At a general meeting of the Governing Body of Queen's College, in the University of Oxford, specially summoned for the purpose, and held on Wednesday, the fourteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, the the following Statute was made by the College under the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, by the unanimous votes of those present and voting:—

In Statute II, clause 19, as amended by Statute passed by the College, June five, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and approved by Her Majesty in Council June twenty-seven, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, the

"It shall be lawful for such three Official Fellows, or, if one of these three be also holding office as Senior Bursar, for such four"

shall be struck out, and the following words be substituted for them:—

"It shall be lawful for such four Official Fellows, or, if one of these four be Senior Bursar, then for such five."

day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

A STATUTE to amend a Statute made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Vict. c. 48) and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Oriel College, in the University of Oxford, duly made at a General Meeting of the Provost and Fellows, specially summoned for this purpose, held on the twenty-first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and passed at such Meeting by the votes of twò-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to Her Majesty the Queen in Council.

Whereas by clause 18 of Statute IV, made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877, and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Oriel College, in the University of Oxford, it was enacted as follows:—

"Any Scholar or Exhibitioner may be deprived of his Scholarship or Exhibition by the Provost and Fellows for any misconduct which shall in their judgment deserve deprivation, subject to such right of appeal as is herein-ofter provided."

And whereas the Provost and Fellows are of opinion that it is desirable to amend the said Statute in manner hereinafter appearing.

We the said Provost and Fellows of the said College, being the Governing Body thereof, do hereby, in exercise of the powers given to us by the fifty-fourth section of the said Act, alter the eighteenth clause of Statute IV of the said Statutes by substituting for the clause as hereinbefore set out the following clause:—

"18. If a Scholar or Exhibitioner be guilty of neglect of his studies, or of any other misconduct, the Provost and Fellows may deprive him of his Scholarship or Exhibition, or of any part of the emoluments thereof."

"The emoluments of any vacant Scholarship shall be carried to the account of a fund which shall be employed us the Provost and Fellows shall from time to time think fit in establishing and maintaining additional Scholarships."

And whereas the Provost and Fellows are of opinion that it is desirable to amend the said Statute in manuer hereinafter appearing.

We the said Provost and Fellows of the said College, being the Governing Body thereof, do hereby, in exercise of the powers given to us by the fifty-fourth section of the said Act, amend the fifth clause of Statute IV of the said Statutes as hereinbefore set out, by adding thereto the following words:-

" or in establishing and maintaining such Exhibitions of such value and tenable on such conditions as the Provost and Fellows shall from time to time

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determine."

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 20th June, 1893, from Her Majesty's Representative at Trieste, enclosing the following translation of a Circular issued by the Austro-Hungarian Marine Board, relating to quarantine:—

Translation of Circular No. 5911 of the Imperial Royal Marine Board to all the Imperial Royal Offices and Subordinate Port Officers:—

By order of the High Imperial Royal Minister for Commerce issued by telegram of June the 14th, 1893, No. 31044, the Marine Board decrees:—

The quarantine observation ordered by Government Circular of October 7, 1892, No. 9512, against arrivals from the ports of the Arabian coast of the Red Sea from Confudah to Babel Mandeb, is annulled, and will instead, owing to the breaking out of cholera at Mecca, be placed on arrivals from all Arabian Ports of the Red Sea, the following rules being imposed according to the decision of the Sanitary Conference of Dreaden

1. A vessel will be considered as "suspected" if cholera cases are found on board, or if there have been recent cases of cholera seven days before arrival.

2. A vessel will be considered as "suspected" if cholera cases shall be proved on board at the moment of her departure or during the voyage, but with no recent cholera case during the seven days preceding her arrival.

3: A vessel will be considered as not "suspected" even arriving from an infected port, if there are on board no cholera cases, and if there have been no deaths from cholera, before departure nor during her voyage, nor at the moment of arrival.

Infected vessels will be subjected to the following measures:—

1. The cholera patients will be immediately landed and isolated.

2. All other persons will, if possible, also be landed and subjected to an observation which will last according to the sanitary condition of the ship, and the date of the last case of cholera, which observation will however not be prolonged beyond a period of five days.

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3. Soiled linen cloths and clothes worn and effects belonging to the crews and passengers, which are by the Port Authorities considered as contaminating, will be disinfected, as well as the vessel, or only the contaminated parts of the

Therefore for this object, infected vessels shall be sent for the above sanitary measures to the nearest Sea Quarantine Station (Lazaretto).

Suspected vessels will be subjected to the following measures :-

1. Medical visits.

2. Disinfection of soiled linen cloths, of clothes worn, and of objects belonging to the crews and passengers, which are considered by the Port Authorities, after having taken the opinion of the Sanitary Physician, to be contaminated.

3. Flushing and subsequent disinfection of the well, also emptying of all drinking water which may be found on board, and which must also be

substituted by fresh good drinking water.

Upon the arrival of such a vessel the Sanitary Port Office will order the Master to make a list of the passengers, which shall be without loss of time handed to the local supreme authorities for the ulterior measures respecting supervision of the passengers.

The sanitary state of the crew will be observed by the Sanitary Physician for a period of five days from the day of the arrival of the vessel, during which time, with the exception of matters on duty, landing of the crew will be prohibited.

Unsuspected vessels will at once be admitted to free pratique with any bill of health that they may have; leaving to the Port and Sanitary Authorities to bestow to these ships the treatment above decided on for suspected vessels (that is, medical visits, disinfection, and the changing of water found on board for other good drinking water) whenever circumstances should render it advisable to choose more severe treatment.

Upon the arrival of a vessel from the abovementioned ports, a certificate must be asked proving that there was no cholera case on board at the port of departure.

All ships which are not willing to be subjected to the sanitary treatment ordered by the Port and Sanitary Authorities will be allowed to proceed

If vessels coming from the said ports have on board pilgrims, this must be communicated by telegram to this Marine Board for further measures to be taken.

The discharge of the cargo will be permitted under the following conditions:

- 1. The vessel, the crew, and the passengers must be isolated.
- 2. Emptying and subsequent disinfection of the
- 3. Changing of the water on board for other good drinking water.

If the passengers ask to be landed, this will be allowed under the condition that they submit themselves to the measures decided on by the competent supreme authorities.
