TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOMS.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Report from the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council dated the twenty-fourth February one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three in the words following viz.:

"Your Majesty having been pleased by Your Order in Council of the twenty-eighth June one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two to refer unto this Committee a humble Petition of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Rochdale in the County Palatine of Lancaster assembled in Council on the third December one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one setting forth that the Court of Record for the Hundred of Salford in the County Palatine of Lancaster is a Court of Local Jurisdiction within the meaning of section seven of 'The County Courts Act 1888' and has jurisdiction in all personal Actions where the claim or demand does not exceed the sum of fifty pounds and the cause of action arises within the Hundred of Salford in the said County: that the Municipal Borough of Rochdale is wholly situate within the Hundred of Salford aforesaid: that the practice and procedure of the said Court of Record is analogous to the practice and procedure of the Queen's Bench Division of the High Court of Justice and Solicitors have no right of audience in the said Court: that in accordance with the practice of the said Court of Record judgment for default of appearance to the writ issued in any Action commenced in the said Court can in eight days after the service thereof be entered against defendants and execution can be issued at once against a defendant's goods and chattels for the full amount of the plaintiff's claim in one sum and without regard to the defendant's ability to pay and discharge the amount of the judgment debt and costs: that great hardship is often suffered by defendants who are too poor to engage professional assistance or to undertake a journey to Manchester a distance of ten miles from the said borough of Rochdale where the offices of the said Court of Record are situate to conduct their defence in person and by reason thereof and from their ignorance of the practice of the Court the Petitioners have reason to believe that judgments are entered against defendants and executions issued thereon which would not be the case if they were able to appear and be heard: that a County Court where plaintiffs may sue is held at Rochdale and the Petitioners believe that in small cases where the claim or demand does not exceed the

sum of ten pounds and the County Court has jurisdiction therein justice would best be done by excluding the said Court of Record from having jurisdiction and the Petitioners humbly submit that the jurisdiction of the said Court of Record so limited as aforesaid should be excluded within the municipal borough of Rochdale and humbly praying that Your Majesty may be pleased to order in pursuance of section seven of 'The County Courts Act 1888' that the said Court of Record shall cease to have and exercise jurisdiction in all actions where the cause of action arises or the defendant resides within the municipal borough of Rochdale and over which the County Court of Lancashire holden at Rochdale has jurisdiction and where the claim or demand does not exceed the sum of ten pounds.

"And Your Majesty having been pleased by Your said Order in Council of the twenty-eighth June one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two to refer unto this Committee certain humble Petitions (1) of the Property Owners' and Ratepayers' Association in the Borough of Rochdale (2) of Tradesmen and other residents in the Borough of Rochdale (3) of the Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Manchester in opposition to the prayer of the said Petition of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Rochdale and (4) a Petition from James Simpson of the City of Manchester Head Bailiff of the Court of Record for the Hundred of Salford humbly praying that Your Majesty may be pleased not to interfere with the jurisdiction of the said Court of Record as proposed in the Petition of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Rochdale or that in the alternative Your Majesty may be pleased to order that compensation for loss of emoluments may be granted to him.

"The Lords of the Committee in obedience to Your Majesty's said Order of Reference have taken the said humble Petition and Counter-Petitions into consideration and having heard Counsel for the respective parties their Lordships do this day agree humbly to report to Your Majesty as their opinion that in the case of all Causes commenced after the date of Your Majesty's Order in Council made hereon whereof by reason of the cause of action arising or the dwelling of any defendant within the Municipal limits of the Borough of Rochdale the County Court of Lancashire holden at Rochdale hath cognizance and wherein the debt or damages sought to be recovered shall not exceed the sum of five pounds the jurisdiction of the Court of Record for the Hundred of Salford ought to be excluded."

Her Majesty having taken the said Report into consideration was pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to approve thereof and to order as it is hereby ordered that in the case of all Causes commenced after this date whereof by reason of the cause of action arising or the dwelling of any defendant within the municipal limits of the borough of Rochdale the County Court of Lancashire holden at Rochdale hath cognizance and wherein the debt or damages sought to be recovered shall not exceed the sum of five pounds the jurisdiction of the Court of Record for the Hundred of Salford be and the same is hereby excluded. Whereof all persons whom it may concern are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Le Département Royal des Affaires Etrangères a l'honneur de porter à la connaissance de la Légation Royale les dispositions suivantes d'un decret royal en date du 19 Mars, 1893.

