THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Government Notice, dated 1st August, 1893, from Her Majesty's Representative at Malta. The following are extracts therefrom:

2. Quarantine for twenty-one days with provision for handling cargo.

The following shall be subject to a period of twenty-one days' quarantine, but shall be permitted, under the directions of the Collector of Customs, to discharge goods (which are not susceptible of communicating contagion) by means of the vessel's crew on lighters, or to employ for handling cargo local labourers subject

to twenty-one days' quarantine, viz.:—
(a.) Vessels arriving from any port without a clean bill of health.

(b.) Vessels arriving from any port of France,

Algeria, or the Regency of Tunis.

Vessels which have been in any of the above places, but which have afterwards been admitted to free pratique in other ports, shall not be admitted to free pratique in these islands before twenty-one days have elapsed from their departure from a port of France, Algeria, or the Regency of Tunis, and should such vessels produce a certificate to the effect that they have been thoroughly disinfected at an intermediate port the said period shall be reduced to eleven days.

3. Quarantine for seven days with provision for handling cargo.

Vessels arriving from any port of the Kingdom of Italy are to perform seven days quarantine,

Collector of Customs, to discharge goods (which are not susceptible of communicating contagion) by means of the vessel's crew on lighters, or to employ for handling cargo local labourers subject to seven days' quarantine.

4. Quarantine for five days with provision for handling cargo.

Vessels arriving from Smyrna, Scio, and Chesmé are to perform five days' quarantine, but shall be permitted, under the directions of the Collector of Customs, to discharge goods (which are not susceptible of communicating contagion) by means of the vessel's crew on lighters, or to employ for handling cargo local labourers subject to five days' quarantine.

6. Passengers. (a.) Passengers arriving by any vessel subject to quarantine are required to undergo the same. restrictions as the vessels on which they arrive.

(b.) Passengers will not be permitted to land at Malta unless they declare on oath to the Port. Authority that they have not resided or been in France, Algeria, or the Regency of Tunis for twenty-one days previous to their arrival, or in the Kingdom of Italy for seven days, or Smyrna, Scio, or Chesmé for five days, previous to their arrival.

(c.) Passengers arriving direct from England on vessels having duly qualified Medical Officer on board, are to be allowed to land without medical inspection, provided that the Medical Officer in charge on board shall declare on oath that during the voyage there has not been on board a case of dysentery, diarrheea, cholerine, cholera, or any disease with symptoms resembling cholera, either among the passengers or the crew.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Telegram, dated 8th August, 1893, from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia: - "Sanitary Council announces to-day that from August 5 travellers entering Bulgaria from Roumania, Russia, and Asiatic Turkey are subjected to eight days' quarantine, and luggage and clothing will be chemically disinfected. Travellers from above countries can only enter Bulgaria viâ Burgos, Varna, Silistria, Rustchuk, Sistova, or Lomuh (sic). Travellers from above countries may enter Bulgaria by all Danube and Black Sea Ports after quarantine and disinfection. Import of all articles specified in Circular of December 8, 1892, coming from above countries absolutely prohibited. Land frontier between Bulgaria and Roumania absolutely closed except at Silistria, certain special provisions made respecting in-habitants of frontier line. Travellers and goods from Mediterranean shore will undergo five days' quarantine, unless they have previously purged same at Constantinople, in which case they will only be subjected to strict medical observation."

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as THE BOROUGH of Hanley (Parasitic Mange) Order of 1893.

Extent.

2. This Order shall extend to the borough of Hanley only.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-

Interpretation.

4. In this Order

Parasitic mange means parasitic mange of horses, asses, or mules:

The Act of 1878 means the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

The Acts of 1878 to 1892 means the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1892: Inspector includes Veterinary Inspector:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

Extension of Definition of Animals and Disease.

5. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses, and mules shall be a disease for the purposes of the following

Sections of the Act of 1878 (namely):
Section thirty-one of the Act of 1878 (notice

Section thirty-two of the Act of 1878 (Orders) Section fifty of the Act of 1878 (powers of police)

Section fifty-one of the Act of 1878 (powers of

inspectors)

and of all other Sections of that Act containingprovisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those Sections, including such Sections as provide for offences and procedure.

Notice of Disease.

6. - (1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with parasitic mange, or suspected of being so affected, shall with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected or suspected, to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the horse, ass, or mule so affected or suspected is.

(2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the

Local Authority.

Duty of Inspector to act immediately. 7
7. An Inspector of the Local Authority on receiving in any manner whatsoever information of the supposed existence of parasitic mange, or having reasonable ground to suspect the existence of parasitic mange, shall proceed with all practicable speed to the place where such parasitic mange, according to the information received by him, exists, or is suspected to exist, and shall see that the provisions of this Order are complied with.

Treatment for Parasitic Mange.

.8.—(1.) A person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with parasitic mange, shall treat that horse, ass, or mule, or cause it to be treated, with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange.

(2.) If any person fails to comply with the requirements of this Article he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

9.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the

purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following pur-

poses, or any of them:

(a.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of places used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles harness, or other things used for or about any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange:

(b.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be effected:

(c.) For providing that such places, utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things shall be cleansed and disinfected at the expense of the Local Authority, or of the owner, lessee, or occu-

pier thereof.

(2.) If any person fails to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing to be cleansed and disinfected, and to recover the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from such person summarily.

General Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

10.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board of Agriculture a copy of every Regulation made by them under this Order.

(2.) If the Board of Agriculture are satisfied on inquiry with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is of too restrictive a character, or otherwise objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Offences.

11. If anything is omitted to be done as regards the cleansing or disinfection of any place or thing in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under the authority of this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place, or the owner of the thing, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.
