TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOMS.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are the present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than *two days* previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be *very distinctly written* on the presentation cards to be delivered

to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

BRITISH CLAIMS AGAINST MEXICO.

THE Earl of Rosebery, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received a Despatch from Sir Spenser St. John, K.C.M.G., Her Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at Mexico, dated March 8, 1893, stating that the Public Debt Department of the Mexican Government has consented to pay, wholly or partially, the following claims on account of Extra "Consumo Duty" or tax on goods imported into the City of Mexico during the year 1839:—

CANADA AND THE UNITED KINGDOM. TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Repeal.

1. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation the Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, dated the 1st day of March, 1892, and relating to the transmission of Parcels between the United Kingdom and Canada, shall be repealed, revoked, and annulled.

Definition.

2. In this Warrant—

(1.) The expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet which is posted as a Parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same.

(2.) The expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

Places between which Parcels may be transmitted.

3. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation, Parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by post, between the United Kingdom and Canada, and between Canada and places via the United Kingdom.

Rates of Postage.

4. On all Parcels transmitted by post under this Warrant between Canada and the United Kingdom there shall be charged and paid the rates of postage respectively specified in Part I of the Schedule hereto.

5. On all Parcels transmitted by post under this Warrant from Canada to any place mentioned or referred to in Part II of the said Schedule there shall be charged and paid the rates of postage therein respectively specified or referred to; but such last-mentioned rates shall not apply in any case where a special fixed rate of postage is authorized by law in respect of a Parcel so transmitted.

Maximum Dimensions and Weight.

6. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General, there shall not be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by post under this Warrant any Parcel the dimensions of which shall exceed in length two feet, or in width or depth one foot, or which shall exceed in weight eleven pounds.

Prepayment.

7. The postage chargeable as hereinbefore mentioned, shall, in all cases (except as otherwise provided in this Warrant), be prepaid at the time of posting; and such prepayment shall, in the United Kingdom, be effected by means of adhesive

postage stamps, or at such Post Offices, within such hours, and under and subject to such regulations as the Postmaster-General shall from time to time prescribe, in money.

Times of Posting.

8. Parcels intended to be transmitted by post, may, in the United Kingdom, be posted on any day of the week except Sunday, but shall not be posted on Sundays, or in England or Ireland on Christmas Day or Good Friday, and in Scotland on either of the two Sacramental Fast Days, except in the cases next hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

Where the delivery of Parcels on Sundays, or any of the other days aforesaid, at certain Post Offices, to addressees calling for the same, may hereafter be specially authorized by the Postmaster-General, the posting of Parcels on Sundays, or such other days as aforesaid, at such offices respectively, shall also be permitted within such times and in such manner as may be directed by the Postmaster-General.

Mode of Posting.

9. Except as otherwise provided in this Warrant, all Parcels shall, in the United Kingdom, be posted by being handed in at a Post Office in the manner hereinafter provided, within the hours during which such office shall be open to the public for the posting of Parcels.

Posting at Post Offices.

10. The following provisions shall apply to the posting of Parcels at any Post Office in the United Kingdom, that is to say:—

- (1.) It shall be the duty of a person bringing a Parcel to hand it to an officer on duty at the counter in such office.
- (2.) Such Parcel must be accompanied by or have affixed to it a declaration of such kind, and stating the contents of the Parcel in such manner and form and with such other particulars as the Commissioners of Customs and the Postmaster-General may prescribe.
- (3.) Such Parcel shall be measured and weighed by such officer, and (if such Parcel do not exceed the limits of measurement or weight hereinbefore mentioned), the postage thereof, according to the rates specified in Part I of the said Schedule shall, subject as hereinbefore mentioned, be prepaid as hereinbefore provided, and shall be verified by such officer, and no such Parcel shall be forwarded by the post without the beforementioned requirements being complied with; and if any such Parcel shall be left at a Post Office without such requirements being complied with, such Parcel shall be detained, and may be returned or given up to the sender thereof, or otherwise dealt with or disposed of in any manner authorized by this Warrant.

Collection of Parcels.

11. The Postmaster-General may, if he thinks fit, from time to time authorize such officers as he may direct to receive Parcels for the post under such regulations and conditions as he may from time to time prescribe.

Irregular Posting of Parcels.

