**CHINA SEA.—MINDORO STRAIT APPROACH.**

**Non-existence of Flying-Cloud Rock.**

**INFORMATION** has been received from Commander A. F. Balfour, Her Majesty's surveying-vessel "Penguin," dated 7th July, 1893, that a depth of 2,870 fathoms, over mud, was obtained in the reported position of Flying Cloud Rock, charted as lying in approximately lat. 13° 28' N., long. 119° 33' E., in the approach to Mindoro Strait from the north-west; also that soundings of about the same depth were obtained in the locality around that position.

Consequent on this examination, Flying Cloud Rock has been removed from the Admiralty Charts.
