



WHEREAS by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, Her Majesty the Queen has jurisdiction in Zanzibar. Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :-

1. This Order may be cited as "The Zanzibar (Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1893," and shall be construed as one with "The Zanzibar Order in Council, 1884," and "The Zanzibar Order in Council, 1888" (herein respectively referred to as the Order of 1884 and the Order of 1888).

2.—(1.) Natives of any Protectorate of Her Majesty which is outside Zanzibar shall when within Zanzibar be deemed to be British-protected persons within the meaning of the Orders in Council relating to Zanzibar.

(2.) Such of the provisions of those Orders as refer to British subjects shall extend also to Zanzibar subjects, but in so far only as by Treaty, Convention, grant, usage, or other lawful means. Her Majesty has jurisdiction in Zanzibar in relation to Zanzibar subjects.

8. Article eight of the Order of 1884 is hereby amended, and from and after the commencement of this Order, chapter thirty-three of the Act, therein referred to as the Code of Criminal Procedure (Act X of 1882), which relates to criminal proceedings against Europeans and Americans, shall not be applicable to Zanzibar.
4. The Order of 1884, and the Orders amending the same shall be read and construed as if

4. The Order of 1884, and the Orders amending the same, shall be read and construed as if the expression "Consular Judge" had been substituted for "judicial assistant" wherever that expression occurs—provided that if the Consular Officer heretofore acting as judicial assistant is appointed to be Consular Judge, all past acts of that officer as judicial assistant shall have the same validity as if on the commencement of the Order of 1884 he had been appointed to be Consular Judge.

5.—(1.) The Secretary of State may appoint one of Her Majesty's Consular Officers in and for Zanzibar to be Assistant Consular Judge, and the Consul-General may in case of emergency appoint one of such officers to act temporarily as and for such Assistant Consular Judge.

(2.) Subject to the provisions of this Order and to any directions of the Secretary of State, the Assistant Consular Judge shall have and exercise all the same powers and jurisdiction which under this Order, and the Order of 1884, can be exercised by the Consular Judge.

6. So much of Article nine of the Order of 1884 as relates to the judicial assistant is hereby repealed, and in the application of the Code of Criminal Procedure and other enactments in that Article referred to, the Assistant Consular Judge shall be deemed to be the Magistrate of the district, and the Consular Judge shall be deemed to be a Joint or Additional Sessions Judge.

7. The powers conferred upon the Consul-General by Article two of the Order of 1888 shall extend, and be deemed to have extended, to regulations for enforcing the observance of any Treaty, Convention, or International Agreement to which Her Majesty is, or may hereafter be, a party, whether the Sultan of Zanzibar is or is not a party thereto.

8. A copy of this Order shall forthwith be affixed and exhibited in the public office of the Consulate at Zanzibar, and the day on which it is so exhibited is herein referred to as the commencement of this Order, provided that any appointment authorized by this Order may be made at any time after its passing.

9. Save as by this Order provided, expressions

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used in this Order and in the Order of 1884 have the same meaning as in that Order.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Francis John Bishop of the said diocese of Chester in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Saint Mary Stockport and of the said new parish of Saint Mark Bredbury which are described in the schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Hall-street Stockport.'

"And we further recommend and propose with such consent and so testified as aforesaid that the advowson and perpetual right of patronage of the district or new parish hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted and the whole right of nomination of the incumbent of the same district or new parish shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and as from the day aforesaid being the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette be assigned to and become and be absolutely vested in the said William Symonds as rector of the rectory of the said parish of Saint Mary Stockport and in his successors rectors of of the same rectory for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The district of Hall-street Stockport being : ---"All that portion of the parish of Saint Mary Stockport in the county of Chester and in the diocese of Chester wherein the present incumbent of such parish still possesses the exclusive cure of souls and also all that contiguous portion of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Mark Bredbury in the same county and diocese which said portions are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Thomas Stockport in the said county and diocese from the parish of Saint Mary Stockport aforcsaid at the junction of Hempshaw-lane with Webb-lane and extending thence first northward then eastward then north-eastward then northwestward and then again north-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of thirty-five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hall-street and extending thence northwestward along the middle of the said street for a distance of one and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Greystoke-street and. extending thence north - eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Grimshaw-street and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Turncroft-lane and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of one and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with New Zealand-road and extending thence first northwestward then north-eastward and then northward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of thirty-eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with New Bridge-lane and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to a point at the centre of the bridge called or known as New Bridge which carries the said last-named lane over the river Mersey upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Mary Stockport from the new parish of Saint Mark Bredbury aforesaid and extending thence first southward then westward and then again southward along the same boundary for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts (thereby following the middle of the said river) to the point where the said boundary leaves the same river and continuing thence still along the middle of the said river for a further distance of one mile and thirty chains or thereabouts first north-eastward then eastward then southward then westward and then again southward to the point where the last - mentioned boundary rejoins the said river opposite to the northern end of the wall forming the eastern and southern boundaries of the park and plantation attached to the house called or known as Woodbank which point is upon the said boundary dividing the said new parish of Saint Mark Bredbury from the parish of Saint Mary Stockport aforesaid which boundary also divides the township. of Bredbury from the township of Offerton and extending thence first southward and then southwestward along the same boundary for a distance. of twenty-five chains or thereabouts to the point near the house called or known as Brown House

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chester. C. L. Peel.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, in the words following, that is to say :--

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the district chapelry of All Saints Falsgrave in the county of York and in the diocese of York.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said district chapelry of All Saints Falsgrave which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

And whereas the Reverend Frederick Harton Holt of Saint James's Lodge Scarborough in the said county of York Clerk in Holy Orders has contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of four thousand and three hundred pounds sterling in aid of the endowment of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said new parish and of the maintenance of the minister or incumbent thereof for the time being and we have in respect of such sum agreed and have undertaken to provide and pay by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year to such minister or incumbent as aforesaid when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the lastly-mentioned Act the sum of one hundred and twenty-nine pounds per annum so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands.

