THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, a copy of a Telegram, dated 4th November, 1893, from Her Majesty's Representative at Malta, stating that the quarantine against ports of France in the Mediterranean, Continental Italy, the Island of Sardinia, and Austro-Hungarian ports, is raised, but susceptible goods are subject to disinfection.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram, dated 7th November, 1893, from Her Majesty's Representative at Lisbon, stating that Pernambuco is declared to be infected with yellow fever, and the other ports of the province suspected from the 1st October. All ports in England declared free from cholera from the 6th November.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Turkish Quarantine Notice, dated 26th October, 1893, stating that the sanitary station established at Silyria for the disinfection of clothes and effects, and for the medical inspection of passengers and crews of ships coming from Constantinople to ports in the Sea of Marmora, has been transferred to Callicratia (Buyouk Tchekmedje).

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Telegram, dated 9th November, 1893, from Her Majesty's Representative at Madrid, stating that free pratique is granted to arrivals from Nantes, which left after the 31st ultimo.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Turkish Quarantine Notice, dated 29th October, 1893, stating that the ten days' quarantine imposed on arrivals from the Gulf of Naples is reduced to five days for departures since the 27th ultimo.

The ten days' imposed on arrivals from Messina (Sicily) and five days' on arrivals from Catana (Sicily) are reduced to twenty-four hours' observation for departures since the 27th ultimo.

The ten days against Kherson are also reduced to twenty-four hours' observation for departures since the 31st ultimo.

The following Telegram, dated 8th November, 1893, has also been received from Constantinople:—

“Quarantine on arrivals from South Italy (Naples to Santa Maria di Leuca) reduced to twenty-four hours' observation and medical visit. Quarantine on arrivals from Gulf of Smyrna reduced to five days. Quarantine on arrivals from Trebizonde replaced by medical visit. Quarantine of five days on arrivals from Bartan and Amasserah, to be performed at Sinope or Kavak. Ten days' quarantine on arrivals from Bunder Abbas, to be performed at Camaran.”
