THE Queen has been pleased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the 1st November, 1893, to constitute and appoint the Right Honourable John Poyntz, Earl Spencer, K.G.; Admiral Sir Frederick William Richards, K.C.B., Rear-Admiral Walter Talbot Kerr (commonly called Lord Walter Talbot Kerr); Rear-Admiral John Arbuthnot Fisher, C.B.; Captain Gerard Henry Uctred Noel; and Edmund Robertson, Esq., to be Her Majesty's Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the said United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Dominions, Islands, and Territories thereunto belonging.

THE Queen has been pleased to grant unto Samuel Hynman Allenby, of Garnsgate Hall, in the parish of Long Sutton, in the county of Lincoln, of the Elms, in the parish of Lymington, in the county of Southampton, and of Auchans, in the parish of Dundonald and Shire of Ayr, Esquire, and Sophia Constance (commonly called Lady Sophia Constance Allenby), his wife, eldest daughter and heir of Archibald William Montgomerie, 14th Earl of Eglinton, in the Peerage of Scotland, deceased, Her Royal licence and authority that they may take and henceforth use the surname of Montgomrey only, that he the said Samuel Hynman Allenby may bear the arms of Montgomrey, and that such surname and arms of Montgomrey may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by the issue of their marriage; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's said College of Arms.

A telegram, dated 31st October, also states that ports in the Departments of Gironde and Seine Inférieure are declared free from cholera from the 28th October.

Quarantine on arrivals from Batoum to Turkish frontier reduced to five days; ten days' quarantine from ports of Tunis.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following Memorandum respecting Quarantine Regulations and practice in force in Spain in continuation of that published in the London Gazette of October 6, 1893 (H. 7391), page 5621

By a Royal Decree, dated Madrid, October 26, 1893, interpretation is given to Regulations 56 to 59 inclusive of the Royal Order of March 31, 1888.

These Regulations provide as follows: -

Rule 56. Ships arriving from foul ports shall be subjected in the lazaretto for the observations of arrivals from foul ports to a process of disin-fection for a space of three days for the ship and infectious goods.

Persons will be permitted to disembark; those who appear to be sick being removed with proper precautions to the epidemic hospital of the town, and the dead being decently buried.

57. Ships from suspected ports shall be freely admitted in those of similar character.

58. Those from suspected ports shall be admitted to free pratique in foul ports.

59. Those from foul ports shall be sent to a foul lazaretto on arrival at a suspected port.

The Royal Decree of October 26, 1893, above

referred to, enacts as follows:

1. Regulations 56 to 59 inclusive, of the Royal Order of 31st of March, 1888, shall only apply to arrivals from ports in the north of Europe, provided there be no extensive epidemic of cholera in those ports, or no epidemic characterized by great mortality.

2. If during the passage there has not occurred any case on board, the passengers will have to undergo three days' observation, after which they may disembark, the ship and infectious articles being then submitted to the proper process of disinfection for the space of three days more.

3. When any case has occurred during the passage or period of observation, the ship shall be sent to a foul lazaretto, where it shall undergo the sanitary treatment provided by Article 35 of the Sanitary Law in force.

EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875 (38 Vict., c. 17).

WHEREAS in pursuance of the Explosives Act, 1875 (in this Order referred to as the Act), an Order of the Secretary of State (known as Order of Secretary of State No. 3) was made on the 27th day of November, 1875, adapting the General Rules relating to packing of Gunpowder contained in Part 1 of the Act, to the packing of Explosives other than Gunpowder, and whereas

by section 83 of the Act, it is provided that a Secretary of State may by order from time to time revoke, add to, or alter any previous orders of the Secretary of State.

Now therefore, in the exercise of the powers aforesaid, I, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby order as follows:—

1. Part B, Rule 2 of the Order of the Secretary of State, No. 3 aforesaid, relating to the packing of explosives of the 1st division of the 3rd (nitro compound) class, shall be amended as follows:—

(b.) By the insertion after the words "other than metal," in the said Rule, of the words "except with the consent of and under conditions approved

by a Government Inspector."
