THE Board of Trade have received from Her Majesty's Representative at Budapest a Despatch, dated 2nd instant, enclosing the following Circular, issued by the Royal Hungarian Maritime Government, viz.:—

Circular of the Royal Hungarian Maritime Government, directed to all the Royal Harbour Offices, their branch Offices, and to the Lazareth in Martinschizza.

By order of the Royal Hungarian Minister of Commerce, given with Despatch of September 20, 1893, No. 6502/II, in concert with the President of the Ministers, charged with the direction of the Ministry of Finances, further in concert with the Minister for Home Affairs, with the Minister of Agriculture, and also with the Imperial Royal Austrian Government, it is herewith ordered, that the prescriptions given with the Circular of June 25, 1893, No. 2943, in obedience of Despatch of the named Minister of Commerce of June 2 last, No. 39471, concerning the prohibition of import and transit of goods coming from Russia is extended to the import and transit of the below-mentioned goods coming from whatever port or place of the Roumanian territory; and precisely:—

1. Of linen used and not cleaned, of used wearing apparel including worn shoes and stock-

ings, also of used linen clothes. If these objects are forwarded as luggage of passengers, or as parcels sent in consequence of change of residence, they are subject to revision by the sanitary police and to eventual manipulation by the same, either at the frontier or at place of destination.

2. Of rags.

From prohibition are excluded:

a. Rags compressed by hydraulic force, transported as merchandise in larger quantities, packed in bales, fastened with iron hoops, carrying marks of origin and numbers recognized by the authorities.

b. New waste coming direct from spinning and weaving factories, tailor workshops, bleacheries, artificial wool (shoddy), and new waste of paper.

The transit of the mentioned articles which are excluded from importation is permitted only on presentation of an official certificate, proving that the importation or the transit of the same is permitted by the neighbouring foreign State for whom they are destined, and under the condition that the transport has been effected in a closed isolated place and in a way to exclude during the transit any manipulation whatsoever.

This Order takes effect on the day of its publication.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Colonial Office, the following Quarantine Notice, issued by the Governor of Malta, viz. :—

Government Notice. No. 159.

His Excellency the Governor, having heard the opinion of the Board of Health, has been pleased to revoke Government Notice, No. 146, of 7th September, 1893, and to direct that the following regulations be observed, viz. :—

1. Exclusion from the Harbour (Sfratto) with provisions for coaling under such restrictions as may in each case be directed by the Collector of Customs.

The following shall not be permitted to enter the Harbour, but may be allowed to coal and take provisions in strict quarantine, with the least delay, and subject to the orders of the Collector of Customs; and shall in all cases be ordered, after coaling, to quit with all dispatch.

(a.) Vessels with pilgrims from the east;
(b.) Vessels having cases of cholera on board;
(c.) Vessels which have had on board a case of diarrhoea, cholera, or any disease with symptoms resembling cholera either among the passengers or the crew.

(d.) Vessels from North or South America when cases of yellow fever have occurred on board during the voyage;

(e.) Vessels arriving from Arabian ports in the Red Sea, which have not been admitted to free pratique at Suez and Port Said.

2. Quarantine for fifteen days to be reckoned from the commencement of the voyage with provision for handling cargo in quarantine.

The following shall be subject to a period of fifteen days' quarantine, but shall be permitted, under the directions of the Collector of Customs, to discharge goods (which are not susceptible of communicating contagion) by means of the vessel's crew on lighters, or to employ for handling cargo local labourers subject to fifteen days' quarantine, viz. :—

(a.) Vessels arriving from any port without a clean bill of health.

(b.) Vessels arriving from any German port in the North Sea, from Belgium, Holland, France, Kingdom of Italy, Austro-Hungary, Turkey in Europe in the Black Sea, Roumania, Russia in the Black Sea and Sea of Azov, ports in the

Dardanelles, Sea of Marmora, and the Bosphorus, Smyrna, Scio, Chesmé, Vilayet of Tripoli, Regency of Tunis and Algeria; should such vessels produce a certificate to the effect that they have been thoroughly disinfected at an intermediate port the said period shall be reduced to eleven days.

3. Medical Inspection.

All vessels arriving at Malta shall undergo strict medical inspection.

4. Passengers.

Passengers arriving by any vessel subject to quarantine are required to undergo the same restrictions as the vessels on which they arrive.

