THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 5th September, 1893, from Her Majesty's Representative at Stockholm, reporting that a Royal Decree, dated the 2nd of September, and published in the Official Gazette of the 4th September, orders that vessels coming from St. Petersburg or from Russian Harbours on the Baltic, and conveying emigrants from Russia shall, if such vessels are not already obliged to go to a quarantine station before communication with Swedish territory or inhabitants, proceed to one of the observation stations alluded to in the Royal Decree of July 14, and there with crew, passengers, and cargo remain for five nights and days, being subjected to medical inspection and being treated as if coming from a cholera-stricken place.

The Official Gazette likewise publishes a notification of the Board of Trade, dated September 4,

putting into effect the regulations of July 14 last, regarding the following quarantine and observation stations in addition to the observation station at Köpstadssö, and the quarantine station at Kansö, near Gothenburg, viz.: the quarantine and observation station at the Island of Fejan, near Furusund, in the Bay of Stockholm, and the observation stations at Bredvik, outside Umga, at Unikaren, outside Sundsväl, at Håron, near Sandhamn, in the Bay of Stockholm, at Arkö, among the Islands of Östergötland, at Enholmen, outside Slite, in Gotland, and at Vestra Håstholmen, near Karlskrona.

In consequence of this, those rules will be enforced for above arrivals and also the regulations as to the treatment of vessels in case of cholera, issued by circular of August the 5th, 1893, No. 7700.

West Derby Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the West Derby Union, in the County of Lancaster and the County Boroughs of Bootle and Liverpool:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by a General Order dated the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, made rules and regulations relating to the appointment of Vaccination Officers by Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the said West Derby Union; and by Article 9 of that Order it was provided as follows:—

"The Guardians shall pay to any Vaccination Officer such salary or remuneration, and such only, as the Local Government Board may direct or approve, whether for ordinary duties or for occasional services; and such salary or remuneration may be increased or reduced as that Board may from time to time direct or approve."

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Order as hereinafter mentioned, so far as regards the said West Derby Union:
