WHEREAS by the twenty-third section of
 the Supreme Court of Judicature Act,
 1875, it is enacted (amongst other things) that
 Her Majesty may, at any time after the passing
 of that Act, and from time to time by Order in
 Council, provide in such manner and subject to
 such regulations as to Her Majesty may seem
 meet for all or any of the following matters:—

1. For the discontinuance, either temporarily or permanently, wholly or partially, of any existing Circuit, and the formation of any new Circuit by the union of any Counties or parts of Counties, or partly in one way and partly in the other, or by the constitution of any County or part of a County to be a Circuit by itself, and in particular for the issue of Commissions for the discharge of civil and criminal business in the County of Surrey to the Judge appointed to sit for the trial by jury of causes and issues in Middlesex or London, or any of them; and,
2. For the appointment of the place or places at which Assizes are to be holden on any Circuit; and,
3. For altering by such authority, and in such manner as may be specified in the Order, the day appointed for holding the Assizes at any place on any Circuit in any case where by reason of the pressure of business or other unforeseen cause it is expedient to alter the same; and,
4. For the regulation, so far as may be necessary for carrying into effect any Order under that section, of the venue in all cases, civil and criminal, triable on any Circuit or elsewhere:

And that Her Majesty may, from time to time by Order in Council, alter, add to, or amend any Order in Council made in pursuance of that

section, and in making any Order under that section, may give any directions which it appears to Her Majesty to be desirable to give for the purpose of giving full effect to such Order:

Provided that every Order in Council made under that section shall be laid before each House of Parliament within such time, and shall be subject to be annulled in such manner as is in that Act provided:

And that any Order in Council purporting to be made in pursuance of that section shall have the same effect in all respects as if it were enacted in that Act:

And that the power thereby given to Her Majesty shall be deemed to be in addition to and not in derogation of any power already vested in Her Majesty in respect of the matters aforesaid; and all enactments in relation to Circuits, or the places at which Assizes are to be holden, or otherwise in relation to the subject matter of any Order under that section, shall, so far as such enactments are inconsistent with such Order, be repealed thereby, whether such repeal is thereby expressly made or not:

And whereas at meetings of the Judges of the Supreme Court of Judicature, duly assembled at Her Majesty's Royal Courts of Justice on the seventeenth day of May and the twenty-first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, pursuant to the seventy-fifth section of the Supreme Court of Judicature Act, 1873, it was (amongst other things) resolved that the Assizes respectively should for the future, so far as may be practicable and the business to be done may allow, be fixed in accordance with the scheme to their resolution annexed: but so, nevertheless, that the Northern, South-Eastern, North Wales and Western Circuits shall commence on the days named in the scheme: provided that if any of those days falls on a Sunday the Circuits shall commence on the following day, and that whenever October twenty-fourth falls on a Sunday, the Autumn Circuits fixed to commence on October twenty-fifth shall commence on October twenty-sixth:

Now therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Most Honourable Privy Council, having taken in consideration the matters aforesaid, under and by virtue of the authority aforesaid, and of all or any other statutes, laws, powers, and authorities enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, accordingly, as follows:

- (i.) The Commission days for the several places on the respective Circuits for the Assizes to be hereafter holden shall, so far as may be practicable and the business to be done may allow, be fixed by the Judges at their meeting in manner heretofore accustomed in accordance with the scheme set out in the schedule hereto.
- (ii.) The County of Surrey shall be included in the South-Eastern Circuit.
- (iii.) This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and as from that day there shall be repealed so much of the Order in Council of the twenty-sixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, as is inconsistent with any provision contained in this Order.
- (iv.) Except where the context otherwise requires, expressions used in this Order shall have the same meaning as in the Judicature Acts, 1873 and 1875, and the Acts amending the same.
- (v.) This Order may be amended, added to, or repealed by Order in Council.

“I. To reduce the number of Greenwich Hospital Pensions allotted to Lieutenants from three to one.

