ARRÊTÉ.

Le Général de Division Mohamed El Aziz Bou Attour, Premier Ministre de S. A. Le Bey. Vu le décret du 5 Juillet, 1893 (21 Hidjé, 1310), relatif aux provenances d'Algérie par les voies de terre,

Arrêté:

ART. 1er. Il est établi, le long de la frontière de terre, entre Tabarka et les Ouled Bou Ghanem, un cordon sanitaire ininterrompu qui s'opposera, au besoin par la force, à l'entrée dans la Régence de tout voyageur ou de toute caravane par d'autres points que ceux indiqués à l'article 2 ci-après.

ART. 2. Les voyageurs ou caravanes provenant d'Algérie ne peuvent franchir le cordon sanitaire établi par l'art. 1er ci-dessus que par les points de Tabarka, Bab Abrick, Feldj Khlaa, Bordj El Hammam, Ghardimaou, Sakiet Sidi Youssef en route de Tébesa aux Ouled Bou Ghanem.

ART. 3. La visite sanitaire des voyageurs et caravanes pénétrant dans la Régence par les points sus-indiqués sera passée aux postes sanitaires établis sur ces points. La désinfection des personnes, de leurs bagages, hardes, effets et marchandises dont l'introduction n'est pas formellement interdite par le décret sus-visé du 5 Juillet, 1893 (21 Hidjé, 1310), se fera aux mêmes points.

ART. 4. Toute infraction au présent arrêté sera poursuivie et déferée aux tribunaux compétents.