1. La quarantaine de Turnu Severin pour les bâtiments venant d'Autriche-Hongrie par le Danube est remplacée par une visite sanitaire imposée à l'équipage des chalands et par la désinfection du linge sale de ce personnel et des cabines qu'il aura occupées.

2. Sont supprimées la visite médicale et la désinfection des effets sales à Verciorova, pour les voyageurs entrant en Roumanie par voie de terre.

3. La frontière roumaine, du côté de la Bucovine est fermée de nouveau depuis Mamornita inclusive-ment, jusqu'à Burdujeni excepté le point frontière de Mihaileni.

4. Est rétabli aux points de Burdujeni et de Mihaileni un service de visite sanitaire et de désinfection des effets sales, des voyageurs entrant en Roumanie.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 9th April, 1893, from Her Majesty's Representative at Stockholm, stating that the Swedish Government have declared all the harbours of Finland, from the Russian frontier to Nystad included, the Empire of Germany, and Russia in Europe, except ports on the Black Sea and Sea of Azov, to be free from cholera. Thus the Swedish Health Authorities consider the whole of Europe free from cholera, except the Russian coast of the Black Sea and Sea of Azov.

ORDER of the Local Government Board:
Cholera Regulations: Altering General Order:—
Port of Ipswich.

To the Ipswich Port Sanitary Authority;—

To the Officers of Customs of the Port of Ipswich;—

To the Medical Officer of Health of the Port Sanitary Authority aforesaid;—

To all Masters of Ships;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by an Order bearing date the 28th day of August, 1890 (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), in exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by Section 130 of The Public Health Act,

1875, and by Section 2 of The Public Health Act, 1889, made certain rules and regulations with a view to the treatment of persons affected with Cholera, and for preventing the spread of the disease;

And whereas by an Order dated the 21st day of May, 1892, which came into operation on the 18th day of July, 1892, We constituted permanently the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Ipswich the Port Sanitary Authority for the part of the Port of Ipswich described therein;

And whereas by a further Order dated the 6th day of September, 1892, We made additional Regulations for the prevention of the spread of Cholera;

And whereas it is expedient that, so far as regards the said Port of Ipswich, the Regulations and the last-cited Order should be altered as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred on Us by the above-mentioned Sections, and of every other power enabling Us in this behalf, We hereby alter the Regulations and the said Order dated the sixth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, so as to provide, with regard to the said Port of Ipswich, and to vessels bound to that port, as follows; namely,—

- (1.) The said Ipswich Port Sanitary Authority shall forthwith appoint a Deputy Medical Officer of Health, who shall be a duly qualified Medical Practitioner resident at Harwich, in the County of Essex, to perform the duties assigned to him by this Order.

Such officer shall observe and execute the rules and regulations of the Local Government Board in force for the time being so far as they may be applicable to his office, and any instructions of the said Board, and the lawful orders and directions of the Port Sanitary Authority; and Section 189 of The Public Health Act, 1875, shall apply to the appointment of such officer.

- (2.) The officer of Customs detaining, under the provisions of Article 2 of the Regulations, any ship bound to the Port of Ipswich, and ascertained by him to be infected with Cholera, or which he may have reason to suspect of being so infected, shall forthwith give notice thereof, and of the cause of such detention, to the said Deputy Medical Officer of Health, as well as to the Sanitary Authority of the Port of Ipswich, as provided by Article 4 of the Regulations.
- (3.) On notice being given to him as aforesaid, the said Deputy Medical Officer of Health shall visit and examine the ship mentioned in such notice, and if he shall be of opinion that it is infected, shall perform the duties which, by Article 9 of the Regulations, and by Articles II and III of the said Order, dated the 6th day of September, 1892, are to be performed by the Medical Officer of Health as regards vessels bound to the Port of Ipswich.
- (4.) The said Deputy Medical Officer of Health, after giving the Certificate prescribed by Article 9 of the Regulations in the case of an infected ship, or by Article II of the said Order, shall, by the speediest method available, inform the Medical Officer of Health of the Port of Ipswich of the case, and shall then remain on board such ship until she has been moored or anchored in pursuance of Article 10 of the Regulations, and until the arrival of the Medical Officer of Health.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Maintenance of Lunatics in Workhouse under Section 26 (1) of the Lunacy Act, 1890:—