12. Any Packet transmissible by Parcel Post from the United Kingdom which from any words or marks thereon, or other external evidence, appears to have been intended for transmission as a Parcel, but which has not been tendered for transmission as a Parcel, but has been posted

in a Post Office Letter-box, or otherwise than according to the manner hereinbefore prescribed for the posting of Parcels, may, in the discretion of the Postmaster-General, either be detained or returned or given up to the sender, or if the said Packet is fully prepaid with the letter or book rate of postage, and otherwise conforms to the regulations as to the letter or book post, the same may be forwarded as a letter or book-packet (as the case may be).

Return and Disposal of Undelivered Parcels.

13. With regard to—

- (a.) Parcels which are addressed to a Post Office in the United Kingdom to be called for, or to a place in the United Kingdom beyond the limits of the free postal delivery of any town or district, or to a ship at any port in the United Kingdom, and which are not called for or delivered within such reasonable times as the Postmaster-General may from time to time prescribe; and
- (b.) Parcels which cannot be delivered in the United Kingdom for want of a true direction, or by reason that the addressee is dead, or cannot be found, or has refused the same, or has refused to pay any charges thereon, or for any other sufficient reason;

the following provisions shall (subject to the provisions of the Warrant of the said Commissioners of the 12th day of December, 1888, relating to Foreign and Colonial Parcels) apply (that is to say):

- (1.) The Parcel shall, as the Postmaster-General may from time to time direct, be retained at or forthwith forwarded to such place as the Postmaster-General may from time to time appoint, and may, if necessary, be there opened and examined.
- (2.) Where the name and address of the sender can be ascertained from the Parcel or the declaration accompanying the same, notice shall be given by post to the sender through the Post Office of Canada, that the Parcel will, in default of any claim on the part of the addressee, be given up to the sender or his agent upon personal application at such place as aforesaid, or at the request of the sender will be forwarded to a corrected address or returned to him by post in either case upon the conditions hereinafter mentioned.
- (3.) Where the name and address of the sender cannot be ascertained from the Parcel, notice shall be publicly given (by affixing the same at such place or places, or in such other manner as the Postmaster-General may direct), and notice shall also be given to the Post Office of Canada that the Parcel will, in default of any claim on the part of the addressee, and upon payment of such charges as are hereinafter mentioned, be given up upon the personal application of the sender or his agent, or be returned to the sender by post.
- (4.) In any case the notice shall state that in default of the receipt by the Postmaster-General of an application for the Parcel, during a period to be specified in such notice from some person who, in the Postmaster-General's judgment, is entitled to receive the Parcel, it will be disposed of in such a manner as the Postmaster-General may direct.
- (5.) The Postmaster-General may, in his discretion, specify in any such notice, or otherwise, the periods during which Parcels may be returned to the senders thereof, and in so

doing may have regard to the nature and contents of Parcels.

(6.) Where in the case of a Parcel which cannot be delivered for want of a true direction, the sender corrects the address of the Parcel, the Parcel shall be forwarded to the corrected address, subject to the following conditions:—

(a.) Where the corrected address of the Parcel is within the same free delivery as the original address, and the Parcel is not at the time of such correction lying at a Returned Letter Office, no new charge shall be made with respect to the delivery of the Parcel.

(b.) Where the corrected address of the Parcel is not within the same free delivery as the original address, or the Parcel at the time of such correction is lying at a Returned Letter Office, there shall be paid a new and distinct rate of postage equal in amount to the rate of postage which would have been chargeable on such Parcel as an Inland Parcel.

(7.) A Parcel shall not be given up or returned by post to the sender except upon payment by him of any charge for re-direction or other charge to which the Parcel has become liable under the provisions of this Warrant, or of any such Regulations as are referred to in section 14 of "The Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882."

(8.) Where the sender requests a Parcel to be returned to him by post, such Parcel shall not be returned to the sender except upon payment by him of a new and distinct rate of postage, according to the rate fixed by this Warrant, and in such case the said rate of postage and all other charges to which the Parcel has become liable, if not prepaid by the sender, shall be collected on the delivery of the Parcel to him.

(9.) The Postmaster-General may require proof to his satisfaction that an applicant for a Parcel is entitled to receive the same.

(10.) Where no application is made for a Parcel within the period specified in any such notice as aforesaid, or an applicant fails to prove to the satisfaction of the Postmaster-General that he is entitled to receive the Parcel, or refuses or fails to pay the charges to which the Parcel has become liable under this Warrant; the Parcel may be dealt with or disposed of in such manner as the Postmaster-General may in his discretion direct or authorize.