Passengers will not be permitted to land at Malta unless they declare on oath to the Port Authority that they have not resided or been in any German Port in the North Sea, Belgium, Holland, France, Kingdom of Italy, Austro-Hungary, Turkey in Europe in the Black Sea, Roumania, Russia in the Black Sea and Sea of Azov, Ports in the Dardanelles, Sea of Marmora and the Bosphorus, Smyrna, Scio, Chesmé, Vilayet of Tripoli, Regency of Tunis and Algeria for fifteen days previous to their arrival.

Passengers arriving direct from England on vessels having a duly qualified medical officer on board, are to be allowed to land without medical inspection, provided that the medical officer in charge on board shall declare on oath that during the voyage there has not been on board a case of dysentery, diarrhoea, cholera, or any disease with symptoms resembling cholera either among the passengers or the crew.

The declaration above referred to shall be countersigned by the master of the vessel.

No pilgrims travelling eastward are allowed to land.

5. Susceptible Goods.

The importation of cotton seed from any port subject to quarantine is forbidden.

Such article may continue to be imported from non-infected ports provided the same be accompanied by a British Consular Certificate, stating the place of origin, and the fact that cholera is not prevailing nor has prevailed of late in that place.

The importation of rags, raw silk, hair, and feathers is prohibited.

The importation of soiled wearing apparel before disinfection is prohibited.

The importation of vines, vine shoots, vine leaves or roots from any port of the Mediterranean is prohibited.

The importation of grapes, poles, or supports used in the cultivation of vines, vegetable earth, vegetable or mixed manure, is prohibited, unless the importation is accompanied by a sworn declaration, made by the shipper before the British Consular Authority of the place of its origin, to the effect that the shipment does not contain vine plants or cuttings, or that its contents come from nurseries, hothouses, fields, or gardens which are at least 200 yards distant from the nearest vines or vineyards, and that moreover the Phylloxera is not known to exist at the place of origin.

Provided, however, that the Collector of Customs may grant permission for the importation of plants, and vegetable produce under proper restrictions when application has been made and the precautions necessary are established before the shipment leaves the place of origin.

Translation of Circular No. 9732, from the Imperial Royal Marine Board at Trieste, to all the Imperial Royal Offices and subordinate Sanitary Offices and Port Officers.

The High Imperial and Royal Minister for Commerce with the Royal Hungarian Minister for Commerce, by Decree dated September 27, 1893, No. 50197, have ordered that arrivals by sea from Roumania shall be treated according to the Rules and Regulations of the International Sanitary Convention of Dresden.

In consequence of this, for arrivals as above the Rules and Regulations aforesaid as to the treatment of vessels in case of cholera, ordered by Circular of August the 5th, 1893, No. 7700, shall be enforced.

Translation of Circular No. 9800 of the Imperial Royal Marine Board at Trieste to all the Imperial Royal Offices and subordinate Port and Sanitary Officers:—

By Decree dated September 27, 1893, of the High Ministries of the Interior, of Commerce and of Finance (B. L. T., No. 147), as also of the Royal Hungarian Government, in consequence of danger of introduction of cholera, the importation of the following articles from Roumania is prohibited:—

(1.) Used and unwashed linen-cloths, old clothing, old shoes, and of used bed furniture.

If those articles are sent as baggage, or in consequence of change of residence, they must undergo at the frontier and at the place of destination respectively, a police sanitary visit and eventual sanitary police measures.

(2.) Of rags and tatters.

From this prohibition are excluded:—

(a.) Compressed rags through hydraulic power, sent as goods for wholesale trade, in bales bound with iron bands, and bearing marks of origin recognized by the authorities.

(b.) New remnants coming direct from the spinning mills, texture manufactories, tailors' shops, bleaching establishments, and artificial wool (shoddy).

The transit of the abovenamed articles which are excluded from importation is only permitted upon production of a certificate proving that the importation and the transit of the same, respectively, is allowed by the neighbouring foreign state which they have to enter, and upon the conditions that the transport is quite isolated in a closed conveyance to exclude any manipulation during the journey.

This Order will come into force upon the day that it comes to the knowledge of the Custom

House Offices and of the Marine Sanitary Offices respectively.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Repeal.

1. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation so much of the Warrant of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury of the 29th day of August, 1888, as relates to the transmission of parcels by post between the United Kingdom and the Dutch East Indies shall be repealed, revoked, and annulled.

Definition.

2. In this Warrant—

(1.) The expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet which is posted as a Parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same:

(2.) The expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

Places between which Parcels may be transmitted.

3. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation Parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by post between the United Kingdom and the Dutch East Indies by way of Holland.

Rates of Postage.

