THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Resolution by the Government of the Republic of Colombia. The following is an extract therefrom:—

Bogota, May 16, 1893.

Immediately that information is received that an infectious disease such as cholera morbus, yellow fever, or any other disease of that nature, has appeared, the ports of the Republic shall be proclaimed absolutely closed against all arrivals from infected or suspected ports. Vessels sailing from suspected ports and arriving at Colon shall be subjected to a quarantine in which they must strictly observe the prescriptions laid down by the Sanitary Board of the port, and they will be admitted to free pratique if, in the specified time, no suspicious case shall have occurred on board.
