IN continuation of the notice in the London Gazette of the 12th May, 1893, the Secretary of State for the Colonies has received the following Proclamation by the Governor of the Cape of Good Hope relative to the importation of dogs into that Colony:—

PROCLAMATION by his Excellency Sir Henry Brougham Loch, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Her Majesty's Colony of the Cape of Good Hope in South Africa, and of

the Territories and Dependencies thereof, and Her Majesty's High Commissioner for South Africa, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by my Proclamation No. 169, dated the 8th day of May, 1893, I did under and by virtue of the provisions of section 2 of Act No. 20 of 1868, entitled the "Cattle Diseases Act of 1868," prohibit the landing at any port or place in this Colony from any ship, vessel, or boat of any dog from any place or places beyond this Colony;

And whereas it has been represented to me that it is desirable to repeal the said Proclamation and

to make other provision in lieu thereof;

And whereas by Act No. 27 of 1893, entitled the "Animals Diseases Act, 1893," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation in the Gazette, to prohibit the importation or introduction into this Colony from any place beyond the same in which any infectious or contagious disease affecting animals shall be known or be supposed to be prevalent, of any such animals as in such Proclamation shall be mentioned, or otherwise to permit such landing subject to such restrictions and regulations as may in such Proclamation be imposed;

And whereas the disease known as rables is reported to be prevalent amongst dogs in the

United Kingdom and elsewhere:

Now, therefore, I do hereby proclaim, declare, and make known that under and by virtue of the powers vested in me by the said Act 27 of 1893, the landing at any port or place in this Colony from any ship, vessel, or boat, of any dogs from any place or places beyond this Colony, shall after the date of this Proclamation be prohibited: provided nevertheless that such dogs as may on arrival at the port or harbour at Cape Town in this Colony be found to be free from all symptoms of the disease known as rabies, may, after undergoing a period of three months' quarantine at the Government Quarantine Station on Robben Island, subject to such restrictions and regulations as are set forth in the schedule hereto, be permitted to be transferred to the mainland.

Proclamation No. 169, dated 8th day; of May,

1893, is hereby repealed.

No. 381, 1893. Schedule to the foregoing Proclamation. Regulations.

1. The importation of dogs referred to in the Proclamation aforesaid shall be permitted, subject to a quarantine for a period of not less than three months at the Government Quarantine Station on Robben Island.

2. Before any dogs are removed from the ship or vessel in which they may arrive at Cape Town, they shall be handed over to such person as may be appointed for the purpose of removal, and by him they shall be conveyed to the place of quarantine, and the cost of such removal, together with the expenses of quarantining and of attendance upon and food required for the dogs quarantined, shall be borne by the owner or owners thereof.

3. The dog or dogs undergoing quarantine shall be separately tied up or otherwise securely kept free and entirely isolated one from another.

- 4. Reasonable care and attention will be given to all animals so quarantined, but the Government will not be responsible for the loss of, or injury to, any animal during its period of detention as aforesaid.
- 5. If at the expiration of the quarantine period the dog or dogs shall be declared by some responsible person authorized by the Government in that behalf to be free from the disease known as rabies, and if it shall also be certified that the usual symptoms preceding or indicating that disease are not visible, then and in such case the dog or dogs shall (subject to the provision in clause 6) be released and given up to the owner or owners thereof

6. No dog shall be released from quarantine until all charges due are defrayed by the owner or

7. If at any time during the period of quarantine it shall appear that any animal so detained exhibits symptoms indicative of rabies, the Government may by its duly authorized officers forthwith destroy such animal and no compensation shall be

paid to the owner or owners thereof.

8. Any person contravening the provisions of the above Proclamation or of these Regulations, or wilfully obstructing any person in the due execution of any of the said provisions, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £50, or in default of payment to imprisonment with or without hard labour for any period not exceeding three months, unless such fine be sooner paid.

9. Dogs unclaimed at the expiration of their period of quarantine will be advertised in three consecutive issues of the Government Gazette, and if then unclaimed within fourteen days they will be destroyed or sold as may be deemed advisable.

THE Board of Trade have received from Her Majesty's Representative at Madrid, the following Telegram, dated October 17, viz.:—"Arrivals from Messina (Sicily) which left after 12th instant, foul; those within 165 kilometres foul from 13th."