“II. To allot from the money thus made avail- able one additional pension of £35 a year to each of the following ranks :—

- “ Chief Boatswain,
- “ Chief Carpenters ;

the further sum of £5 a year which is required to make up the total of £105 being provided out of Greenwich Hospital Funds.”

And whereas by the seventh section of “The Merchant Shipping (Pilotage) Act, 1889,” it is enacted that the powers of making Bye-laws conferred on a Pilotage Authority by the three hundred and thirty-third section of “The Mer- chant Shipping Act, 1854,” shall extend to making Bye-laws requiring Masters or Mates who hold Pilotage Certificates granted in pursuance of section three hundred and forty or section three hundred and forty-two of that Act to contribute towards the pilotage fund of the district :

And whereas the Dublin Port and Docks Board, being a Pilotage Authority for the Port of Dublin within the meaning of the said Acts, have made Bye-laws pursuant to section seven of “The Merchant Shipping (Pilotage) Act, 1889.”

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the proposed Bye-laws are reasonable and proper :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by “The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854,” and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to approve of and signify Her consent to the said Bye-laws, as set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed.

SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Order refers.

BYE-LAWS made by the Dublin Port and Docks Board, the Pilotage Authority of the Port of Dublin, pursuant to "The Merchant Shipping (Pilotage) Act, 1889," section seven, and "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," section three hundred and thirty-three.

1. The following Bye-law shall commence and take effect from and after the date mentioned in the Order of Her Majesty in Council approving the same.

2. Every Master or Mate, who holds a Pilotage Certificate granted in pursuance of section three hundred and forty or section three hundred and forty-two of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854" enabling such Master or Mate to pilot any ship or ships within any part of the district over which the Dublin Port and Docks Board, as the Pilotage Authority, has jurisdiction, shall contribute towards the pilotage fund of the said district, as follows, that is to say:—

Every such Master or Mate to whom a Pilotage Certificate shall be or shall have been granted or who shall obtain or shall have obtained a renewal of any Certificate so granted enabling him to pilot any ship or ships therein specified, shall contribute towards the said fund the sum of one pound yearly, provided that such sum does not exceed five per cent. of the Pilotage dues which would be payable in respect of his ship if he had not held a Pilotage Certificate.

The contribution above-mentioned shall be payable to the treasurer for the time being of the Dublin Port and Docks Board at the time when the fee for the granting or for the renewal of the Certificate of such Master or Mate is payable.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-seven sections six and eight duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the thirteenth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property in the parish of Hopton in the county of Suffolk, now vested in us.

"Whereas under and by virtue of an indenture bearing date the fifth day of October one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five and made or expressed to be made between Mary Crabtree and Fanny Crabtree both of Halesworth in the county of Suffolk, Spinsters of the one part and us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the other part, the lands and hereditaments described in the schedule hereto annexed became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us in fee simple for the purposes and subject to the provisions applicable to other hereditaments vested in us.

"And whereas the lands and hereditaments aforesaid are not subject to any outstanding

beneficial lease or grant but are now in our possession, but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said lands and hereditaments or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit should be sold or disposed of and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands and hereditaments or in any part or parts thereof in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing duly executed according to law from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act all or any of the said lands and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid with their appurtenances and all our estate right title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs executors administrators or assigns or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and enquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands tithes rent charges tenements or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas it is desirable that the appointment or election of a Warden shall, upon the next occurrence of a vacancy in the office, be suspended for a limited period.

"1. Notwithstanding anything in any Statute contained, the office of Warden shall, upon the next occurrence of a vacancy in the office which shall happen after the approval of this Statute by Her Majesty in Council, remain vacant for a period of twelve calendar months from the date of the vacancy aforesaid, unless the Governing Body, with the consent of the Warden and Fellows of New College, Oxford, shall within that period otherwise determine (such period, or any shorter period which the Governing Body with such consent as aforesaid may determine, being hereinafter called the period of suspension).

