One Penny, should have the same obverse impression and inscription in all respects as the Five Pound Piece, and for the reverse the respective figures "4," "3," "2," "1" (according to the denomination or value of the piece) in the centre, with the date of the year placed across the figure, and encircled by an Oak Wreath surmounted by the Royal Crown, with a plain edge:

And whereas pieces of money of the above descriptions respectively have been coined at Our Mint, and will be coined there and, so far as relates to gold coins, at Our Branch Mints, in pursuance of Orders which We have given for that purpose, We have, therefore, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby ordain, declare, and command that the said pieces of money respectively so coined, and to be coined as aforesaid shall be current and lawful money of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and that this Our Royal Proclamation shall come into operation in the United Kingdom from the date on which it is published in the London Gazette, and in the Colonies of New South Wales and Victoria from the date on which it is published by the Governors of those Colonies respectively.

January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and in the fifty-sixth year of Our reign.

South Shields Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the South Shields Union, in the County Borough of South Shields and the County of Durham To the Churchwardens and Overscers of the Poor of the several Parishes and to the Overseers of the Poor of the several Townships comprised in the said Union ;-And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by an Order dated the 22nd day of January, 1857, the Poor Law Board empowered the Guardians of the Poor of the said South Shields Union to form Committees of themselves and from time to time to assign to any such Committee the whole or part of the District of any of the Relieving Officers of the said Union in order that such Committee might hear and determine all applications for relief on account of poor persons residing or being in the District or part of a District so assigned to such Committee, and might give all directions respecting the continuance of relief to poor persons belonging to such District or part of a District, in such manner as the said Guardians, acting as a Board, were or might be authorized to do;

And whereas by a General Order dated the 5th day of September, 1877, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said South Shields Union, among others, We, the Local Government Board, empowered the said Guardians to authorize the said Relief Committees to deal with all applications for payment of School Fees on account of parent, not being papers, residing or being in the Districts or parts of Districts which might have been assigned to such Com-

mitlees :

And whereas it is expedient that other provision should be made for the appointment of Committees for the purpose of hearing and determining applications for relief by paupers belonging to the said Union, and of dealing with the applications made by parents, not being paupers, for payment of School Fees, whether such last-mentioned applications are made directly to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union or through an Inquiry Officer:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We do hereby rescind the above-cited Order dated the twenty-second day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, and the abovecited General Order in so far as it relates to the said South Shields Union, and We Order that the following regulations shall be substituted in lieu

thereof; that is to say,

ARTICLE I .- The Guardians of the Poor of the said Union may at any ordinary meeting appoint one or more Committee or Committees, hereinalter termed the Relief Committee or Relief Committees, each consisting of not less than Three Guardians, and may from time to time a sign to any such Relief Committee, the whole or part of the District of any of the R lieving Officers of the said Union.

ARTICLE II. - Every Relief Committee shall meet at the same place as is appointed for the Meetings of the Guardians, or at such other place as the Guardians may, with Our approval, appoint,

and at such times as the Guardians shall appoint.

ARTICLE III.—Every Relief Committee shall at every Meeting appoint one of themselves to preside as Chairman at that Meeting, and shall cause Minutes of their proceedings to be kept in a Book to be provided for that purpose by the

Guardians at each of their ordinary meetings.

ARTICLE IV.—Any Relief Committee so appointed may hear and determine all applications for relief on account of poor persons residing or heing in the District or part of the District which may have been so assigned to them, and may give all directions respecting the continuance of relief to poor persons belonging to such District or part of the District, in such manner as the Guardians of the Union, acting as a Board, are now or may hereafter be authorized to do; but an order for relief given by any such Committee shall not be valid unless a majority of the Members of the Committee then present concur in such relief, nor unless three Members, at least, be present when such order is made.

ARTICLE V .- The Guardians of the Union may, if they think fit to do so, authorize any Relief Committee appointed as aforesaid to deal with all applications for payment of School Fees on account of parents, not being paupers, resident or being in the District or part of the District which may have been assigned to such Committee; and such Committee shall thereupon hear and determine all such applications and give all direct one respecting the continuance of the payment of the Fees in such manner as the Guardians. acting as a Board, are now or may hereafter Le authorized: to do.

ARTICLE VI. - Nothing contained in this Order shall at any time prevent the Guard ans, acting as a Board, from rescinding or altering any order of a Relief Committee in regard to relief not previously administered or to School Fees not previously paid, or from considering and deciding on any application for relief from any poor person or any application for payment; of S hool Fees on account of any parent as aforesaid, or from determining on the continuance or cessation of any weekly or other allowance of relief which shall not have been actually given or any weekly or other Fee which shall not have been actually

ARTICLE VII.-Every Relieving Officer or. Inquiry Officer, as the case may be, whose District or any part thereof is assigned to a Rehef Committee shall submit to the Committee at every Meeting.

In the case of an application for relief, the Application and Report Book, which he is required to keep by the General Order of the Poor Law. Board dated the 14th day of January, 1807;

And with respect to every such application, either for Relief or for payment of School Fees, a note of the decision or direction of the Committee thereon, whether the application le made directly to the Committee or through the Relieving Officer or Inquiry Officer, shall be inserted at the Meeting of the Committee in the proper columns of the Application and Report Book or the School Fees Application and Report Book, as the case may be, and anthen:icated in t'e proper column by the initials of one of the Members of the Committee or of the Clerk to the Board of Guardians.

2. That there is now standing to his credit in the books of this office, as the residue of his property, the amount set opposite his name in the same table, which amount comprises the sum received as the surplus of his property, and all arrears of pay, batta, grants, and other allowances whatever.

3. That any claim against the said residue, or any application respecting the same, is to be made to the Secretary of State by letter, addressed to the Under Secretary of State at this Office.