The Board have also received from the same source the following information as to quarantine, viz.:—

Arrivals from Ancona will be despatched to a foul lazaretto whatever their date of departure and whatever their bill of health, and ports within 165 miles radius of Ancona will be considered dangerously affected, irrespective of date.

Arrivals from within 165 kilometres of Cuneo subjected to three days' quarantine as a minimum if they arrive either with clean bills of health or with notification of suspicious cases of cholera in whatever form expressed.

If any case of cholera is notified the ship must be sent to a foul lazaretto.

Arrivals from Scutari (Turkey in Asia) will be sent to a foul lazaretto whatever their date of departure or bill of health, and ports within 165 kilometres will be considered dangerously affected.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following Memorandum from Her Majesty's Embassy at Madrid, respecting the practice observed in Spain with regard to removal of quarantine restrictions:—

1. Quarantine can only be taken off from foul ports on the receipt by Government of an official notification from the Spanish Consul that twenty days have elapsed since the last case of cholera or yellow fever.

2. Arrivals from a foul port with clean bill of health and certificate from the Spanish Consul that twenty days have elapsed since the last case of cholera or yellow fever are admitted to free pratique.

Also a Despatch, dated 15th instant, intimating that arrivals from Amsterdam will be considered clean and admitted to free pratique if they arrive with clean bill of health, vised by a Spanish Consul, or failing such, by a Consul of another nation, in good hygienic condition and without suspicious occurrences on board. Arrivals from within 165 kilometres of Amsterdam will be similarly treated. Infectious goods laid down in the Royal Order of the 29th October, 1886, which have remained in Amsterdam during the epidemic and leave after the 3rd proximo, shall be likewise admitted without disinfection if in good hygienic condition.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Foreign Office, the following information respecting quarantine in Denmark, viz. :-

The provisions of the Law of 2nd July, 1880, which relate to preventative measures against the introduction of contagious diseases, are put in force in regard to vessels from Palermo and Stettin or Swinemunde, or which have communicated during their voyage either with those ports or with vessels coming from those ports.

The prohibitions and measures of disinfection indicated under letter "B" of the Ordinance of the 10th instant are applied to vessels from Palermo, and those under letter "B" of the Ordinance of 15th September to vessels from Stettin or Swinemunde, and persons arriving from those ports will be submitted to the medical inspection prescribed by the Ordinance of the 9th instant.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Foreign Office, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Representative at St. Petersburg, enclosing the following Quarantine Regulations, issued by the Russian Government respecting the establishment of rules for the adoption of precautionary measures against the introduction of epidemic diseases across the maritime boundaries of Russia.

By Section 5 of the Regulations confirmed by His Majesty on the 26th April (8th May), 1893, for the adoption of precautionary measures against the introduction of epidemic diseases across the maritime boundaries of the Empire, the Minister of the Interior is empowered to issue, within the scope of those regulations, rules of obligatory force for all branches of the service, institutions,

In fulfilment of such Imperial Ordinance the Minister of the Interior confirmed on the 3rd (15th) day of July, 1893, the following: (1) Instructions for the disinfection of goods imported at frontier medico-inspection stations and Maritime Quarantine Establishments; (2) Instructions for Maritime Quarantine Establishments; (3) Rules for the guidance of shipowners and masters of seagoing passenger vessels plying between internal ports; (4) Instructions for ships' surgeons on board seagoing passenger vessels plying between internal ports.

The Minister of the Interior forwarded on the 10th (22nd) July, 1893, copies of these Regulations to the Ruling Senate for promulgation.

Regulations for the Disinfection of Goods imported at Frontier Medico-Inspection Stations and Quarantine Establishments.

1. Goods arriving from places declared by the Minister of the Interior as being infected by cholera may be imported, but are subjected to disinfection if the wrapping or exterior surface of such goods bears evident traces of being defiled by human or animal excreta, or if there be reason to suppose that these goods have been in immediate contact with persons suffering from infectious diseases. (Section 15 of the Regulation confirmed by His Imperial Majesty on the 24th March,

2: All goods arriving from places free from cholera, but passing in transit through localities declared by the Minister of the Interior to be infected with cholera, are allowed free importation if there be no sufficient grounds for suspecting that they could, en route, have come in contact with infectious diseases; in the contrary cases they are treated as goods that have arrived from cholera-infected places.

3. In the cases enumerated in the above paragraphs the wrapping or exterior layer of goods shall be subjected to disinfection, damage to them being at the same time as far as possible avoided.

