THE Board of Trade have received from Her Majesty's Representative at Madrid the following information respecting quarantine, viz.:—

Arrivals from Mazagan and ports within 165 kilometres admitted to free pratique, if they arrive with clean bills of health, viséd by a Spanish Consul, or failing such, by the Consul of another nation, in good hygienic condition, and without suspicious occurrence in the health of the ship, and provided that they do not infringe any of the existing regulations.

Infectious goods, laid down in the Order of the 23rd October, 1886, which have remained in Mazagan during the epidemic, shall likewise be admitted without disinfection, irrespective of date of departure, if they are found to be in good hygienic condition.