Re-direction to Places out of United Kingdom.

14. Any Parcel may be re-directed from its original address, or any substituted address, within the United Kingdom, to any country or place with which a Parcel Post to or from the United Kingdom or Canada is established, and in every case of such re-direction there shall be charged on such Parcel in respect of such re-direction a new and distinct rate of postage according to the rates for the time being payable in respect of the transmission of a like Parcel from the United Kingdom to the country or place to which it may be re-directed, and such postage, if not paid at the time of such re-direction, shall be collected on the delivery of the Parcel to the addressee.

Re-direction to Places within United Kingdom.

15. Any Parcel may be re-directed from its original address, or any substituted address,

within the United Kingdom to any other address within the United Kingdom, and in every case of such re-direction there shall be charged on such Parcel in respect of each such re-direction, and (if not previously paid) paid by the addressee thereof in money upon the delivery of such Parcel, a new and distinct rate of postage, equal in amount to the rate of postage which would have been originally chargeable on such Parcel as an Inland Parcel.

Remission of Re-direction Rates.

16. The Postmaster-General may wholly remit the rate of postage for re-direction on any Parcel addressed to the United Kingdom which may, on the request of the addressee thereof, be re-directed by an officer of the Post Office, and again forwarded by post to the same person at any address within the limits of the same free postal delivery as the address from which such Parcel was so re-directed.

Prohibitions.

17. There shall not be posted or conveyed or delivered by post any Parcel—

(1.) Consisting of or containing any indecent or obscene print, painting, photograph, lithograph, engraving, book or card, or any indecent or obscene article whether similar to the above or not; or

(2.) Having thereon or on the cover thereof any words, marks, or designs of an indecent, obscene, or grossly offensive character.

(3.) Containing any article or thing not authorized by the customs or other laws of the United Kingdom or Canada.

(4.) Consisting of or containing—

(a.) Any explosive substance.

(b.) Any dangerous substance.

(c.) Any filth.

(d.) Any noxious or deleterious substance.

(e.) Any sharp instrument not properly protected.

(f.) Except with the special permission of the Postmaster-General, any living creature.

(g.) Any article or thing whatsoever which is likely to injure other Parcels in course of conveyance, or any receptacle in which the same are conveyed, or an officer of the Post Office or other person who may deal with such Parcel.

Any such Parcel, if posted or tendered for conveyance by post, may be detained, and either returned or given up to the sender thereof or dealt with or disposed of in such other manner as may be authorized by the Postmaster-General.

18. There shall not be posted or conveyed or delivered by post any Parcel consisting of or containing two or more Parcels or other Postal Packets (of the same or of different descriptions) addressed to different persons at different addresses; and any such Parcel, if posted or tendered for conveyance by Post, may be detained and either returned or given up to the sender thereof or dealt with or disposed of as the Postmaster-General may authorize.

Non-compliance with Regulations.

19. In any case not in this Warrant expressly provided for, where any Parcel shall be posted or tendered for conveyance by post which in any respect infringes or fails to comply with the regulations in this Warrant contained, or any of them, such Parcel may, at the option of the Postmaster-General, either be dealt with as in this Warrant provided, with reference to Parcels which cannot be delivered, or be dealt with or disposed of in such manner as the Postmaster-General may in his discretion direct or authorize.

Provision for Safety of Parcels.

20. In any case where any officer of the Post Office may find it necessary or expedient for the safety or protection of Parcels that any Parcel should be forwarded or delivered by some later despatch or delivery than that for which the same was posted or despatched, or intended to be posted or despatched respectively, he may delay the despatch or delivery of such Parcel, or make such other and special arrangements as to the despatch or delivery thereof, not, however, involving a greater delay than 24 hours in the whole, as may be deemed by such officer necessary or expedient in the circumstances of the case.

Parcels not to interfere with Letter Post.

21. Where the despatch or delivery from a Post Office in the United Kingdom of letters would be delayed by the despatch or delivery therefrom at the same time of Parcels, such Parcels, or any of them, may be detained in the Post Office until the despatch or delivery next following that by which they would ordinarily be despatched or delivered.

Postmaster-General not liable for Loss or Damage.

22. Nothing contained in or done under or in pursuance of this Warrant shall render the Postmaster-General liable, either personally or in his official capacity, to any action or other legal proceeding in respect or in consequence of any loss or damage of any Parcel, whether such loss or damage be occasioned by or arise from any act or neglect of any officer of the Post Office or any other person.

