Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levees, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly wraten on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these Presents authorize and appoint, you, the said Leonard Henry Courtney, Sir Thomas Henry Farrer, Robert Durning Holt, Henry Homewood Crawford, and Edward Orford Smith, to be Our Commissioners for the said purpose.

And for the better effecting the purpose of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission, and also to call for, have access to, and examine all such books, documents, registers, and records, as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means

whatsoever.

And We do further by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any three or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places in Our

United Kingdom as you may deem it expedient so to inspect, for the more effectual carrying out

of the purpose aforesaid.

And We do further by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matter herein submitted for your consideration.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, in the fifty-sixth year of Our Reign.

2. The following provisions of this Article shall be read in the place of Article 130 of the Animals Order of 1886, and shall be deemed to be Article 130 of that Order (namely):

Conditions of Landing.

130.-(1.) The landing of foreign animals at a Foreign Animals Wharf under the provisions of this Chapter is subject to the following conditions:

First. That the vessel in which they are imported has not, within twenty-eight days before taking them on board, had on board any animal exported or carried coastwise from a port or place in any of the countries mentioned in Part I of the Fourth Schedule, or from a port or place in Malta, or in Belgium, or in Germany, or in Denmark, or in the Netherlands, or in Norway, or in Sweden, or in Spain, or in Portugal, or in Morocco, or in Natal, or in Zululand, or in the Portuguese State of East Africa, or from any port or place from which the landing of animals is for the time being prohibited.

Second. That the vessel has not within twentyone days before taking them on board or at any time since taking on board the animals imported, entered any port or place in any of the countries mentioned in Part I of the Fourth Schedule, or any port or place in Malta, or in Belgium, or in Germany, or in Denmark, or in the Netherlands, or in Norway, or in Sweden, or in Spain, or in Portugal, or in Morocco, or in Natal, or in Zululand, or in the Portuguese State of East Africa, or any port or place from which the landing of animals is for the time being prohibited.

Third. That the animals imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with any animal exported or carried coastwise from any port or place in any of the countries mentioned in Part I of the Fourth Schedule, or from any port or place in Malta, or in Belgium, or in Germany, or in Denmark, or in the Netherlands, or in Norway, or in Sweden, or in Spain, or in Portugal, or in Morocco, or in Natal, or in Zululand, or in the Portuguese State of East Africa, or from any port or place from which the landing of animals is for the time being prohibited.

(2.) And the animals imported shall not be landed at a Foreign Animals Wharf unless and until the master of the vessel has on each occasion of importation of foreign animals therein delivered to the Commissioners of Customs or their proper officer, a declaration made and signed that all the animals then imported therein are properly imported according to the provisions of this Article.

Revocation.

3. The Order described in the Second Schedule to this Order, to the extent described in that Schedule, is hereby from and after the commencement of this Order revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the part of the said Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the part of the said Order hereby revoked before the commencement of this Order.

Interpretation.

4. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in the Animals Order of 1886.