Rochdale Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Rochdale Union, in the County Borough of Rochdale and the County of Lancaster;—

To the Lancashire Asylums Board;—

To the Visiting Committee of the Lunatic Asylum belonging to the said Asylums Board, situate at Prestwich;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 26 of the Lunacy Act, 1890, it is enacted that—

“The visitors of any asylum may, with the consent of the Local Government Board and the Commissioners, and subject to such regulations as they respectively prescribe, make arrangements with the guardians of any union for the reception into the workhouse of any chronic lunatics, not being dangerous, who are in the asylum and have been selected and certified by the manager of the asylum as proper to be removed to the workhouse”;

And whereas the Visiting Committee of the County Lunatic Asylum situate at Prestwich, in the said County of Lancaster, propose, with the consent of the Local Government Board and of the Commissioners in Lunacy, to make arrangements with the Guardians of the Poor of the said Rochdale Union for the reception into their Workhouse, situate at Dearnley, in the said County, of a certain number of chronic lunatics, not being dangerous, who are now, or may hereafter be, inmates of the said Asylum, and who have been, or may hereafter be, selected and certified by the Manager of the said Asylum as proper to be removed to the said Workhouse;

And whereas the Commissioners in Lunacy have prescribed Regulations in accordance with the above-cited enactment with regard to the reception and treatment in the said Workhouse of chronic lunatics as aforesaid from the said Asylum not exceeding forty in number of each sex;

And whereas by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Rochdale Union, amongst others, the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Regulations for the government of the Workhouse of that Union, and by another General Order dated the 14th day of January, 1867, the Poor Law Board prescribed the mode of keeping the Accounts relating to such Workhouse;

And whereas it is expedient that We, the Local Government Board, should prescribe further Regulations in connection with the reception into the said Workhouse of chronic lunatics, hereinafter termed “patients,” from the said County Lunatic Asylum:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us

by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—No patient shall be admitted to the said Workhouse either upon his first or any subsequent admission without a written or printed Order signed by the Medical Officer or Manager of the said Asylum. Such written or printed Order shall be according to the Form in the Schedule to this Order.

ARTICLE II.—The patients shall be classified in such manner as the Guardians, with the advice of the Workhouse Medical Officer, shall direct. To each sex shall be assigned its proper wards and yards, and each class of patients shall remain therein without communication with those of the other sex.

ARTICLE III.—The Guardians, acting under the advice of the Workhouse Medical Officer, may cause any patient to be returned to the said Asylum when they shall consider that it is expedient that he should not continue in the said Workhouse.

ARTICLE IV.—The Workhouse Master shall give to the Manager or Medical Superintendent of the said Asylum not less than forty-eight

hours' notice of the proposed return of any patient to the said Asylum as aforesaid.

ARTICLE V.—The Master of the Workhouse shall keep a separate Admission and Discharge Book with respect to the patients received into the said Workhouse from the said Asylum.

ARTICLE VI.—The Guardians shall cause Accounts to be opened and entries to be made, in such form as We may approve, in their Books of Account and in the Financial Statements to be submitted to the District Auditor, so that the costs and expenses incurred in respect of the maintenance and care of the said patients may be distinguished from the expenses of a like sort in regard to the other inmates of the said Workhouse.

ARTICLE VII.—Subject to the foregoing regulations and the regulations of the Commissioners in Lunacy above referred to, every patient received into the said Workhouse shall be amenable to the Regulations in force respecting the government of the said Workhouse.

ARTICLE VIII.—Expressions in this Order shall have the same meaning as in the Lunacy Act, 1890.
