

constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

“And whereas by an Order and scheme bearing date on or about the eleventh day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two and being under the common seal of the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales it is provided (inter alia) that the trustees of the charity known as ‘the Church Lands’ in the parish of All Saints in the city of Bristol shall so soon as a new parish or ecclesiastical district shall be formed out of the new parish of Saint Mark Easton pay out of the surplus income of the charity to the principal officiating minister for the time being of the new parish or ecclesiastical district so to be formed as aforesaid an annual sum of two hundred pounds in respect of his office and duties as such principal officiating minister.

“And whereas the said annual sum of two hundred pounds so to be provided and paid will on the constitution of the said proposed district be payable to the minister thereof and so soon as such district shall have become a new parish, then to the incumbent of such new parish and to his successors the ministers or incumbents of the said district or new parish for the time being.

“And whereas the said trustees have nominated to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners the Reverend Harry Wilson Boustead Clerk in Holy Orders, the present vicar of the said parish of All Saints in the city of Bristol and his successors vicars of the same parish for ever as the person to whom and to whose successors they the said trustees desire that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles John Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those parts of the said new parish of Saint Mark Easton and of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Matthew Moorfields which are described in the schedule hereunder written, and with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘The District of All Hallows Easton’ and be permanently endowed as hereinbefore specified.

“And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid) then of the said new parish, and of the nomination of the minister of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) of the incumbent of the said new parish shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said Henry Wilson Boustead the vicar of the said parish of All Saints in the city of Bristol

and by his successors vicars of the same parish for ever.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.”

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“The district of All Hallows, Easton, comprising:—

“I. All that part of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Mark Easton in the county of Gloucester and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol which is bounded upon the south by the hereinafter described part of the consolidated chapelry of Saint Matthew, Moorfields, in the said county and diocese, upon the south-west by the new parish of Saint Gabriel, Bristol, upon the north-west partly by the new parish of Saint Simon Bristol and partly by the new parish of Saint Werburgh (Bristol) all in the city and county of the city of Bristol and in the diocese aforesaid and upon the remaining side that is to say, upon the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Werburgh (Bristol) from the new parish of Saint Mark, Easton aforesaid at the centre of the bridge which carries the Bristol and South Wales Union Line of the Great Western Railway over Stapleton-road and extending thence generally southward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of thirty-four chains or thereabouts to its junction with the loop line of railway which connects the said Bristol and South Wales Union Line with the Bristol and Birmingham Branch Line of the Midland Railway and continuing thence still southward for a distance of four chains or thereabouts along the middle of the said loop line of railway to a point at the centre of the bridge which carries Easton-road over the same loop line of railway upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark Easton from the consolidated chapelry of Saint Matthew Moorfields aforesaid.

“II. And also all that contiguous part of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Matthew, Moorfields which is bounded upon the south-west by the new parish of Saint Lawrence Bristol, situate partly in the said city and county of the city of Bristol and partly in the said county of Gloucester and wholly in the diocese aforesaid, upon the north-west by the new parish of Saint Gabriel Bristol aforesaid, upon the north by the above described part of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Easton, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark, Easton from the consolidated chapelry of Saint Matthew Moorfields aforesaid, at the centre of the said bridge which carries Easton-road over the loop line of railway which connects the said Bristol and South Wales Union Line of the Great Western Railway with the Bristol and Birmingham Branch Line of the Midland Railway, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the same loop line of railway for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the wall or fence which forms the eastern boundary of the buildings and premises called or known as the Bristol Wagon Works at or near to the junction of the same loop line of railway with the said Bristol