4. Wearing apparel, linen, bedding, carpets, pillow and feather cases, blankets, and other articles forming the personal belongings of passengers, or of a caravan when passing the frontier, shall be disinfected in the following cases :-

(a.) When the owner of such belongings shall be found, on medical inspection, to be suffering from cholera or an attack resembling cholera; and

(b.) If these articles shall have on the way or at the point of departure been polluted by the evacuations of persons suffering from cholera.

5. In carrying out the process of disinfection and preparing disinfecting solutions the Medical Officers in charge of the medico-inspection stations and marine quarantines shall follow the instructions drawn up by the Medical Council for disinfecting habitations, clothing, soft articles, and discharges of cholera-sick.

6. In accordance with the above instructions, medico-inspection stations and quarantines must be supplied sufficiently, and some time beforehand,

with means of disinfection.

Instructions to Marine Quarantine Establishments. 1. At every Marine Quarantine Establishment Medical Officers shall always be on duty in turn.

- 2. The duties of Medical Officers shall con-
- (a.) In verbal examination of passengers and crew and in the inspection of vessels arriving in

(b.) In issuing bills of health to vessels;

(c.) In the immediate supervision and direction of a systematic purification of vessels and disinfection of their berths, goods, and luggage.

(d.) In rendering medical aid to sick or suspected occupants of a quarantine lazarette or

reception quarters; and

(e.) In the sanitary inspection, when necessary, of vessels and passengers leaving the port (section 20 of the Regulations confirmed by His Imperial Majesty).

3. The object of a sanitary oral examination of the master or captain of a vessel is to ascertain the

sanitary state of a vessel.

4. All information obtained at such examination, as also all the sanitary measures to which a vessel may be subjected, are to be recorded on an examination paper.

5. A bill of health is issued by the medical officer on duty, bearing his signature and seal of

the quarantine establishment.

6. Vessels arriving with unclean bills of health, or coming under one of the conditions mentioned in section 17 of the Regulations confirmed by His Imperial Majesty, for preventing the spread of epidemic diseases across the maritime boundaries of the Empire, shall, besides oral examination, be subjected to an inspection of their berths, crews,

recognizing the sanitary condition of a vessel as being bad belong :-

(1.) Crowding of passengers.

(2.) The accumulation in the berths, &c., of a vessel, of dirty rags and unwashed bed and body linen, animal refuse, and various rubbish.

(3.) Unsatisfactory condition of stored water, and the absence, during the prevalence of Asiatic cholera, of means for supplying passengers and

crew with boiled water.

8. Vessels, the sanitary condition of which shall be recognized as bad, shall receive free pratique when they shall, with the means at their disposal, have made good the sanitary defects observed by the Medical Officer; at the same time passengers free from sickness and their luggage shall be allowed to land.

Observation.—The hold of a vessel shall be purified in the following manner:—a fire hose shall be attached to the driving pump and lowered into the hold; a full stream of sea water is ejected on every part which it is necessary to. cleanse, and the process of cleansing shall only cease when the water pumped out shall be the same as that pumped in.

In case of well-founded suspicion of the infection of the hold of a vessel by persons suffering from cholera or by their evacuations the hold

shall be disinfected.

9. Passenger vessels plying between internal ports and provided with a doctor, shall be freed from oral examination and inspection on the production of a certificate of the ship's doctor testifying the satisfactory condition of the vessel in sanitary respects.

10. The oral examination of and inspection of vessels plying between internal ports may be intrusted to an official belonging either to a

Quarantine or Customs Establishment.

11. Only such passengers shall be liable to examination who shall excite suspicion by reason of the locality they may have arrived from, or who shall themselves declare their illness, or who shall be pointed out by other passengers as suffering from ill-health.

12: In the event of the discovery on board a vessel of persons suffering from Asiatic cholera, the berths occupied by such persons, their luggage, and the things with which they may have come in contact, shall be disinfected, as also all other places on board which, in the opinion of the medical officer, may have become infected.

13. When having recourse to the process of disinfection marine quarantine establishments shall be guided by the instructions for disinfection against Asiatic cholera, published in the Official Gazette, No. 85, of 1893, and free pratique shall be given to vessels immediately after the process of disinfection shall have been carried out, without waiting for the complete drying and airing of the parts of the vessel subjected to disinfection.

