WHEREAS by "The Seal Fishery (North Pacific) Act, 1893," it is enacted that Her Majesty the Queen may by Order in Council prohibit during the period specified by the Order the catching of seals by British ships in such parts of the seas to which that Act applies as are specified by the Order; and that for carrying into effect an arrangement with any foreign State an Order in Council may provide that such officers of that State as are specified in the Order may exercise the like powers under the Act as may be exercised by a Commissioned Officer on full pay in the Naval Service of Her Majesty in relation to a British ship and the equipment and crew and certificate thereof; and that any such Order may contain any limitations, conditions, qualifications, and exceptions which appear to Her Majesty in Council expedient for carrying into effect the object of the said Act:

And whereas the said Act applies to the seas within that part of the Pacific Ocean known as Behring's Sea, and within such other parts of the North Pacific Ocean as are north of the forty-second parallel of north latitude:

And whereas an arrangement has been made between Her Majesty the Queen and His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of Russia, whereby British ships engaged in hunting seals within such parts of the said seas as are hereinafter specified may be seized by Russian cruizers:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, and of all other powers enabling Her in that

behalf, is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. From and after the fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, until the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, the catching of seals by British ships is hereby prohibited within such parts of the seas to which the recited Act applies as are comprised within the following zones, that is to say (i) a zone of ten marine miles on all the Russian coasts of Behring Sea and the North Pacific Ocean, and (ii) a zone of thirty marine miles round the Komandorsky Islands and Tulénew (Robben Island).

2. The powers which under the recited Act may be exercised by any Commissioned Officer on full pay in the Naval Service of Her Majesty may be exercised by the Captain or other Officer in command of any war vessel of His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of Russia in relation to a British ship, and the equipment and crew and certificate thereof.

3. This Order may be cited as "The Seal Fishery (North Pacific) Order in Council, 1893."

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 19th June, 1893, from the Austro-Hungarian Ambassador, enclosing a Circular relating to quarantine. The following is a translation thereof:—

No. 5703.

CIRCULAR of the Imperial Royal Marine Authorities to all officials and functionaries in Austro-Hungarian ports and marine stations of sanitation.

By an Order of the Ministers of the Interior, Trade, and Finance of the 3rd of June, 1893, in concert with the Royal Hungarian Government, with regard to the existing sanitary conditions of foreign countries, the prohibition of importation and transit of certain articles from the Empire of Germany, from France, from Belgium, from Holland, and from Roumania, which was ordered by the Decrees of the 10th of October, 1892, 6th of November, 1892, and 10th of November, 1892, has been removed.

With regard to Russia alone the importation is still prohibited of—

1. Unwashed linen, old clothes, including worn shoes and used bed clothes.

So far as these articles are introduced as part of travelling baggage or in consequence of change of residence, as travelling effects, it is sufficient that they should be subjected at the place of destination to examination by the sanitary police and to eventual treatment by the same.

2. Rags are excluded from the prohibition when they are—

a. Rags compressed under hydraulic pressure, forwarded as merchandise in wholesale trade, in bales bound with iron and bearing marks of origin and numbers, recognized by the authorities.

b. New fragments, proceeding directly from spinneries, looms, tailors' shops or bleacheries, shoddy, and new fragments of paper.

The transit of the objects mentioned, exclusive of importation, is permitted on the production of an official certificate, proving that the transit of these goods from a neighbouring state to that to which they are due has been permitted, and under the condition that each package should be taken in transit in a closed space, in such a way as to prevent any species of manipulation during the transit.

This Order comes into force on the day of publication.
