ON Thursday, the 6th July next, the Marriage of His Royal Highness The Duke of York with Her Serene Highness Princess Victoria Mary of Teck will take place at the Chapel Royal, St. James's Palace, in the presence of the Queen and Royal Family.

The Royal Family and Royal Guests will assemble at Buckingham Palace before eleven o'clock.

The following Processions will leave Buckingham Palace for St. James's, between cleven and twelve o'clock, by Constitution Hill, Piccadilly, St. James's-street, Marlborough Gate, for the Garden Entrance of St. James's Palace:—

Procession of Royal Family and Royal Guests, with Escort.

Procession of Bridegroom, with Escort. Procession of Bride, with Escort.

At about a quarter to twelve o'clock, The Queen's Procession, with Escort, will follow the same Route as far as St. James's Palace, where it will enter Ambassadors' Court.

The Processions will return by the same Route, which will be kept by Troops.

Guards of Honour will be mounted at St. James's Palace and Buckingham Palace.

After the Ceremony the Guests invited to St. James's Palace will go to Buckingham Pulace for the Wedding Breakfast.

The Bride and Bridegroom will leave Buckingham Palace in the afternoon for Liverpool-street Station, en route for Sandringham, via The Mall, Marlborough Gate, Pall Mall, the North side of Trafalgar-square, the Strand, Temple Bar, Fleetstreet, Ludgate-hill, St. Paul's, where the Procession will be met by the Lord Mayor and Sheriffs, Cheapside, Mansion House, King William-street, Gracechurch-street, to Liverpool-street Station, through Bishopsgate.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

Translation from the Madrid Gazette, 14th June, 1893.

Ministry of the Interior.—Royal Order. THE King (whom God preserve) in his name the Queen Regent of the Realm has been pleased to decree that—

Ist. The sanitary inspection of the French Frontier, decreed in the Royal Order of the 22nd of February last, shall be extended to all arrivals from that county, and for the efficacy of this measure, all provincial Governors are enjoined to vigorously enforce the provisions of the Royal Order of the 30th of August, 1892.

2nd. In conformity with the provisions in Rules 23 and 24 in the Royal Order of the 23rd of September, 1892, travellers from France, including Algeria, shall undergo a medical inspection laid down in the Royal Order of the 29th of August last, and merchandise from the same country shall be submitted to the treatment established in the Royal Order of the 25th of August of the same year.

3rd. It must be understood that the fruits and vegetables referred to in the said Royal Order of

the 25th of August are those which are grown as roots in the ground or which only rise slightly above its level, and all kinds of eatable, green plants and tubercles in the same state and with equal application.

The prohibition established in the Royal Order of the 22nd of February last, Rule 2, must be interpreted in this sense in the case of goods of

this description coming overland.

2. The driver of every car shall cause the same to be driven at a speed of not less than three miles an hour on the average, and not exceeding

eight miles an hour.

3. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow a preceding can at a

less distance than ten yards.

4. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 3 and 5, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers, when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room, and to whose admission no valid objection can be made; provided that nothing in this Bye-law shall require a car to be stopped on any gradient steeper that 1 in 25.

5. Except at a passing place or terminus, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, nor within ten yards

of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

6. The driver of a car, on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to have sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car. .

7. No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.
