- Gentlemen who propose to nttend Her Majesty's Levees, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will aninounce the name to His Royal Highness.


## Prebentations.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when; if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be preseuted officially 'shoild communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly woritten on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that
there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highuess.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at halfpast cne o'clock.

## PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Fxcellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh yenrs of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourth dar of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say :-
"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixtli and seventh years of Your Majestÿ, chapter thirty-soven have prepared and now humlity lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be takrn-out of the new parish of Saint Mark, Easton in the cuanty of Gloucester and in the diocese of Gloncester'and Bristol and out of the consolidated chapelry of Saint Matthew, Moorfields in the same eounty and diocese.
"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of : religion that those particular parts of the said new parish of Saint Mark Easton and of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Matthew Moorfields which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be
