Peterborough (Corporation) Electric Lighting Provisional Order.

(Application to the Board of Trade under "The Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888" for a Provisional Order enabling the Corporation to Produce and Supply Electric Light for Public and Private Purposes within the City and Borough of Peterborough, and to levy, make, and recover Rates and Charges therefor, and to break up Streets, Railways, and Tramways, and to cross Rivers and Canals, and lay Electric Lines; to manufacture, hire, sell, and let Electric Apparatus; Borrowing Money; and other incidental Powers.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen, Citizens, and Burgesses of the city and borough of Peterborough (hereinafter called the Corporation), and whose address is Guildhall, Peterborough, intend to apply to the Board of Trude, on or before the 21st day of December next, for a Provisional Order under "The Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888," for the following purposes, or some of them (that is to say) :--