"2. No appointment or election of a Warden shall be made during the period of suspension, either by the Warden and Fellows of New College or by the Visitor, and the third section of the Statute numbered IV, of the said Statutes

"made on the twenty-third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, shall not come into operation during such period: but after the expiration of the period of suspension such appointment or election may be made according to the Statutes for the time being in force, and as if the vacancy had occurred at the expiration of the period of suspension, and had upon such expiration been duly notified to the Warden and Fellows of New College.

"3. During the period of suspension the Chairman for the time being of the Governing Body shall take the place of the Warden as to using the name and seal of the College, and in other respects the Governing Body shall make due provision for the discharge during such period of the duties appertaining to the office of Warden, with power for that purpose to assign any salary or emolument out of the revenues of the College."

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by an Order bearing date the 28th day of August, 1890 (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), in exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by Section 130 of The Public Health Act, 1875, and by Section 2 of the Public Health Act, 1889, made certain rules and regulations with a view to the treatment of persons affected

with Cholera, and for preventing the spread of that disease ;

And whereas by a further Order dated the 6th day of September, 1892; We made additional Regulations for the prevention of the spread of Cholera, and by Article V thereof directed that such Order should be read as one with the Regulations ;

And whereas it is provided by Article 6 of the Regulations that every Port Sanitary Authority and every other Sanitary Authority within whose District persons are likely to be landed from any ship coming foreign shall, as speedily as practicable, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the port, fix some place where the Master of any ship certified under the Regulations to be infected with Cholera shall, as required by Article 10 of the Regulations, moor or anchor her until the requirements of the Regulations have been duly fulfilled ; and that the place to be fixed as aforesaid shall be some place within the jurisdiction or district of the Sanitary Authority, unless We otherwise consent ;

And whereas it is further provided by the said Article 6 that any place fixed as aforesaid, with Our consent, outside the jurisdiction or district of a Sanitary Authority, shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to be within such jurisdiction or district ;

And whereas the said Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of the Blean Union propose to fix the place hereinafter referred to, and shown on the Map or Chart in the Schedule to this Order, as the place where any ship may be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article 10 of the Regulations, and such place being situate without their jurisdiction or district, have made application to Us for Our consent in the matter ;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by the above-mentioned Sections, and of every other power enabling Us in this behalf, do hereby signify Our Consent to the said Rural Sanitary Authority of the Blean Union fixing, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the Port of Faversham, the waters included within the straight lines drawn between the points marked A, B, C, and D on the Map or Chart in the Schedule annexed to this Order as the place where any ship bound to any place within the District of such Sanitary Authority, and certified under the Regulations to be infected with Cholera, shall be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article 10 of the Regulations.

And We do hereby Order and Direct that the jurisdiction of the said Sanitary Authority shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to extend, and, subject to the provisions of this Order, the Regulations shall apply, to any ship, which, in pursuance of the Regulations, or of any directions given thereunder, shall be moored at the place fixed as a mooring station, and hereinbefore referred to, and to any ship which shall be on its way thither.

BYE-LAWS referred to in the foregoing Order of Council.
Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales.

In Substitution for Bye-Law 35.

The Council may, at a Meeting convened as prescribed by Section 14 of the Charter, and in exercise of the powers thereby conferred, elect as a Fellow or Associate any candidate for admission who, being at the date of his application in practice as a Public Accountant, was in practice on or before the first January, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and has been in practice for more than five years altogether, but whose practice has, on account of ill-health, or for other causes satisfactory to the Council, not been continuous for five years next before the date of his application. The Council may also by a resolution passed at a Meeting specially convened, with notice of the object, at which Meeting there shall be present not less than twenty-four of the Members of the Council, and for which resolution not less than three-fourths of those present and voting shall vote, elect as a Fellow or Associate any candidate for admission who has, up to the date of his application, been continuously in practice as a Public Accountant for ten years; or who, being at the date of his application in practice as a Public Accountant, has been in practice for more than ten years altogether, but whose practice has, on account of ill-health or for other causes satisfactory to the Council, not been continuous for ten years before the date of his application.