Customs Regulations.

23. Parcels intended to be transmitted by post under the provisions of this Warrant shall not be

posted, forwarded, conveyed, or delivered, except subject to such Regulations as are referred to in section 14 of "The Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882."

Remission of Postage.

24. The Postmaster-General may, in any case in which he may consider it just or reasonable so to do, remit any postage or any sum made payable under this Warrant.

Parcels sent via United Kingdom.

25. All Parcels transmitted by Post under this Warrant between Canada and places via the United Kingdom shall be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered under and subject to the provisions of this Warrant and the Warrants respectively relating to the Parcel Post between the United Kingdom and the place to which the Parcel shall be addressed, so far as such provisions are applicable.

Commencement of Warrant.

26. This Warrant shall come into operation on the thirteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

MILITARY TRAMWAYS ACT, 1887.

Shoeburyness Tramways.

ORDER made by the Board of Trade, authorizing Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department to construct and maintain tramways in the parish of South Shoebury, in the county of Essex.

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as "The Shoeburyness Military Tramways Order, 1893."

Interpretation of Terms.

2. The several words, terms, and expressions to which by the Acts in whole or in part incorporated with this Order meanings are assigned have in this Order the same respective meanings.

Provided that in this Order—

The terms "the tramways" and "the undertaking" mean respectively the tramways and works and the undertaking by this Order authorised; and shall include any extensions, alterations, or diversions thereof which may from time to time be made by the Secretary of State on lands belonging to him in the exercise of any powers for the time being vested in him;

The term "road" includes any highway, whether a carriageway or footway, or of any other description;

The term "lands" includes any estate, term, easement, right, or interest in, to, over, or affecting lands; and

The term "carriage" includes truck.

Incorporation of Acts.

3. The provisions of sections 6, 8, 9, and 12 of the Military Tramways Act, 1887, are hereby incorporated with and form part of this Order,

and also the following provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, so far as the same are applicable to and are not inconsistent with this Order, and are not expressly excepted therefrom: that is to say,

(a.) So far as regards the construction and maintenance of the tramways along or across any road, sections 26 to 33 (both inclusive) of the said Act.

(b.) So far as regards all of the tramways, sections 49, 50, and 59 to 62 (both inclusive) of the said Act.

For the purposes of such incorporation the terms "tramway duly authorized" and "tramway" in the said provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, shall be construed to mean the tramways and works by this Order authorized, and the term "Promoters" to mean the Secretary of State, and the term "road" to have the meaning assigned to it in this Order.

Save as aforesaid none of the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, shall be deemed to be incorporated with or to form part of this Order, nor apply to the tramways or undertaking by this Order authorized.

CONSTRUCTION OF TRAMWAYS.

Construction and maintenance of Tramways.

4. Subject to the provisions of this Order the Secretary of State may construct and maintain, in the line and according to the levels shown on the plans and sections deposited at the office of the Board of Trade for the purposes of this Order (hereinafter referred to respectively as "the deposited plans" and "the deposited sections"), the tramways hereinafter described, with all proper rails, points, chairs, plates, sleepers, turn-outs, crossings, junctions, passing-places, sidings, turn-tables, engine-houses, telegraphs, works, and conveniences connected therewith, or for the purposes thereof, and may work and use the same.

The tramways authorized by this Order are:—
A tramway 1 mile 2 furlongs in length, commencing at a point on the existing artillery ranges in the parish of South Shoebury where it forms a junction with a tramway now in existence there, and thence running for the most part first in a north-easterly direction to the camp field, which it crosses in an easterly direction, and then running in a south-easterly direction parallel to the London, Tilbury, and Southend Railway as far as the terminus of the said railway, and from thence running in a north-easterly direction to the new artillery ranges on Shoebury Common.

Mode of Formation of Tramways.

5. The tramways, or any part thereof, shall be constructed on such gauge not exceeding four feet eight a half inches, as the Secretary of State may think fit, and may be laid as single or double lines as the Secretary of State may from time to time think fit, and so far as relates to any portion thereof to be laid along or across any road as the Board of Trade may sanction by order in writing.

Provisions as to Tramways laid along or across any road.

6. The following provisions shall, in addition to the other provisions of this Order, and of any enactments incorporated therewith, apply with respect to such parts of the tramways as are by this Order authorized to be laid along or across any road, viz.:—

Rails of Tramways.