"And whereas the said capital sum of four thousand and three hundred pounds sterling has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should also grant out of the common fund created by the firstly herein-named Act to the said proposed district or new parish a capital sum of seven hundred pounds in respect of which there shall be paid by us to the minister or incumbent of the said proposed district or new parish when duly licensed as aforesaid a yearly sum of twenty-one pounds and upon the further understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas the said Frederick Hartop Holt has nominated to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, as the person and as the corporation sole in whom he desires' that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be vested, himself, the said Frederick Hartop Holt for his life, and subsequently the Archbishop of York and his successors for over.

"And whereas the said grant of twenty-one pounds will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, be made and secured by an instrument to be executed by us the said Commissioners under our common seal in accordance, with the provisions of the Act of the twentyninth and thirtieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

" Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Dalrymple Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he the said archbishop has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said district chapelry of All Saints Falsgrave which is described in the schedule hereunder written all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district fcr spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint James Scarborough.'

And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid, then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Frederick Hartop Holt for his life, and shall after the decease of the said Frederick Hartop Holt be vested in and from time to time be exercised by the said Archbishop of York and his successors for ever.

¹⁴⁴ And we further recommend and propose that forthing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"All that part of the district chapelry of All Saints Falsgrave, in the county and diocese of York, which is bounded upon the south-west by the parish of Seamer in the same county and diocese, upon the east partly by a certain isolated portion of the parish of Scarborough and partly by the district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Scarborough both in the county and diocese aforesaid, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the north-west by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundaries of the said district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Scarborough, of the said parish of Scarborough and of the district chapelry of All Shints Falsgrave all meet at the centre of the bridge which carries the line of the Scarborough Branch of the North Eastern Railway over the road called or known as Westbourne-grove, and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with Saint James'sroad and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Seamer-road and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of six and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Oak Road and extending thence westward along the middle of the lastnamed road for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Park Hill-road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Spring Hill-lane, and extending thence generally south-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of forty-nine chains or thereabouts to the point opposite to the house called or known as Rose Cottage where the same lane is joined by Horse Cliff-lane and by the public footpath which leads up to and through Jacob's Ladder into the road called or known as Stepney Hill and extending thence, that is to say, from the last-mentioned point south-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned footpath for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as

Stepney Hill as aforesaid and extending thence still south-westward and in a straight line across the last-named road for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to the boundary on the western side of the same road which boundary divides the said district chapelry of All Saints Falsgrave from the parish of Seamer aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hercinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbent of the perpetual curacy of the district chapelry of All Saints Falsgrave out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and whereas the patrons have signified their assent to such scheme and the incumbent has made no objections to the same scheme :

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council : now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of York. "We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Raphael the Archangel, Bedminster, being :---

" All that part of the district parish of Saint Paul, Bedminster, in the city and county of the city of Bristol and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, which is bounded upon part of the south by the new parish of Saint Francis Ashton Gate Bedminster, in the said city and diocese, upon the north-west partly by the new parish of Saint Andrew-the-Less, Dowry-square, Clifton, and partly by the new parish of the Holy Trinity Clifton, both in the said city and diocese, upon the north partly by the new parish of Saint Peter, Clifton Wood, partly by the parish of Saint Augustine, Bristol and partly by the parish of Saint Stephen Bristol, all in the said city and diocese, upon the east by the parish of Saint Mary Redcliff, in the said city and diocese, and upon the remaining part of the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Mary Redcliff from the district parish of Saint Paul Bedminster aforesaid, at a point in the middle of that part of the River

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol at Bristol and at Gloucester respectively. WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all; powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this hundred and ninety-three.

Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows : -

1. This Warrant may be cited as the "Inland Post Amendment Warrant, 1893.

2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Inland Post Warrant, 1892 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.

3. Where any express packet exceeds one pound in weight, there shall be charged and paid, in addition to all other fees chargeable under the principal Warrant or any Warrant amending the same, a fee (hereinafter referred to as an extra weight fee) of three half-pence for every pound or fractional part of a pound beyond the first pound.

4. Where two or more express packets addressed to different addressees are at the request of the sender delivered by the same special messenger, there shall be charged thereon-

(1.) In respect of the express packet which the messenger last delivers, the full express fees chargeable under the principal Warrant, the distance of the place of delivery from the express delivery office being calculated along the whole route actually traversed by the messenger.

(2.) In respect of each other of such express packets, in lieu of all other express fees (except extra weight fees), the sum of twopence.

Provided always that a sender shall not be entitled to require that any number of express packets exceeding ten or weighing collectively more than fifteen pounds be delivered by the same special messenger.
