THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Quarantine Notice, issued by the Austro-Hungarian Authorities :-

Translation.) ORDER of the Ministry of the Interior, Commerce, and Finance of July 21, 1893, respecting the prohibition of the importation and passage of used and unwashed body linen, of worn clothes, including boots and shoes, or used bed clothes, and of all kinds of rags coming from the French ports in the Gulf of Lyons, and from the neighbouring Departments of Herault and Gard :-

In consequence of the increase of cholera in Southern France, and of the danger of its introduction here, it has been decided with the Hungarian Government that the introduction and passage of used and unwashed body linen, of worn clothes, including boots and shoes, and all

kinds of rags coming from the French ports in the Gulf of Lyons, and from the neighbouring Departments of Herault and Gard, shall be

In cases where the first-named objects are conveyed as baggage, or are removed in consequence of a change of residence as removable effects, they are subject to the revision of the Sanitary Authorities, and submitted to the treat-ment of the Sanitary Authorities of the frontier, having due regard to their place of destination.

Are excluded from the prohibition respecting rags:-(A.) Rags which have been pressed by hydraulic pressure which are forwarded as goods for wholesale trade, in bales bound with iron hoops, if they are provided with marks of origin and numbers which are recognized by the Autho-(B.) Fresh waste, which comes direct into circulation from spinning establishments, from weaving mills, from tailoring businesses, or from tin works, and fresh paper waste.

The transit of the above-designated articles whose import is forbidden is only permitted on the production of an official certificate, that the importation and consequently the transit through the neighbouring State for which they are destined is permitted; and on the condition that they shall be isolated in such a manner that any handling of them during their transit shall be excluded

This Order comes in force on the day on which the Custom Houses, as well as the Maritime and Sanitary Authorities, become acquainted with it.

Passengers will not be permitted to land at Malta unless they declare on oath that they have not resided or been in Continental Italy for seven days' previous to their arrival.