4. On all Parcels transmitted by post under this Warrant from the United Kingdom to the Dutch East Indies there shall be charged and paid the following rates of postage; that is to say:—

On every Parcel not exceeding three pounds in weight four shillings and sixpence.

On every Parcel exceeding three pounds and not exceeding seven pounds in weight five shillings.

On every parcel exceeding seven pounds and not exceeding eleven pounds in weight five shillings and sixpence.

Maximum Dimensions and Weight.

5. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General, there shall not be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by post under this Warrant any Parcel the dimensions of which shall exceed in length two feet or in length and girth measured together four feet (such girth being measured round the thickest part of such Parcel), or which shall exceed in weight eleven pounds.

Prepayment.

6. The postage chargeable as hereinbefore mentioned shall in all cases (except as otherwise provided in this Warrant) be prepaid at the time of posting, and such prepayment shall in the United Kingdom be effected by means of adhesive postage stamps, or at such Post Offices, within such hours, and under and subject to such regulations as the Postmaster-General shall from time to time prescribe, in money.

Times of Posting.

7. Parcels intended to be transmitted by post may, in the United Kingdom, be posted on any day of the week except Sunday, but shall not be posted on Sundays, or in England or Ireland on Christmas Day or Good Friday, and in Scotland on either of the two Sacramental Fast Days, except in the cases next hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

Where the delivery of Parcels on Sundays, or any of the other days aforesaid, at certain Post Offices, to addressees calling for the same, may hereafter be specially authorized by the Postmaster-General, the posting of Parcels on Sundays, or such other days as aforesaid, at such offices respectively, shall also be permitted within such times and in such manner as may be directed by the Postmaster-General.

Mode of Posting.

8. Except as otherwise provided in this Warrant, all Parcels shall in the United Kingdom be posted by being handed in at a Post Office in the manner hereinafter provided, within the hours during which such office shall be open to the public for the posting of Parcels.

Posting at Post Offices.

9. The following provisions shall apply to the posting of Parcels at any Post Office in the United Kingdom, that is to say:—

- (1.) It shall be the duty of a person bringing a Parcel to hand it to an officer on duty at the counter in such office.
- (2.) Such Parcel must bear the name and address of the sender and the exact direction of the addressee, and must be packed in a manner adequate for the length of the journey and for the protection of the contents. The Parcel must also be so packed as to prevent any tampering with its contents without leaving an obvious trace of its violation. Such Parcel must also be accompanied by or have affixed to it a declaration of such kind, and stating the contents of the Parcel in such manner and form and with such other particulars as the Commissioners of Customs and the Postmaster-General may prescribe.
- (3.) Such Parcel shall be measured and weighed by such officer, and (if such Parcel do not exceed the limits of measurement or weight hereinbefore mentioned) the postage thereof, according to the rates hereinbefore mentioned shall, subject as hereinbefore provided, be prepaid as hereinbefore provided, and shall be verified by such officer, and no such Parcel shall be forwarded by the post without the before-mentioned

requirements being complied with; and if any such Parcel shall be left at a Post Office without such requirements being complied with, such Parcel shall be detained, and may be returned or given up to the sender thereof, or otherwise dealt with or disposed of in any manner authorized by this Warrant.

Collection of Parcels.

10. The Postmaster-General may, if he thinks fit, from time to time authorize such officers as he may direct to receive Parcels for the Post under such regulations and conditions as he may from time to time prescribe.

Irregular Posting of Parcels.

11. Any Packet transmissible by Parcel Post from the United Kingdom which, from any words or marks thereon, or other external evidence, appears to have been intended for transmission as a Parcel, but which has not been tendered for transmission as a Parcel, but has been posted in a Post Office letter-box, or otherwise than according to the manner hereinbefore prescribed for the posting of Parcels, may, in the discretion of the Postmaster-General, either be detained or returned or given up to the sender, or if the said Packet is fully prepaid with the Letter or Book rate of postage, and otherwise conforms to the Regulations as to the Letter or Book Post, the same may be forwarded as a Letter or Book Packet (as the case may be).

Return and Disposal of Undelivered Parcels.