(1.) The rails of such tramways shall be such as the Board of Trade may approve, and the Board of Trade, upon the application of the road authority, may from time to time by order in writing require the Secretary of

State to adopt and apply such improvements in such tramways, including the rails thereof, as experience may from time to time suggest, having regard to the greater security of the public and advantage to the traffic over such road, and the Secretary of State shall with all reasonable despatch comply with any order made by the Board of Trade for the purpose of carrying out any such improvements.

Tramways to be kept on a level with surface of road.

(2.) All such tramways shall be laid and maintained in such manner that the uppermost surface of the rail shall be on a level with the surface of the road, and if any road authority hereafter alter the level of any road whereon any of such tramways is laid or authorized to be laid, the Secretary of State shall from time to time alter (or as the case may be) lay the rails so that the uppermost surface thereof shall be on a level with the surface of the road as altered.

Rails and Road to be kept in good Repair.

(3.) The Secretary of State shall at all times maintain and keep in good condition and repair to the satisfaction of the road authority, and so as not to be a danger or annoyance to traffic, the rails of which any of such tramways for the time being consist, and the substructure upon which the same rest:

Amendment of Sections 27, 28, and 30 of Tramways Act.

(4.) The provisions of sections 27 and 30 of the Tramways Act, 1870, with respect to penalties, and so much of section 28 of the said Act as authorizes the road authority in the event of the Promoters failing to comply with the provisions of the said section, themselves to do the works therein mentioned at the expense of the Promoters, shall not be incorporated with this Order, and the following provisions shall apply and have effect in lieu thereof, viz.:—

In any case in which it is represented in writing to the Board of Trade by the road authority of the district in which the tramways or any portion thereof are or is situate, or by twenty inhabitant ratepayers of such district, that the Secretary of State has made any default in complying with any of the requirements of sections 27 or 28 of the Tramways Act, 1870, or with any of the requirements of the last preceding sub-section, the Board of Trade may, if they think fit, direct an inquiry as to the matters in dispute by an officer to be appointed by the said Board, and the said officer shall make a report in writing to the said Board, and if the Board of Trade certify that the default mentioned in the representation has been proved to their satisfaction, the Secretary of State shall make good such default in the manner and within the time specified in such certificate, and if he fail to do so the road authority may themselves at any time after seven days' notice to the Secretary of State make good such default in the manner so specified, and the expense incurred by the road authority in so doing shall be repaid to them by the Secretary of State out of any moneys to be provided by Parliament and applicable for that purpose.

Local Authority to have access to Sewers.

(5.) Every local authority shall at all times have free access to and communication with

all their sewers and drains, and power to lay lateral and private drains to communicate therewith without the consent or concurrence of the Secretary of State, and the provisions contained in sections 32 and 33 of the Tramways Act, 1870, shall be applicable in the case of any sewer or private drain of or under the control of the local authority as if the same were a pipe for the supply of gas or water.

MOTIVE POWER.

As to Motive Power.

7. The carriages used on the tramways may, subject to the provisions of this Order, be moved by animal power, and, with the consent of the Board of Trade, by steam power, electrical power, or any mechanical power, and the Board of Trade may give such consent by order in writing for such period or periods and subject to such terms and conditions as they may from time to time think fit.

Provided always, that no power other than animal power shall be used on the tramways within ten yards of any road unless and until there are made and in force regulations or bye-laws under section 8 of the Military Tramways Act, 1887, sufficient, in the opinion of the Board of Trade, for securing the purposes for which the same are authorized to be made, and that the exercise of the powers hereby conferred with respect to the use of any power other than animal power on the tramways shall be subject to all regulations or bye-laws for the time being in force made by the Secretary of State in accordance with the provisions of the said section and of this Order.

Publication of Regulations and Bye-laws.

8. Notice of the making of any regulations or bye-laws under the Military Tramways Act, 1887, shall be published by the Secretary of State in such manner as the Board of Trade may from time to time think fit.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Provisions as to Arbitration.

9. Where under the provisions of this Order any matter in difference is referred to the arbitration of any person nominated by the Board of Trade, the provisions of the Arbitration Act, 1889, shall apply to every such arbitration and the decision of the arbitrator shall be final and conclusive and binding on all parties, and the costs of and incidental to the arbitration and award shall, if either party so requires, be taxed and settled as between the parties by any one of the Taxing Masters of the High Court, and such fees may be taken in respect of the taxation as may be fixed in pursuance of the enactments relating to the fees to be demanded and taken in the offices of such masters; and all those enactments, including the enactments relating to the taking of fees by means of stamps, shall extend to the fees in respect of the said taxation.