14. If a vessel arriving from a place infected with Asiatic cholera shall have on board goods prohibited to be imported under the list annually published by the Minister of the Interior, such goods shall not be allowed to be discharged from the vessel. At the same time, however, the vessel may load other merchandise under the supervision of the quarantine authorities, and with the observance of the precautions prescribed by the latter.

15. Seagoing vessels not wishing to be subjected to measures of purification and disinfection recognized as necessary by the quarantine authorities, preserve their right of putting to sea. The landing of passengers from such vessels may be permitted, but the former shall be subjected to medical 7. To the conditions which shall serve for inspection, and in case of their displaying symptoms of cholera, or that of any kindred complaint, they shall be placed in a local cholera lazarette, and their effects shall be disinfected.

16. Persons suffering from infectious diseases (paragraph 5 of the Regulations imperially confirmed) or suspected of the same, and removed from a vessel by the local police, shall be transferred to the inspection wards of local hospitals, and shall only be left in the reception rooms of a quarantine establishment when, owing to their serious state, they cannot be so removed.

Respecting the duties of Ship Owners and Masters of seagoing passenger vessels plying

between interior ports.

1. Medical men selected by owners of seagoing passenger vessels or steamship companies (section 23 of the Regulations imperially confirmed on the 26th April, 1893) shall present themselves at the places of registration of vessels to the Governor or Prefect for the confirmation by the latter of their appointments, and they shall be at liberty to join their vessels after their interviews with the above authorities.

2. The master of a vessel shall carry out all the directions of the ship's doctor in regard to the sanitary condition of the vessel and its passengers.

3. No crowding of passengers shall be allowed on board passenger steamers, i.e., no greater number of passengers shall be received on board than that determined by the number of berths in the cabins and on deck by its square superficies, reckoning nine square feet to each passenger. Inscriptions of the normal number of passengers which a vessel may carry shall be made on conspicuous parts of a ship.

4. Passenger cabins must be heated during cold weather. Accommodation on deck must be protected against cold and bad weather by special

tarpaulins or tentings.

5. Boiled and cooled drinking water for passengers must be stored in sufficient quantity' during a prevalence of cholera in clean and wellclosed vessels.

6. During a prevalence of cholera every seagoing passenger vessel shall have cabins set apart for the accommodation therein of persons attacked by cholera or complaints resembling it, such quarters for men and women being apart. Each such cabin shall contain not less than two berths, and these shall not be one above the other; special receptacles for the evacuations of the sick shall be provided filled to the extent of one third of their capacity with a disinfecting liquid: these sick quarters shall be kept in a clean condition, the presence of any other articles therein than those necessary for the treatment of the patients not being permitted. The linen, clothing, bedding, and other articles soiled by the evacuations of the sick must, before being washed, be disinfected by current steam or steeped in contagion-destroying

7. Persons attacked by cholera on a voyage shall be taken to the nearest port provided with wards for contagious diseases, in which they shall be immediately placed, and the cabin that had been occupied by the sick person must be

thoroughly cleansed and disinfected.

8. All seagoing vessels shall during the prevalence of cholera, be provided with a separate, completely isolated, easily cleansed and disinfected mortuary chamber for placing therein those who have died of cholera on board during a voyage.

Instructions for Ships' Doctors on board of seagoing passenger vessels plying between interior ports.

1. The ship's doctor is responsible for the sanitary condition of a vessel and the observance on board of all hygienic requirements:

(a.) He shall observe that no greater number of passengers than that prescribed shall be taken on board.

(b.) He shall see that the quarters occupied by passengers and crew are kept in a state of clean-. •

(c.) He shall give directions to the master of a vessel as to the best means to be employed for the removal of rubbish and impurities from the same, and also as to the cleaning of the water-closets.

(d.) He shall observe that the provisions sup-

plied on board are of good quality.

(e.) He shall see that the supply of drinking

water is of good quality.

(f.) He shall attend the sick and adopt all necessary measures for the isolation of infectious cases and for disinfection.

(q.) He shall examine the passengers arriving and observe that no persons be admitted on board the vessel who may be suffering from one of the infectious diseases specified in section 5 of the

Regulations confirmed by His Majesty.

(h.) Should a master of a vessel not carry out. the directions of a ship's doctor in a matter relating to the sanitary condition of a vessel, the latter must report such disregard of directions to the owner of the vessel, or to the Company to which it may belong, reporting at the same time the circumstance to the proper Governor ores Prefect.
