Body of the Queen's College, Oxford, on the fourteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and sealed on the sixteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

At a general meeting of the Governing Body of Queen's College, in the University of Oxford, specially summoned for the purpose, and held on Wednesday, the fourteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, the the following Statute was made by the College under the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, by the unanimous votes of those present and voting:—

In Statute II, clause 19, as amended by Statute passed by the College, June five, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, and approved by Her Majesty in Council June twenty-seven, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, the woods

"It shall be lawful for such three Official Fellows, or, if one of these three be also holding office as Senior Bursar, for such four"

shall be struck out, and the following words be substituted for them:—

"It shall be lawful for such four Official Fellows, or, if one of these four be Senior Bursar, then for such five."

In witness whereof, we, the Provost and Scholars of Queen's College, in the University of Oxford, have hereto set our seal this sixteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

THE: following Statutes, made on the twentyfirst day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, by the Governing Body of Oriel College, Oxford, and sealed on the tenth

day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

A STATUTE to amend a Statute made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Vict. c. 48) and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Oriel College, in the University of Oxford, duly made at a General Meeting of the Provost and Fellows, specially summoned for this purpose, held on the twenty-first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and passed at such Meeting by the votes of twò-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to Her Majesty the Queen in Council.

WHEREAS by clause 18 of Statute IV, made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877, and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Oriel College, in the University of Oxford, it was enacted as follows:—

"Any Scholor or Exhibitioner may be deprived of his Scholarship or Exhibition by the Provost and Fellows for any misconduct which shall in their judgment deserve deprivation, subject to such right of appeal as is herein-ofter provided."

And whereas the Provost and Fellows are of opinion that it is desirable to amend the said Statute in manner hereinafter appearing.

We the said Provost and Fellows of the said College, being the Governing Body thereof, do hereby, in exercise of the powers given to us by the fifty-fourth section of the said Act, alter the eighteenth clause of Statute IV of the said Statutes by substituting for the clause as hereinbefore set out the following clause:—

"18. If a Scholar or Exhibitioner be guilty of neglect of his studies, or of any other misconduct, the Provost and Fellows may deprive him of his Scholarship or Exhibition, or of any part of the emoluments thereof."
