Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

MEDITERRANEAN.-BAY OF TUNIS.

Goletta - Harbour Lights.

INFORMATION has been received, through the Board of Trade, that on 28th May, 1893, the following alterations and additions would be made in the harbour lights at Goletta, Bay of Tunis :-

1. The light on the North pier head is a fixed white light, visible through an arc of 180°, or from the bcaring of N. 46° E., through west, to S. 46° W. It is elevated 40 feet above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance The illuminating apparatus is of 11 miles. dioptric, of the fourth order.

The light is shown from a white iron post, feet high. Approximate position, lat. 36° 48' 30" N., long. 10° 18' 35" E