As to Proof of Orders, Bye-laws, &c.

10. All Orders and Certificates made by the Board of Trade under the authority of this Order shall be signed by a Secretary or an Assistant Secretary of the Board of Trade, and when purporting to be so signed shall be deemed to have been duly made in accordance with the provisions of this Order, and all orders, certificates, regulations, and bye-laws, when duly made in accordance with the provisions of the Military Tramways Act, 1887, and this Order, shall be deemed to be orders and regulations within the meaning of the Documentary Evidence Act, 1868, and may be proved accordingly.

Penalty for Wilful Injury to Tramways or Engines, &c.

11. If any person without lawful excuse (the proof whereof shall lie on him) wilfully injures, obstructs, or trespasses on any of the tramways, or any engine or carriage used thereon, he shall for every such offence be liable (in addition to any proceedings by way of indictment or otherwise) to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

As to Recovery of Penalties.

12. All penalties incurred under this Order, or any enactment incorporated therewith, or under any bye-law or regulation made thereunder, may be recovered in manner provided by section 56 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

Rights of User only.

13. Notwithstanding anything in this Order the Secretary of State shall not acquire or be deemed to acquire any right other than that of user of any road along or across which any of the tramways are laid or authorized to be laid.

Saving of Existing Powers of Secretary of State.

14. Nothing in this Order or in any enactment incorporated therewith shall affect the right of the Secretary of State to exercise, with a view to carrying into effect all or any of the purposes of this Order, any powers of acquiring land or other powers vested in him by any Act passed previously to this Order.

Confirmation of Agreement between the London, Tilbury, and Southend Railway Company and the Secretary of State.

15. The agreement between the London, Tilbury, and Southend Railway Company and the Secretary of State, set forth in the Schedule to this Order annexed, shall be and the same is hereby confirmed and made binding upon the parties thereto, and the provisions contained in the said agreement shall be of the same force and effect as if they were set forth in this Order, and may and shall be carried into full effect by the said railway company and the Secretary of State respectively. And notwithstanding anything in this Order the Secretary of State shall not acquire any right over any land or property of the said railway company other than such rights as are conferred upon him by the said agreement.

For protection of the Postmaster-General.

16. In the event of the tramways being worked by electricity the following provisions shall have effect:—

- (1.) It shall not be lawful for the Secretary of State to lay down any line or rail or to do any act or work for working the tramways by electricity whereby any telegraphic line of the Postmaster-General is or may be injuriously affected; and before any such line or rail is laid down or any such act or work is done within ten yards of any part of a telegraphic line of the Postmaster-General (other than repairs or the laying of lines crossing the line of the Postmaster-General at right angles at the point of shortest distance, and so continuing for a distance of six feet on each side of such point), the Secretary of State or his agents, not more than twenty-eight nor less than fourteen days before commencing such work, shall give written notice to the Postmaster-General specifying the course of line or rail and the nature of the work, including the gauge of any wire, and the Secretary of State and his agents shall conform with such reasonable requirements (either general or special) as may from time to time be made

by the Postmaster-General for the purpose of preventing any telegraphic line of the Postmaster-General from being injuriously affected by the said act or work.

- (2.) Any difference which arises between the Postmaster-General and the Secretary of State or his agents with respect to any requirements so made shall be determined by the Board of Trade, whose decision shall be final, and sections thirty to thirty-two, both inclusive, of the Regulation of Railways Act, 1868, shall apply in like manner as if the Secretary of State or his agents were a company within the meaning of that Act.
- (3.) For the purposes of this section a telegraphic line of the Postmaster-General shall be deemed to be injuriously affected by an act or work if telegraphic communication by means of such line is, whether through induction or otherwise, in any manner affected by such act or work, or by any use made of such work.

SCHEDULE.

An Agreement made this eighth day of July one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one between the London Tilbury and Southend Railway Company (hereinafter called the Company) of the one part and Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department of the other part. Whereas the War Department in anticipation of this Agreement for the purpose of effecting communication between certain of their ranges at Shoeburyness in the county of Essex and for other purposes and with the permission of the Company have constructed a tramway passing through the yard of the Company's Shoeburyness Station in the course shown by the line A C D B in the plan hereto annexed. And whereas the Company are willing to grant to the War Department an easement in respect of the said tramway and to make a communication (if and when required) between the said tramway and their railway on the terms hereinafter appearing.

Now it is hereby agreed as follows:

1. The War Department having constructed the said tramway and fenced in the same, may during the continuance of this Agreement use the said tramway with a single line of rails in the course shown by the line A, C, D, B in the plan hereto, and during such period the War Department shall maintain and keep the same tramway in proper order and condition, and shall work the same so as to interfere as little as possible with the Company's traffic and business.

2. If and when the War Department shall by notice in writing so require, the Company will, at their own cost, with all convenient speed, construct for the exclusive use of the War Department, and the War Department shall thenceforth have the right to exclusively use free of charge accordingly in the course shown by the dotted red line drawn in the said plan, or in some equally convenient course, a siding leading from the Company's railway into the said tramway, and communicating therewith by proper points, which shall be under the control of the Company's station-master or other appointed officer, and from and after the completion of such siding to the satisfaction of the Commanding Royal Engineer for the time being of the District the same shall be maintained and kept in good repair by the Company, and the War Department will

from time to time on demand repay to the Company one half of the total amount of maintenance and repair thereof.

3. The Company will upon the request and at the cost of the Secretary of State for the time being of the War Department grant to him the right of occupation and user of the said tramway during the continuance of this Agreement. Subject nevertheless to the reservation to the Company of the annual rent of ten shillings.

4. The War Department having sunk a new well at Shoeburyness and having obtained therefrom a sufficient water supply will subject to the provisions of Clause 5 supply to the Company from such well and by means of such pipes and tanks as hereinafter mentioned for locomotive and other purposes including a supply to the cottages inhabited by the Company's servants and situate on their own premises at Shoeburyness not less than 8,500 gallons of water per diem as the Company shall from time to time require and at the price hereinafter mentioned.

5. Before giving any such daily supply as aforesaid the War Department shall be entitled to take and retain from the said new well for the purposes of the Troops and War Department establishment at Shoeburyness and of persons there in the employ of the War Department and generally for any military purpose there a supply per diem of 60,000 gallons of water and the War Department shall not under these presents be under any obligation to supply water to the Company as aforesaid save so far as the retention of such last-mentioned supply will permit or be under any obligation to enlarge or deepen the said well for the purpose of giving a supply under these presents.

6. The Company shall pay to the said Secretary of State for the time being for all water supplied to the Company as aforesaid the sum of one shilling per 1,000 gallons or such less sum as the Company and the said Secretary of State for the time being shall agree upon the sum payable under this clause to be paid quarterly on the twenty-fifth day of March the twenty-fourth day of June the twenty-ninth day of September and the twenty-fifth day of December in every year. Provided always that if the War Department shall at any time supply and sell by meter water from the said well to the inhabitants of Shoeburyness or any other persons for other than military purposes the Company shall be entitled to have their supply at the lowest rate (such rate being in no case more than one shilling per 1,000 gallons) for the time being charged to any such other consumers by meter.

7. For the purpose of such water supply to the Company as aforesaid the War Department shall, at their own cost, before the expiration of three calendar months from the date of this Agreement, lay down from the said well and thenceforth during the continuance of this Agreement maintain and keep in repair an iron pipe of not less than three inches internal diameter to some point on the boundary of the Company's Shoeburyness Station to be agreed upon between the said Commanding Royal Engineer for the time being and the Company's engineer, and the Company shall at their own costs, and within the same period; and in continuation of the pipe so laid down by the War Department lay down from that point, and thenceforth during the continuance of this Agreement maintain and keep in good repair an iron pipe of the same diameter to the tank next hereinafter mentioned, and also a proper stop-cock thereon for shutting off the water therein from the said tank.

8. For the purpose of such water supply to the Company as aforesaid, the Company shall also at their own cost, before the expiration of three calendar months from the date of this Agreement, erect and thenceforth during the continuance of this Agreement maintain at their said Shoeburyness Station a tank holding not less than 25,000 gallons, and the height of the top or upper edge, which shall not be more than thirty feet above the level of the station platform there and also at their own costs, within the same period fix and thenceforth during the continuance of this Agreement maintain and keep in good repair on their own ground on the pipe so to be laid down by them as aforesaid at the junction thereof with the pipe so to be laid down as aforesaid by the War Department a proper water meter for measuring the said supply and the War Department shall at all reasonable times have access to the meter for the purpose of checking the consumption of the water supplied.