12. With regard to—

- (a.) Parcels which are addressed to a Post Office in the United Kingdom to be called for, or to a place in the United Kingdom beyond the limits of the free postal delivery of any town or district, or to a ship at any port in the United Kingdom, and which are not called for or delivered within such reasonable times as the Postmaster-General may from time to time prescribe; and
- (b.) Parcels which cannot be delivered in the United Kingdom for want of a true direction, or by reason that the addressee is dead, or cannot be found, or has refused the same, or has refused to pay any charges thereon, or for any other sufficient reason;

the following provisions shall (subject to the provisions of the Warrant of the said Commissioners of the 12th day of December, 1888, relating to Foreign and Colonial Parcels) apply; (that is to say):—

- (1.) The Parcel shall, as the Postmaster-General may from time to time direct, be retained at or forthwith forwarded to such place as the Postmaster-General may from time to time appoint, and may, if necessary, be there opened and examined.
- (2.) Where the name and address of the sender can be ascertained from the Parcel or the declaration accompanying the same, notice shall be given by post to the sender through the Post Office of the Dutch East Indies, that the Parcel will, in default of any claim on the part of the addressee, be given up to the sender or his agent upon personal application at such place as aforesaid, or at the request of the sender will be forwarded to a corrected address or returned to him, by post in either case upon the conditions hereinafter mentioned.
- (3.) Where the name and address of the sender cannot be ascertained from the Parcel, notice shall be publicly given (by affixing the same at such place or places, or in such other manner

as the Postmaster-General may direct), and notice shall also be given to the Post Office of the Dutch East Indies that the Parcel will, in default of any claim on the part of the addressee, and upon payment of such charges as are hereinafter mentioned, be given up upon the personal application of the sender or his agent, or be returned to the sender by post.

- (4.) In any case the notice shall state that, in default of the receipt by the Postmaster-General of an application for the Parcel during a period to be specified in such notice from some person who, in the Postmaster-General's judgment, is entitled to receive the Parcel, it will be disposed of in such a manner as the Postmaster-General may direct.
- (5.) The Postmaster-General may, in his discretion, specify in any such notice, or otherwise, the periods during which Parcels may be returned to the senders thereof, and in so doing may have regard to the nature and contents of Parcels.
- (6.) Where in the case of a Parcel which cannot be delivered for want of a true direction, the sender corrects the address of the Parcel, the Parcel shall be forwarded to the corrected address, subject to the following conditions:—
- (a.) Where the corrected address of the Parcel is within the same free delivery as the original address, and the Parcel is not at the time of such correction lying at a Returned Letter Office, no new charge shall be made with respect to the delivery of the Parcel.
- (b.) Where the corrected address of the Parcel is not within the same free delivery as the original address, or the Parcel at the time of such correction is lying at a Returned Letter Office, there shall be paid a new and distinct rate of postage equal in amount to the rate of postage which would have been chargeable on such Parcel as an Inland Parcel.
- (7.) A Parcel shall not be given up or returned by post to the sender except upon payment by him of any charge for re-direction or other charge to which the Parcel has become liable under the provisions of this Warrant, or of any such Regulations as are referred to in section 14 of "The Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882."
- (8.) Where the sender requests a Parcel to be returned to him by post, such Parcel shall not be returned to the sender except upon payment by him of a new and distinct rate of postage, according to the rate fixed by this Warrant, and in such case the said rate of postage and all other charges to which the Parcel has become liable, if not prepaid by the sender, shall be collected on the delivery of the Parcel to him.
- (9.) The Postmaster-General may require proof to his satisfaction that an applicant for a Parcel is entitled to receive the same.
- (10.) Where no application is made for a Parcel within the period specified in any such notice as aforesaid, or an applicant fails to prove to the satisfaction of the Postmaster-General that he is entitled to receive the Parcel, or refuses or fails to pay the charges to which the Parcel has become liable under this Warrant, the Parcel may be dealt with or disposed of in such manner as the Postmaster-General may in his discretion direct or authorize.

Re-direction to places out of United Kingdom.

13. Any Parcel may be re-directed from its original address, or any substituted address, within the United Kingdom, to any country or place with which a Parcel Post to or from the United Kingdom or the Dutch East Indies is established, and in every case of such re-direction there shall be charged on such Parcel in respect of such re-direction a new and distinct rate of postage according to the rates for the time being payable in respect of the transmission of a like Parcel from the United Kingdom to the country or place to which it may be re-directed, and such postage, if not paid at the time of such re-direction, shall be collected on the delivery of the Parcel to the addressee.

Re-direction to places within United Kingdom.

14. Any Parcel may be re-directed from its original address, or any substituted address, within the United Kingdom to any other address within the United Kingdom, and in every case of such re-direction there shall be charged on such Parcel in respect of each such re-direction; and (if not previously paid) paid by the addressee thereof in money upon the delivery of such Parcel, a new and distinct rate of postage, equal in amount to the rate of postage which would have been originally chargeable on such Parcel as an Inland parcel.

