WHEREAS a vessel, called the "Ligo," has lately arrived from Wilmington, and has been directed to proceed to, and remain under quarantine at, the Motherbank, off the Isle of Wight; and during and in the course of her voyage from Wilmington, the Yellow Fever, being a dangerous and infectious disease, appeared on board the said vessel and attacked persons on board thereof, and the said vessel arrived under alarming and suspicious circumstances;

And whereas the sick persons who were on board the "Ligo" on her arrival have since been ordered to be removed to the Quarantine Lazarette or Hulk called the "Menelaus," lying at the Motherbank:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the disposition of the other persons remaining on board the said ship:

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, in exercise of the powers vested in them, do hereby order,—

1. That the said vessel called the "Ligo" shall remain and continue at the Motherbank aforesaid until the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, or any two or more of them, shall make further order.

2. That the persons now on board the said vessel called the "Ligo," not ordered to be removed to the "Menelaus," shall be removed to the ship called the "Edgar," unless ordered to remain on board the "Ligo" by the Medical Superintendent of Quarantine at Ryde.

3. That all persons so removed on board the "Menelaus" Quarantine Hulk, or who shall hereafter be removed on board the said Hulk, or on board the "Edgar," and who shall have been on board the "Ligo," shall be kept and detained on board the said Hulk, or the "Edgar," until the Lords of the Council, or any two or more of them, shall make further order.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

1. Whether the growth of the poppy and manufacture and sale of Opium in British India should be prohibited except for medical purposes, and whether such prohibition could be extended to the Native States:

2. The nature of the existing arrangements with the Native States in respect of the transit of Opium through British territory, and on what terms, if any, these arrangements could be with justice terminated:

3. The effect on the finances of India of the prohibition of the sale and export of Opium, taking into consideration (a) the amount of compensation payable; (b) the cost of the necessary preventive measures; (c) the loss of revenue;

4. Whether any change short of total prohibition should be made in the system at present followed for regulating and restricting the Opium Traffic and for raising a revenue therefrom:

5. The consumption of Opium by the different races and in the different districts of India, and the effect of such consumption on the moral and physical condition of the people:

6. The disposition of the people of India in regard to (a) the use of Opium for non-medical purposes; (b) their willingness to bear in whole or in part the cost of prohibitive measures:— with the prayer of which Address We are graciously pleased to comply:

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these Presents authorize and appoint, you, the said Thomas, Baron Brassey; Sir James Broadwood Lyall; Sir Lachhmeswar Singh; Sir William Roberts; Robert Gray Cornish Mowbray; Arthur Upton Fanshawe; Arthur Pease; Haridas Veharidas; and Henry Joseph Wilson; to be Our Commissioners for the purposes of the said inquiry.

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any five or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to, and examine all such books, documents, registers, and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject; and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any five or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places whether in Our said United Kingdom or within Our Indian Dominions as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid, and to employ such persons as you may think fit to assist you in conducting any inquiry which you may hold.

And We do further by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any five or more of you, shall and may from time to time, and at any place or places, proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any five or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any five or more of you, your opinion upon the questions herein submitted for your consideration.

And for the purpose of aiding you in such matters, We hereby appoint Our trusty and well-beloved John Prescott Hewett, Esq., Companion of Our Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, Deputy Secretary to Our Government of

India in the Home Department, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by an Order bearing date the 28th day of August, 1890 (hereinafter referred to as “the Regulations”), in exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by Section 130 of The Public Health Act, 1875, and by Section 2 of the Public Health Act, 1889, made certain rules and regulations with a view to the treatment of persons affected with Cholera, and for preventing the spread of that disease;

And whereas by a further Order dated the 6th day of September, 1892, We made additional Regulations for the prevention of the spread of Cholera, and by Article V thereof directed that such Order should be read as one with the Regulations;

And whereas it is provided by Article 6 of the Regulations that every Port Sanitary Authority and every other Sanitary Authority within whose District persons are likely to be landed from any ship coming foreign shall, as speedily as practicable, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the port, fix some place where the Master of any ship certified under the Regulations to be infected with Cholera shall, as required by Article 10 of the Regulations, moor or anchor such ship until the requirements of the Regulations have been duly fulfilled; and that the place to be fixed as aforesaid shall be some place within the jurisdiction or district of the Sanitary Authority, unless We otherwise consent;

And whereas it is further provided by the said Article 6 that any place fixed as aforesaid, with Our consent, outside the jurisdiction or district of a Sanitary Authority, shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to be within such jurisdiction or district;

And whereas the said Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Carmarthen propose to fix the place hereinafter referred to, and shown on the Map or Chart in the Schedule annexed to this Order, as the place where any ship may be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article 10 of the Regulations, and such place being situated without their jurisdiction or district, have made application to Us for Our consent in the matter:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by the abovementioned Sections, and of every other power enabling Us in this behalf, do hereby signify Our Consent to the said Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of the Borough of Carmarthen fixing, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the Port of Llanelly, the Black Pool in the River Towy, the position of which Pool is delineated and shown by a red line on the Map or Chart in the Schedule annexed to this Order, as the place where any ship certified under the Regulations to be infected with Cholera, shall be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article 10 of the Regulations.

And We do hereby Order and Direct that the jurisdiction of the said Sanitary Authority shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to extend, and, subject to the provisions of this Order, the Regulations shall apply, to any ship so certified which, in pursuance of the Regulations, or of any directions given thereunder, shall be moored at the place so fixed as a Mooring Station as hereinbefore mentioned, and to any such ship which shall be on its way thither.