9. The water for any day's supply as aforesaid to the Company may from time to time be turned on by the War Department at such hour as the Commanding Officer shall from time to time think fit.

10. The Company shall not during the continuance of this Agreement sell or supply from off their premises any water supplied to them as aforesaid or permit the user thereof except under the conditions of these presents.

11. The War Department shall not be under any liability to the Company in respect of any failure or stoppage or break down of the said water supply to the Company under this Agreement, whether through frost or accident or any other cause whatever, but if any such shall happen the War Department shall make every reasonable endeavour to reinstate the supply with as little delay as possible. Provided always that in the event of the War Department being unable at any time during the continuance of this Agreement, by reason of an insufficient supply of water from the new well to give to the Railway Company a daily supply of water as herein provided, the War Department shall so long as they are unable to give such sufficient supply from the new well to the Railway Company as aforesaid, furnish to the Railway Company water from the old well from which they have hitherto obtained their supply, but the War Department shall not be bound to furnish to the Railway Company water from the said old well unless the War Department shall have water for that purpose after all the requirements of the War Department shall have been met.

12. Either party, that is to say the Company on the one hand or the said Secretary of State for the time being on the other hand, may determine the provisions of this Agreement upon or at any time after the expiration of the term of fourteen years from the date of this Agreement by giving to the other six calendar months' previous notice, in writing, in that behalf, and in the event of and immediately upon such determination all the rights and liberties hereby conferred and imposed upon the said respective parties hereto shall absolutely cease and determine.

Lastly. The War Department shall as soon as may be make under the Military Tramways Act, 1887, an application to the Board of Trade for a Provisional Order under that Act confirming this Agreement the Company will consent to any such order, but if such Provisional Order shall not be made and also confirmed as in the said Act mentioned then and in any such case these presents shall be void.

(b.) The period of two years from the commencement of the Order within which mains throughout the streets named in the second schedule to the Order and in sub-section d below are to be laid, is to be extended to two years from the 14th day of April, 1893.

(c.) Annual accounts before being published are to be audited by such person as the Board of Trade shall appoint.

(d.) Bridge-street, Broad-street, Palace-street, and Guildhall-street are to be added to the second schedule of the Order.

(e.) On the sale of the Undertaking to the Corporation within 42 years the Corporation are to pay such sum as will produce by the income thereof, calculated at $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent., a perpetual annuity of 5 per cent. upon the sum properly expended by the Company upon the Undertaking, and chargeable to capital account, provided that if the option to purchase be exercised before 10 years from the date of transfer, the Corporation shall, in addition to the said capital sum, pay to the Canterbury Company a sum equal to the aggregate amount of 5 per cent. per annum from the date of transfer on the said capital expenditure, less the aggregate amount of dividends declared by the Canterbury Company from the date or dates of such expenditure to the date of the purchase.

(e1.) The Corporation may, after the expiration of twenty-one years from the date of transfer and before the expiration of thirty-one years, purchase upon paying the then value of the undertaking in accordance with section 2 of the Electric Lighting Act, 1888, in addition to a sum for the goodwill.

(f.) The Canterbury Company are before supplying energy to give notice to the Corporation of the method by which they propose to charge for energy supplied, and they are to be bound by such notice.

(g.) As long as the Canterbury Company perform their obligations the Corporation are

not to apply for or consent to the grant of a Provisional Order or licence to any person or company, but in case the Canterbury Company in the opinion of an arbitrator appointed by the Board of Trade have failed to perform their obligations, the Corporation, with the permission of the Board of Trade may require a re-transfer of the Order on such terms as to the arbitrator may seem just.

- (g.) The Canterbury Company without the consent of the Corporation is not to transfer the Order or take any steps to obtain the consent of the Board of Trade to such transfer.
- (h.) The Canterbury Company is not without like consent to place any electric light above ground, and it is to make due provision for the safety of the public from contact with mains and wires.
- (i.) The Canterbury Company is to obtain the previous approval of the Corporation to their works, sites for works, etc.
- (k.) The Canterbury Company may mortgage the Undertaking, but such mortgage shall not be a charge on the Undertaking in the event of the Undertaking being sold or transferred as aforesaid.
