His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the Rules hereto appended, framed by the Judges of the Supreme Court, under the provisions of "The Foreign Letters of Administration Act, 1888."

It is ordered.

392. Application to seal and sign letters of administration in terms of "The Foreign Letters of Administration Act, 1888," must be made in writing to the Master of the Supreme Court by the executor or administrator, or the duly authorized attorney of such executor or administrator.

393. A duly certified copy of the will, if any, of the deceased, an inventory of all property within this Colony known to belong to him, and a security bond for the value of such property shall be lodged before or with such application.

394. The bond shall be entered into by the executor (either personally or by his duly authorized attorney) and by two or more sureties to be approved of by the Master, and shall be substantially in the form following, to wit:—

*Security Bond.*

Know all Men by these Presents that I, A.B., of the Executive (or Administrator as the case may be), under Letters of Administration granted to me by on the and now about to be sealed and signed in this Colony under "The Foreign Letters of Administration Act, 1888," of the Estate of the late am held and firmly bound to the Master of the Supreme Court in the Sum of Pounds Sterling Money, to be paid on demand to the said Master or his Order, as a security for the due and faithful administration by me of the said Estate, for which payment well and truly to be made, I bind myself firmly by these Presents.

(Signature of Executor.)

And we, C.D., of and E.D., of do declare to have interposed and bound, as we do hereby interpose and bind ourselves as sureties in solidum and joint principal debtors to the said Master, or the lawful holder hereof, for the payment of the aforesaid sum of pounds sterling, under the express renunciation of the beneficia ordinis seu excussionis et divisionis, with the meaning and effect of which we acknowledge ourselves to be well acquainted.

Now the condition of this obligation is that if the said A.B. shall duly and faithfully administer the said estate and render a proper account of his administration, and shall also pay all duties,

stamps, and fees lawfully due to the Colonial Government in respect of such administration and account; then this obligation shall be void and of no effect; otherwise it shall be and remain in full force and effect.

395. The Master may require such evidence as he shall think necessary as to the domicile of the deceased at the time of death.

396. When letters of administration granted in any State have been signed and sealed by the Master he shall give notice thereof to the Court from which the grant issued.

397. When intimation has been received by the Master that letters of administration granted by him have been sealed and signed in any other State he shall notify any subsequent revocation of or any alteration in such letters to the Court which gave such intimation.