Remission of Re-direction Rates.

15. The Postmaster-General may wholly remit the rate of postage for re-direction on any Parcel addressed to the United Kingdom which may, on the request of the addressee thereof, be re-directed by an Officer of the Post Office, and again forwarded by post to the same person at any address within the limits of the same free postal delivery as the address from which such Parcel was so re-directed.

Prohibitions.

16. There shall not be posted or conveyed or delivered by post any Parcel—

- (1.) Consisting of or containing any indecent or obscene print, painting, photograph, lithograph, engraving, book or card, or any indecent or obscene article, whether similar to the above or not; or
- (2.) Having thereon or on the cover thereof any words, marks, or designs of an indecent, obscene, or grossly offensive character.
- (3.) Containing or bearing any letter or communication in the nature of a letter except a circular transmissible by book post.
- (4.) Containing any article or thing not authorized by the Customs or other laws of the United Kingdom or the Dutch East Indies.
- (5.) Consisting of or containing:—
 - (a.) Any explosive substance.
 - (b.) Any dangerous substance.
 - (c.) Any filth.
 - (d.) Any noxious or deleterious substance.
 - (e.) Any sharp instrument not properly protected.
 - (f.) Except with the special permission of the Postmaster-General, any living creature.
 - (g.) Any article or thing whatsoever which is likely to injure other Parcels in course of conveyance, or any receptacle in which the same are conveyed, or an officer of the Post Office or other person who may deal with such Parcel.

Any such Parcel, if posted or tendered for conveyance by post, may be detained, and either returned or given up to the sender thereof or dealt with or disposed of in such other manner as may be authorized by the Postmaster-General.

17. There shall not be posted or conveyed or delivered by post any Parcel consisting of or containing two or more Parcels or other Postal Packets (of the same or of different descriptions) addressed to different persons at different addresses; and any such Parcel, if posted or tendered for conveyance by post, may be detained and either returned or given up to the sender thereof, or dealt with or disposed of as the Postmaster-General may authorize.

Non-compliance with Regulations.

18. In any case not in this Warrant expressly provided for, where any Parcel shall be posted or tendered for conveyance by post which in any respect infringes or fails to comply with the regulations in this Warrant contained, or any of them, such Parcel may, at the option of the Postmaster-General, either be dealt with as in this Warrant provided, with reference to Parcels which cannot be delivered, or be dealt with or disposed of in such manner as the Postmaster-General may in his discretion direct or authorize.

Provision for Safety of Parcels.

19. In any case where any officer of the Post Office may find it necessary or expedient for the safety or protection of Parcels that any Parcel should be forwarded or delivered by some later despatch or delivery than that for which the same was posted or despatched, or intended to be posted or despatched respectively, he may delay the despatch or delivery of such Parcel, or make such other and special arrangements as to the despatch or delivery thereof, not, however, involving a greater delay than 24 hours in the whole, as may be deemed by such officer necessary or expedient in the circumstances of the case.

Parcels not to interfere with Letter Post.

20. Where the despatch or delivery from a Post Office in the United Kingdom of letters would be delayed by the despatch or delivery therefrom at the same time of Parcels, such Parcels, or any of them, may be detained in the Post Office until the despatch or delivery next following that by which they would ordinarily be despatched or delivered.

Postmaster-General not liable for Loss or Damage.

21. Nothing contained in or done under or in pursuance of this Warrant shall render the Postmaster-General liable, either personally or in his official capacity, to any action or other legal proceeding in respect or in consequence of any loss or damage of any Parcel, whether such loss or damage be occasioned by or arise from any act or neglect of any officer of the Post Office or any other person.

Customs Regulations.

22. Parcels intended to be transmitted by post under the provisions of this Warrant shall not be posted, forwarded, conveyed, or delivered, except subject to such regulations as are referred to in section 14 of "The Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882."

Remission of Postage.

23. The Postmaster-General may, in any case in which he may consider it just or reasonable so to do, remit any postage or any sum made payable under this Warrant.

Commencement of Warrant.

24. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

Aveiro Bar—Group Flashing Light and Fog Signal.

Aveiro Bar Light will be a group flashing white light, showing four flashes of two and a half seconds duration each, separated by intervals of one and a half seconds, the eclipses between the groups being nine a half seconds. Page Rock Light will be a fixed white light of the fourth order, elevated 40 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about 12 miles.

The lighthouse consists of a brown pile foundation surmounted by a white hexagonal dwelling with brown roof above which is the lantern.
