**T**HIS day the Archbishop of Canterbury, accompanied by certain of the Bishops and Clergy of the Province, waited upon Her Majesty to present the following Address :—

To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty.

*May it please Your Majesty,*

WE, Your Majesty's most faithful subjects, the Archbishop and Bishops and Clergy of the Province of Canterbury in Convocation assembled, humbly approach Your Majesty with the expression of our loyal and devoted attachment to Your Majesty's Throne and Person.

We rejoice that it has pleased Almighty God to keep Your Majesty in continued health and strength, and we pray that Our Heavenly Father may long preserve Your Majesty to reign over a loyal and united People.

At a time when the depreciation of agricultural values upon the one hand and the massing of population in the great towns of England upon the other, result in widespread anxiety and distress among large classes of the community both in town and country, it is a satisfaction to us to know how keen is the interest taken by Your Majesty in all measures for the relief and prevention of such distress, and we note with profound thankfulness that the thoughtful and kindly care which Your Majesty has been pleased to give to all such questions is shared by other members of Your Majesty's Royal House.

We welcome the announcement that His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, who in 1884 and 1885 was a member of Your Majesty's Commission on the Dwellings of the Poor, is now again serving the country as one of Your Majesty's Commissioners appointed to consider "whether any alterations in the system of poor law relief are desirable in the case of persons whose destitution is occasioned by incapacity for work resulting from old age, or whether assistance could otherwise be afforded in those cases." With such questions the Clergy of the Church of England, are, from the very nature of their daily work among the homes of the poor, specially conversant, and it can hardly be necessary for us to assure Your Majesty of our anxious desire to promote by our deliberations, and by such action as may follow therefrom, all efforts which may conduce to the social and moral well-being of the working classes of this country.

The same economic causes to which we have

referred have also seriously affected the incomes of a very large proportion of the Clergy. We are now anxiously considering measures for remedying the impoverishment of those benefices which have suffered most severely, and in this we feel sure that we shall have the ready sympathy of Your Majesty and of Your Majesty's people.

We view with grave anxiety as affecting the well-being of the whole Church of England, the indication of an attempt to begin an assault upon the integrity of this Province, and to prepare to sever therefrom four ancient Bishoprics, which from an early period of our national history have been part of this Church of England, and have been represented for ages in this Convocation of Canterbury. By any such act of severance we are persuaded that the interests of true religion would grievously suffer, and the steadily advancing work of the whole Church of England be seriously impeded.

We further deprecate any interference with the endowments provided for the maintenance of a Christian ministry in Scotland, and guaranteed by the Act of Union with this country.

We are confident that even since the time when we had the honour of addressing Your Majesty at the opening of the last Convocation continued advance has been made by the Church of England, both in directly spiritual efforts and in the work of moral and social improvement of the people.

In material work which can be more easily measured, such as the building and restoration of Churches, the building and maintenance of Schools and Training Colleges, we are fully justified in stating that the voluntary expenditure in these two departments only has amounted to not less than two millions a year for the last twenty years.

We are persuaded also that by the blessing of Almighty God the Church of England has been enabled to render lasting services to Your Majesty's subjects throughout the world, and especially by missionary zeal and devotion to bear spiritual blessings to remote lands now happily under Your Majesty's protection, and to aid the noble efforts against the slave trade which have so largely characterised Your Majesty's long and beneficent reign.

We pray that the blessing of Our Heavenly Father may rest upon Your Majesty, and upon every member of Your Royal House.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 15th February, 1893, from Her Majesty's Representative at Vienna, enclosing the following Quarantine Circular issued by the Austro-Hungarian Marine Board:—

(Translation.)

“Circular No. 1545 of the Imperial Royal Marine Board to all the Imperial Royal Officers and Subordinate Port and Sanitary Officers.

“By Order of the High Imperial Royal Minister of Commerce issued by Telegram, No. 7991, of February, the 10th, 1893.

“The quarantine observation of seven days, ordered by Government Circulars of August the 30th, 3rd, 13th, and 19th of September last, Nos. 8022, 8206, 8646, and 8887, for arrivals from ports in the north of France and from the ports of Belgium and the Netherlands, as also from the German ports of the North Sea and of the Baltic, is substituted by a strict medical visit, leaving therefore unaltered the quarantine observation of seven days for arrivals from the mouths of the Elbe, ordered by Government Circular No. 7997 of August the 29th last.

“These measures will be carried out provided the vessels have had clean passages and arrive in normal condition; in all other cases the Marine Board, to whom exceptions may be promptly reported, will decide on what measures should be taken.

Instructions have been sent to the Colombian Consuls in case of the reappearance of cholera to exact from all vessels sailing for Colombian ports certificates from the competent local Sanitary Authorities, showing that both bottoms and cargoes have undergone a complete process of disinfection.

At the same time the Government have ordered modern disinfecting apparatuses to be used in Colon whenever it may be deemed necessary. Suspected vessels would also be subjected to a short quarantine of observation.
